Travel Grants

Applications must be received by **September 1, 2007**

CES Travel Grants subsidize the travel of European scholars visiting the United States who have been invited to lecture at a member of the Council's academic consortium. Invitations are initiated by an institution's representative to the Council or by the faculty member responsible for arranging the scholar's visit.

The following conditions apply to the Travel Grants Program:

- Grants reimburse only the European scholar's **travel** expenses (within the US) to the member institution, up to a maximum of \$500. The cost of lodging, meals and honoraria are to be provided by the host institution.
- Grants are limited to institutions that are members of the Council's academic consortium.
- An institution may not apply for more than one grant per academic year.
- An institution may not apply for a grant retrospectively.
