Federico Finchelstein is Assistant Professor of History at the New School for Social Research and Eugene Lang College of The New School in New York City. Professor Finchelstein is the author of 4 books on Argentine fascism and intellectual and political history, including his new book, *Transatlantic Fascism. Ideology, Violence and the Sacred in Argentina and Italy, 1919-1945* (Durham & London: Duke University Press, 2010). He published more than fifty academic articles and reviews on Fascism, Latin American Populism, the Holocaust and Antisemitism in English, Spanish, French, Portuguese and Italian publications, both in collective books and specialized peer review journals.
