YUNGMOON CHANG spent one week in Haiti in March following the devastating 7.0 magnitude earthquake in January. She performed structural assessments both in the Port-au-Prince and Léogane areas. Having a Structural Engineering background with the ability to speak French, Yungmoon was fortunate to be able to communicate and hear firsthand the stories of the Haitians who survived the disaster.

Now back in the US, she would like to share the personal stories she heard and lessons to be learned on the engineering front, as well as discuss ideas on what the country needs on its path to recovery.

Yungmoon graduated from Columbia University with degrees in Civil Engineering and French in 2006, and then received her Masters in Structural Engineering from Stanford University in 2007. Since graduating, she has been working with KPFF Consulting Engineers as a structural engineer in Los Angeles, CA.
