2008-2009 Teaching Fellowships will carry a 9-month stipend of at least \$21,000. It is a Columbia University requirement that all applicants for a university fellowship apply for funds from external sources as well. Some portion of outside funds may be supplemental to Columbia University fellowships (up to a max 12-month total, CU + outside, of \$27,000, according to this year’s numbers from Fin. Aid). For what other 2008-2009 or Summer 2008 fellowships, grants, or awards have you applied (excluding GSAS & Departmental summer travel grants)? Criteria employed by the Faculty of the Department of Art History and Archaeology in determining fellowship awards for continuing students:

- Academic performance, as demonstrated by: grades, seminar and Proseminar evaluations, written work, successful completion of language proficiency requirements, and timely academic progress to the MA and MPhil degrees.
- Student feedback and preferences as expressed in this application and in the April interviews.
- Submission of this application; application for funding from outside sources.

Notice of fellowship awards will come from the Department and from GSAS in early summer. It may not be possible for faculty to specify the nature of every fellowship service assignment by that time, but notice will be forthcoming as soon as possible thereafter. On occasion, student assignments may be changed on short notice. Students can expect to teach outside their primary fields of interest and expertise. Students awarded a fellowship will be required to complete paperwork for the Department and for the GSAS Office of Financial Aid by mid-summer. Fellowships are offered in recognition of academic achievement and with the expectation of continued success. Academic performance is reviewed every semester, and more often as necessary.
