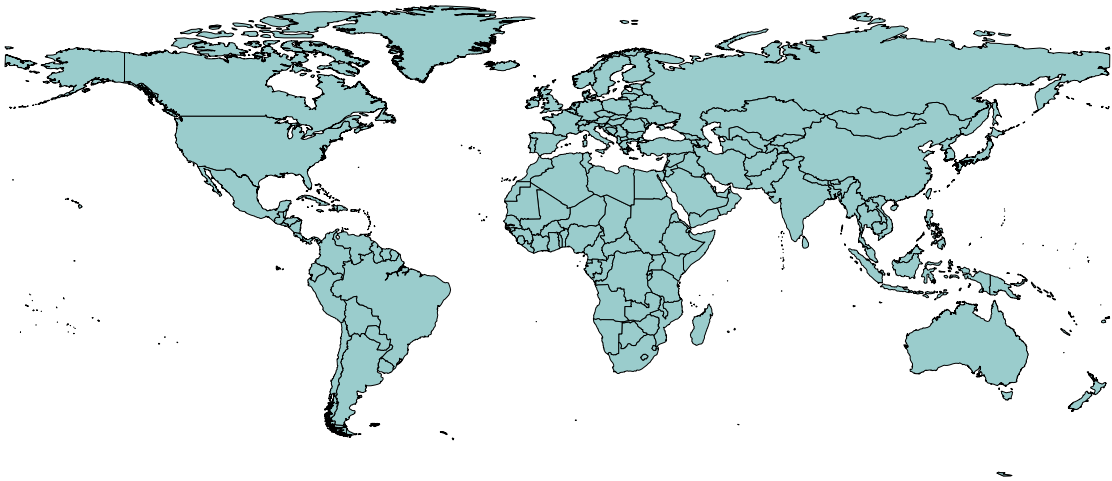

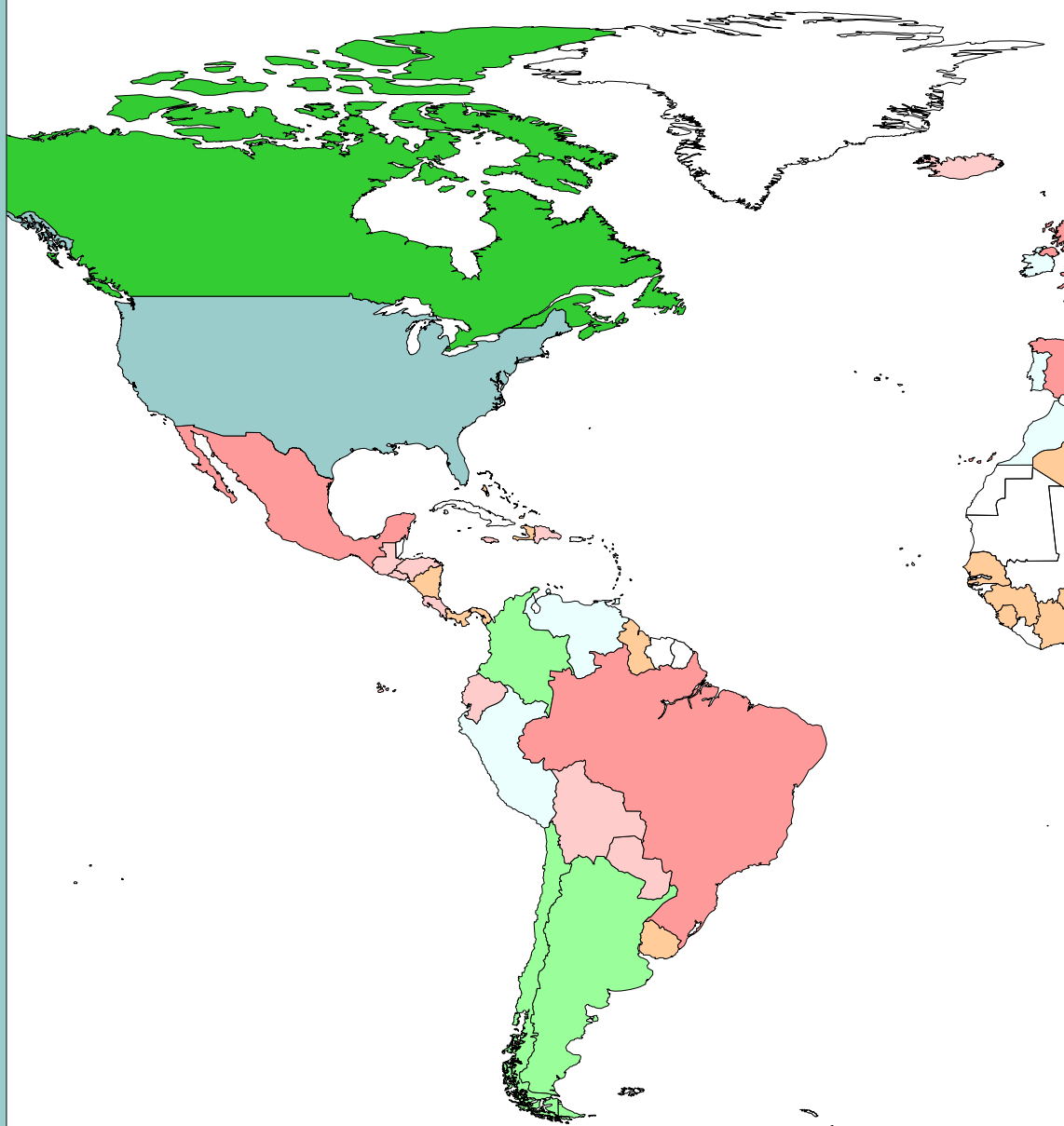
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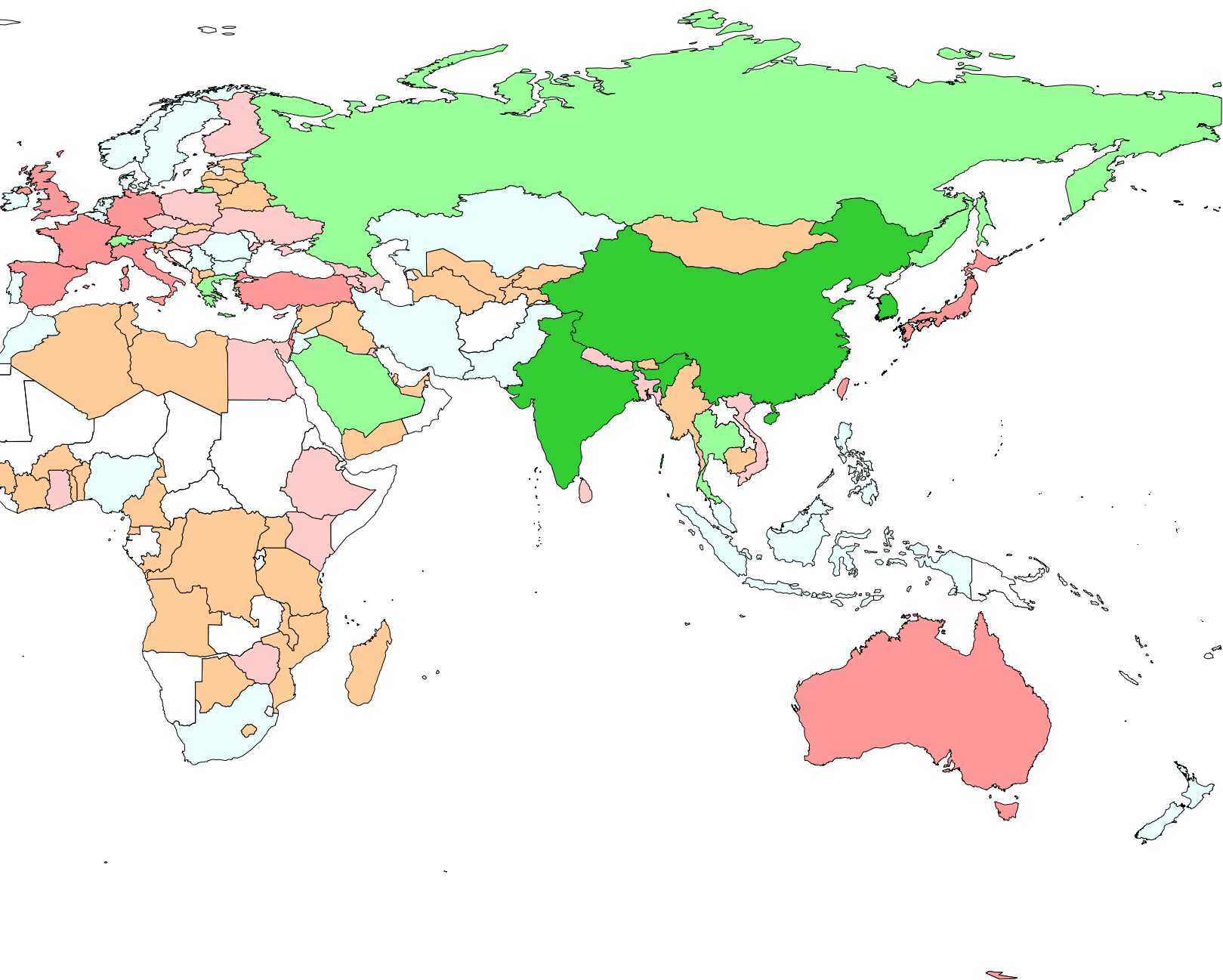

## Summary

Fall 2011 saw Columbia's international population rise to close to 12,000 for the first time on record. Enrolled international students, students engaged in practical training, visiting scholars, and accompanying family members recorded a high-water mark of 11,890 visitors from 152 countries<sup>1</sup>. International enrollment increased by 9% to 6,536 with the number of international students engaged in practical training<sup>2</sup> increasing to 1,488. International students from 140 countries contribute a record 23%<sup>3</sup> of total University enrollment<sup>4</sup>.

Among the US schools reporting international student enrollments in the IIE's Fall 2010 Census<sup>5</sup>, the most recent national data available, Columbia's total international enrollment ranks fifth and is only exceeded by the University of Southern California, University of Illinois – Urbana-Champaign, New York University, and Purdue University – Main Campus.

Among Columbia's schools, the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences retains its first-place standing with 1,629 international students, approximately 36.7% of its student body and close to 25% of the University's international enrollment. Engineering and Applied Science remains in second place with an enrollment of 1,423, and Columbia Business School maintains third position with 655 students. This year, The Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science replaced the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) as the most international of Columbia's schools; its 1,423 international students constitute 42.5% of its total enrollment, 2.8 points more than SIPA's 39.7%. Representation at Columbia of enrolled students from every world region set record highs for Fall 2011. Asia showed the largest gain in number (435/12%), to 3,537, and retained a 54% share of Columbia's international enrollment. Oceania at 100 students stayed the same as last year. Europe remains a steady source of about 22.6% of our international students. Canada rose to 484, twenty-eight students more than last year, retaining North America's share of 7.4% and making it the University's fourth largest international student representation. Latin America and the Caribbean rose to 537 from 481 last year. While Africa (2.4% share) remains underrepresented at Columbia when compared to national data (5% share). The Middle East's 3.8% share is approximately two points less than the national numbers. (See pages 4-17 for regional maps, tables, and country data. Frequency histograms give the count of countries having the number of students reflected by each data division.)

The economic impact of our international student participation for the 2011-2012 Academic Year is conservatively calculated (see page 31) at a net contribution of almost \$304 million in new money to Columbia University and the surrounding community. International students now top \$255 million in annual net tuition payments.

Summarizing the characteristics of our international enrollment, 80% study at the graduate level, 91.6% are full-time, 8.5% self-identify as married, 44.3% are female—there are now 2,894 international women studying at Columbia—and 76% of our students fund their studies without Columbia assistance. Roughly 24% receive full or primary funding from the University, a figure higher than the national norm, but slightly less than half the nearly 50% rate historically found among leading American graduate research institutions.

Turning to Columbia's complement of international faculty and scholars<sup>6</sup>, China and France are the University's top countries of origin. Europe (1,317) is our largest source of scholars, with Asia (1,075) second.

Nationally, China and India rank one and two, and Asia, followed by Europe, continue as the largest sending regions. Harvard (4,459) remains the perennial leading host of international scholars, followed by UC Berkeley (2,929), and Columbia ranking third with (2,819). Data on this population are customarily reported for the July through June period corresponding to the University's fiscal year, and the world map reflecting sending countries and numbers (see pages 34-35) corresponds to FY 10 (7/10 – 6/11).

Of Columbia's 2,870 scholars, 1,762 (61%) are under the University's J-1 Exchange Visitor Program and 752 (26%) hold Columbia H-1B immigration classification. Roughly 61% are male. Instructional, research, and administrative staff number 1,907 (66%), with the balance of 963 holding courtesy designations and engaged in independent research.

The University's scholars are distributed across 136 academic and administrative units. The largest concentrations of scholars are at the Morningside Campus (1,660), in the Arts and Sciences construct (1,383), and Engineering (277). 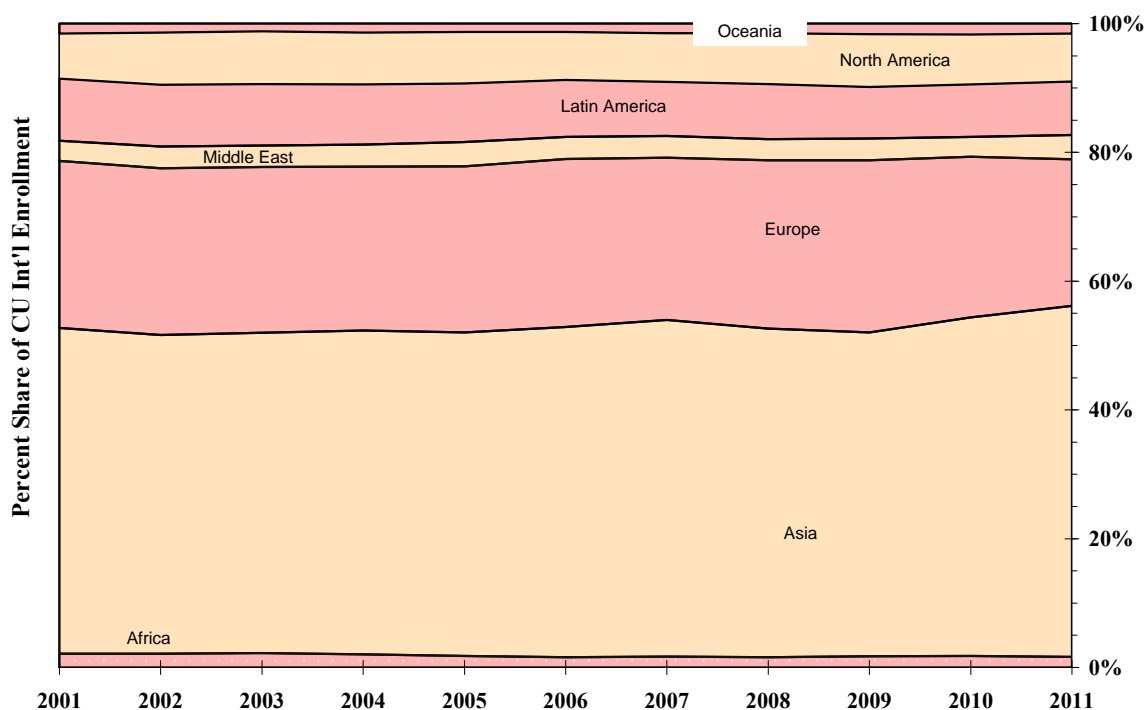
## Regional Student Population Trends 1976 – 2011

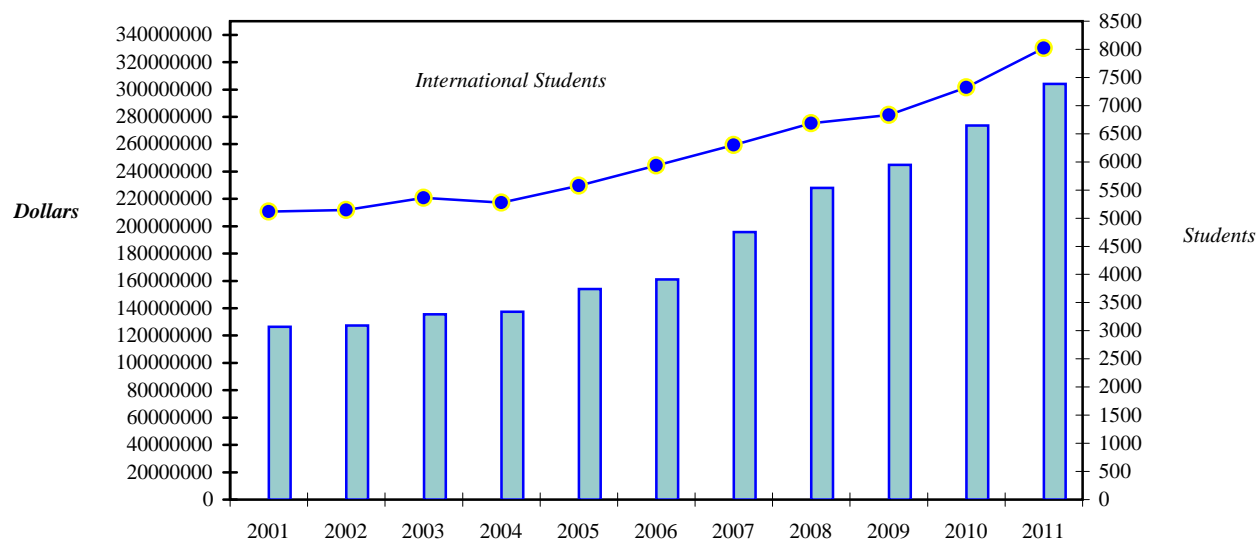

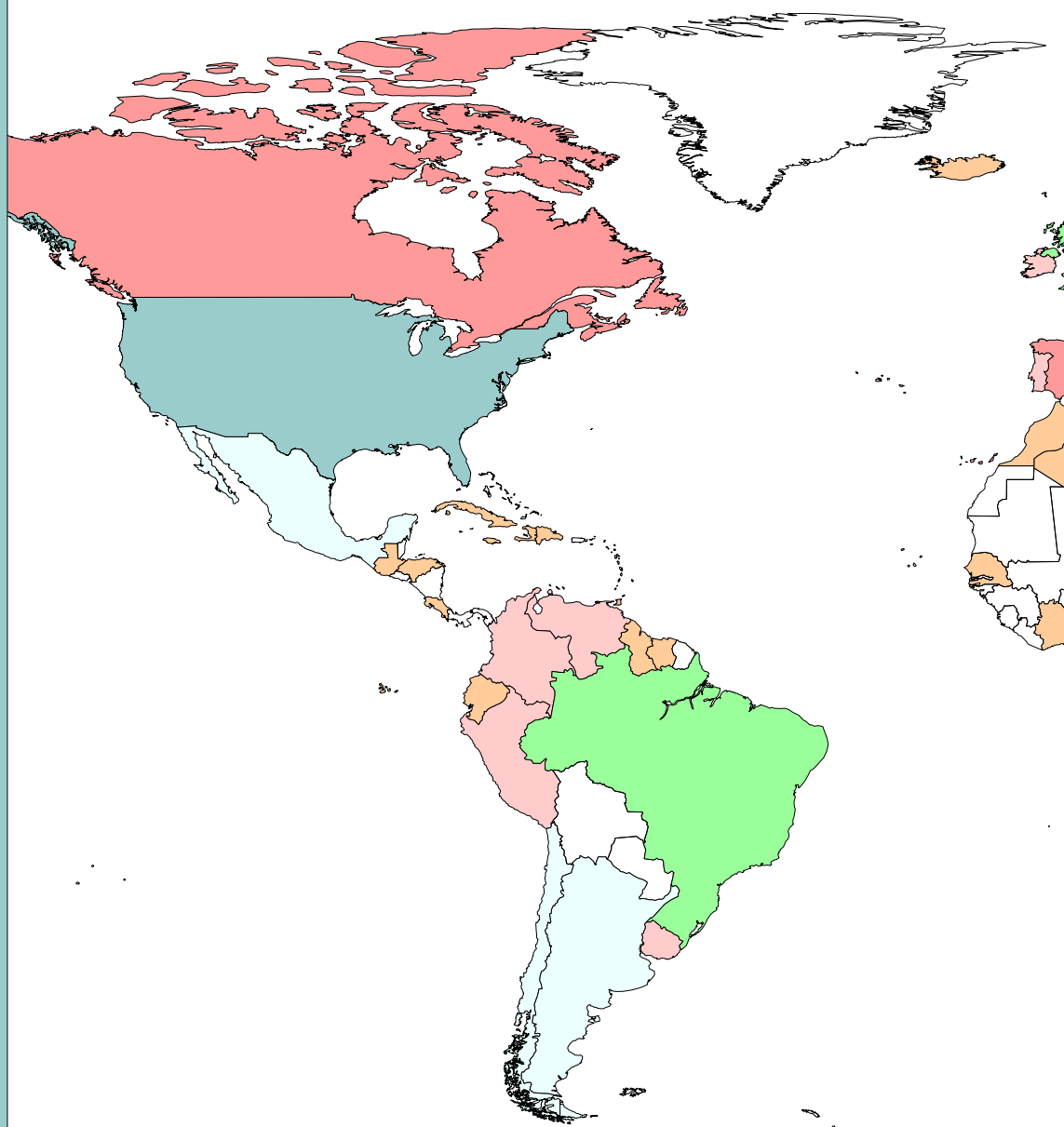

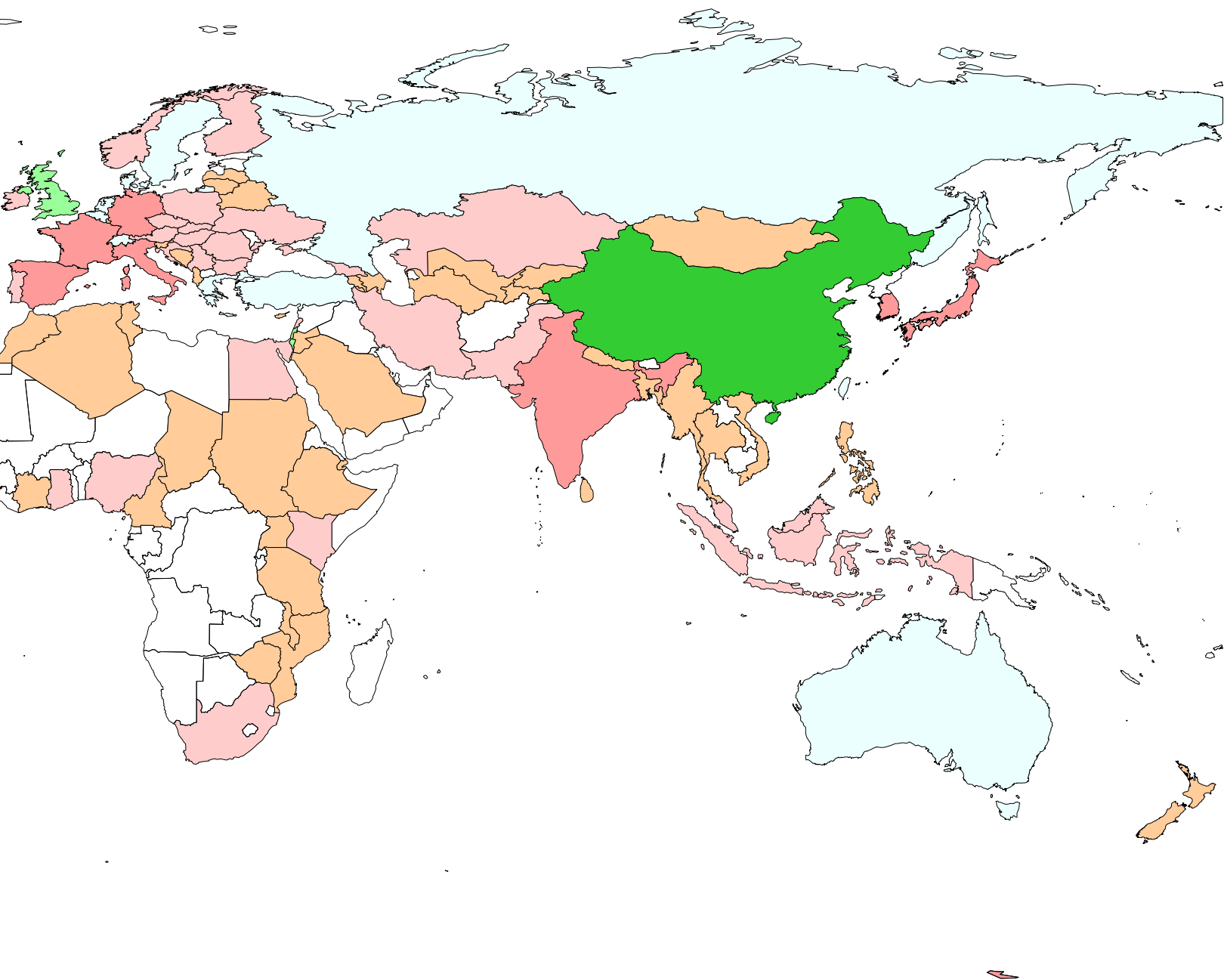

<sup>1</sup>Country or Place of Origin classification by world region follows the Institute of International Education's (IIE) taxonomy.

<sup>2</sup>"Engaged in practical training" is used to describe the legal classification and status known in the jargon of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) as engaged in "Optional Practical Training" (OPT) for F-1 Students or "Academic Training" (AT) for J-1 Exchange Visitors. These are students who—following completion of their Columbia University degree programs—engage in 12–36 months of field-related training under the continuing visa supervision of the University. The 1,488 Columbia University students whose legal basis for remaining in the US is practical training following completion of their degrees plus the 6,536 currently enrolled students comprise the 8,024 international student total.

<sup>3</sup>The figure 23.2% reflects the calculation of dividing the Fall 2011 international enrollment (6,536) by the University's Fall 2011 enrollment number of 28,206 (see endnote 4). However, the Institute of International Education, in calculating each academic institution's international representation, includes students engaged in practical training in its headcounts. For Fall 2011, this alternative methodology would result in Columbia being described as 28.4% international. Note: It is the IIE's calculation that is published annually in the *Chronicle of Higher Education*.

<sup>4</sup>Fall 2011 calculations are based on an enrollment total of 28,206. Data obtained on 11/01/11 from Columbia University's Student Information System (SIS).

<sup>5</sup>National data are from *Open Doors 2011*, a publication of the Institute of International Education, which reported the findings of the Fall 2010 IIE Annual Census of over 2,000 accredited U.S. postsecondary institutions.

<sup>6</sup>International scholars comprise both full- and part-time officers of research, instruction, and administration and Visiting Scholar/Scientist courtesy designations.

<sup>7</sup>Beginning with the 2006 edition of *Open Doors*, the Institute of International Education implemented several changes to its definitions of world regions. The previously separate regions of Eastern Europe and Western Europe were collapsed into a single Europe. More significantly, Turkey and Cyprus, previously included in the Middle East, were reclassified within Europe. This report reflects a single Europe. Regional longitudinal data are recalculated, beginning with 1974 numbers, to reflect the reclassification of Turkey and Cyprus within Europe.
