HCM is seeking an intern to handle its social media campaign. The applicant must have taken a social media class and must have experience in handling all aspects of social media communications, such as web site traffic increase and blogging. They must have handled Facebook and Twitter accounts designed for web site traffic development. The applicant must have a dynamic personality and have an in depth knowledge of Greek culture.

This will be a great opportunity to obtain experience and become involved at the beginning of HCM's inception, as this organization after its launch in New York City plans to expand to other major U.S. cities and global locations. The position will offer social media class credit for the work done until December 2010 with the opportunity of remuneration after January 2011.
