

## Volunteer Position Announcement

The American Museum of Natural History is now accepting applications for our Fall Researcher positions. Fall Researchers will staff the North American Archaeology (NAARCH) Lab. The NAARCH Lab handles, stores, and analyzes a wide variety of artifacts from an extensive temporal and spatial range. Past Lab Researchers have had the opportunity to work with Paleo lithics, Native American ceramics, historic European pottery, Spanish colonial material culture, and a large number of other material culture types. There is also a possibility that the Researchers will be given the opportunity to work with on the American Museum of Natural History's ongoing excavations in coastal Georgia.

Researchers are unpaid, volunteer-level positions. Course credit is available to those individuals currently enrolled in an accredited school of higher learning. The term of employment will be from mid-September to the end of December. During this period of employment, Researchers will work two 8-hour days a week (no weekends).

Individuals interested in joining the NAARCH Lab staff will have to be highly motivated, patient, and detail-oriented. We will be accepting applications from both upper level undergraduates and graduate students as well as recent graduates. Individuals who have not yet completed their Sophomore year need not apply unless they have extensive experience that off-sets their lack of academic training. Prior Archaeological experience in either the field or in the lab is not necessary, but will be a factor in our selection.
