DESCRIPTION:

The papers of Lewis Galantiere (1895-1977), translator of French literature, playwright, journalist and president of the American branch of P.E.N. from 1965 to 1967. Galantiere worked for the International Chamber of Commerce in Paris from 1920 to 1927, and came to know many French writers and American expatriates. Represented in the correspondence files in the collection are writers Margaret Anderson, Sherwood Anderson, George Antheil, Djuna Barnes, Clive Bell, Malcolm Cowley, E. E. Cummings, John Dos Passon, Ford Madox Ford, Ernest Hemingway, Richard Hughes, Eugene Jolas, Archibald MacLeish, H. L. Mencken, Henry Miller, Adrienne Monnier, Man Ray, Elmer Rice, Jules Romains, Gertrude Stein, John Steinbeck, Allen Tate, Carl Van Vechten, Robert Penn Warren and Edmund Wilson. His best known work as a translator was that of the writings of Antoine de Saint-Exupery and the collection contains, in addition to correspondence, twelve manuscripts, all bearing the author's and the translator's corrections. Having worked with the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, Office of War Information and Radio Free Europe, Galantiere also wrote extensively on economic subjects and current history, and these files and manuscripts are present in the collection. Galantiere also wrote plays in his own name and adapted Jean Anouilh's Antigone for Katharine Cornell in 1946, and there are materials relating to these works.
