### TRAINING TOPICS

#### **1 OR 2 CME CREDITS AVAILABLE FOR EACH TOPIC**

##### 1. DIAGNOSTIC ASSESSMENT AND TREATMENT

###### RECOMMENDATIONS

Differential diagnosis and rule-outs, HIV/psychotropic regimens and how to optimize them, and all aspects of treatment.

##### 2. MEDICATION EVALUATION

Medical and psychiatric treatments and drug interactions, including psychotropic/ARV interactions.

##### 3. OTHER CLINICAL/PSYCHIATRIC ASPECTS OF PRIMARY CARE

Cultural proficiency, suicide prevention, crystal methamphetamine use, managing difficult behaviors, and many other topics designed to enhance HIV/mental health/primary health care.

##### 4. LEGAL/ETHICAL ISSUES

New York state laws regarding HIV/AIDS and the impact of related regulations on clients and care providers, CDC guidelines for routine testing, and their implications.

##### 5. CARE OF THE TRIPLY DIAGNOSED

Sexual and drug use behaviors among people with comorbid substance use disorders, mental illness and HIV infection, assessment, pharmacological management, and prevention and treatment

##### 6. CROSS-CULTURAL ISSUES AND CULTURAL PROFICIENCY IN PSYCHIATRIC DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT

Disparities in diagnosing and treating HIV and mental health disorders in communities of color; stigma and fear of discrimination; and guidance regarding working across cultures, including institutional cultures.

##### 7. MOTIVATIONAL INTERVIEWING IN PRIMARY CARE SETTINGS

Specific strategies for addressing substance use, treatment adherence, and other care issues related to health behavior motivation.

##### 8. COGNITIVE-BEHAVIORAL THERAPIES IN PRIMARY CARE SETTINGS

Short and long term group behavioral therapies that help clients with health-related behaviors such as smoking, drinking, drug-using, unsafe sex, and ARV adherence that affect HIV clients.

##### 9. NEUROPSYCHIATRIC ASPECTS OF HIV INFECTION

Hallmarks and differential diagnosis of the neuropsychiatric manifestations of HIV/AIDS; medical and psychiatric treatments and drug interactions.

##### 10. HIV TESTING FOR PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESS

Up-to-date testing practices and legal issues pertaining to testing.

##### 11. SCREENING AND ASSESSMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

Screening for mental illness and substance use issues through the Substance Abuse and Mental Illness Symptoms Screener (SAMISS).
