Dita Sari is the President of the recently formed Indonesian trade union organization FNBPI (National Front for Workers' Struggle in Indonesia). She was jailed in 1996 for leading a strike of 20,000 workers and was released from prison only this past July after a long international publicity campaign. She has resumed her organizing work full-force since her release, and will discuss the state of workers' rights and human rights in the currently volatile political climate of Indonesia.
