Invitation to Apply for the Spring 2009 Alliance Visiting Professorship

Open to Faculty Working in Areas Relevant to International Affairs and Public Policy

Columbia University and SciencesPo have expanded their long-term academic collaboration with the launch of a yearly transatlantic exchange of faculty in the areas of international affairs and public policy. This activity is another in the array of collaborations that already exist within the *Alliance Program*, an endeavor that links Columbia University, SciencesPo, Ecole Polytechnique and Université Paris I Panthéon Sorbonne. The goal of the visiting faculty exchange is to foster transatlantic linkages and to increase the range of educational experiences available to students in the participating institutions.

One member of the Columbia faculty will be selected to spend the 2009 Spring semester as a visiting professor at SciencesPo. At the same time, one member of the SciencesPo faculty will be selected to spend the 2009 Spring semester as a visiting professor at Columbia University.

In 2008, the two visiting professors were Ghassan Salamé (Professor of International Relations, SciencesPo) and Arvind Panagariya (Professor of Indian Political Economy, Columbia).

Exchange Conditions

Each exchange faculty member will continue to receive his/her salary from the home institution and will also receive a stipend to cover additional expenses incurred while teaching at the host institution. This stipend will range from \$15,000 to \$30,000.

Stipends will be paid as additional compensation on a monthly basis, subject to local income tax laws. The host institution will assist with securing appropriate housing in the area near the University and will provide an office.

In return, the visiting faculty member will be asked to teach one full course (14 sessions/one semester), to make two academic lectures or seminar presentations, and to attend two dinners to promote the Alliance Program outside the academia.

Application Procedure

Interested members of the full-time faculty should submit a one-page statement outlining how an exchange of this type would fit into his/her research and teaching interests. The statement should be accompanied by a CV and the full packet should be received by July 15th, 2008.
