The Tenants' Rights Project is one of the few activities where you can get real hands-on legal experience as a 1L.

The Tenants' Rights Project helps low-income tenants who are living in terrible conditions. Some have peeling lead paint, broken locks and windows, and even lack heat and water. You'll handle one case from start to finish, while working with another student, a TRP Board Member, and an attorney from the West Side SRO Law Project (a local tenants' advocacy organization). You'll conduct a site visit with the client, prepare court filings, and actually go to New York's Housing Part court.

Time commitment is usually around 15 hours over the course of the semester, but varies. In the past, students have found this very manageable. Since you are responsible for a real case, it's important you follow it through and put in the necessary time.
