Foreign languages

Prior to entry into the program, students should have completed at least three years of study in the East Asian language of specialization. All students in Chinese art must demonstrate proficiency in modern and classical Chinese, as well as a reading knowledge of modern Japanese. Students in Japanese art are required to demonstrate proficiency in modern and classical Japanese and are encouraged to take at least one semester of kanbun, or one year of classical Chinese. Students in modern Japanese art are required to demonstrate proficiency in modern Japanese, and one other modern language to be determined in consultation with the student's advisor. Students are also encouraged, but are not required, to study Classical Japanese, kambun, or Chinese. Language proficiency in the East Asian language(s) can be demonstrated either through coursework or examination. All students must pass a certifying examination demonstrating a reading knowledge of either French or German.
