DESCRIPTION:

Correspondence and printed materials of the journalist William Henry Donald (1875-1946). Born in Australia, Mr. Donald was a newsman in China from 1904 until World War II. Mediator of the Sian Incident in 1936, he was also adviser to Chang Hsueh-liang of Manchuria and later of Chiang Kai-shek and Mme Chiang. Subsequent to Pearl Harbor, he became interned in Manila for three years. After a brief visit to New York City in 1945, he was found to have cancer on his return trip to Shanghai, where he died in 1946. The correspondence is primarily with Harold K. Hochschild (1892-1981), executive of American Metal Co. who was a long-time friend with personal and business in-

terests in China, with letters also from Kuo Ching Li, Chinese businessman in New York City.
