DESCRIPTION: Industrial cooperatives were established in China in order to aid in industrial production during the Sino-Japanese War. The CIC (Chinese Industrial Cooperatives) had three main headquarters (in Northwest, Southwest, and Southeast China) to form the basis for small cooperative industries throughout the country which in 1946 numbered 1700 but which in 1948 had decreased to fewer than 500.

The Indusco, Inc. files contain typewritten reports of subunits to the parent organization; periodicals and other publications issues in Chinese by the three regional headquarters (the early ones are probably quite rare); publications in English by these headquarters and by American committees formed to aid in the movement; mounted photographs showing the work of the cooperatives and their leaders; albums of newspaper clippings on the movement, emanating from U.S. and abroad; maps showing locations of cooperatives; pencil sketches and water colors of cooperatives at work; and other material concerning this important organ which was largely responsible for China's ability to feed, clothe, and otherwise care for her people as well as to carry on a major war. 1985 Addition: correspondence, memos, and printed materials of Hugh Deane, including files on the revival of the CIC in the 1980s.

COMMENTARY FOR SLIDES

Black & White Slides - 3½" by 4"

1. The first Japanese bombs brought panic to the millions of skilled industrial people of China's coastal cities. Unable to defend themselves because of the lack of weapons, families bundled up their most precious possessions and started their long trek to China's agricultural interior. 90% of China's Industry was destroyed in the first few months of war.
2. Thousands of refugees stream over this bridge seeking a safe spot for their families and few possessions.
3. Way up in the Northwest a refugee family comes to a weary rest outside of their new cave home in China's northwest.
4. In the village at the foot of their cave hill grandmother reads a poster which tells about the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives that are willing to lend money to refugees so that they may begin productive work for the defense of their country.
5. Grandmother sets the ball rolling by spinning woolen yarns on the American type spinning wheel given to her by the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives.
6. The refugees remember only too well the cruel bombings of the coastal cities and of the civilians on their long trek to the interior. They take no chances with their new cooperatives and camouflage them whenever they feel there is danger that they may be spotted from the air.
7. Two husky young men prepare wooden molds to make land mines for the Chinese

8. Molten metal is poured into the molds prepared by the two young workers.
9. Electricity does not come from a convenient powerhouse but must be made in the hard and old-fashioned way. Here a giant water wheel produces the power for a local Chinese industrial cooperative workshop.
10. Hidden along the sides of a hill, this cooperative makes bricks for building new CIC workshops.
11. The story of how the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives made 500,000 blankets in the first four months of its existence is a story of ingenuity, sacrifices and persistence. Here two young members of the industrial cooperatives hold skeins of woolen yarns that will go into the manufacture of blankets.
12. This member of the CIC prepares the warp of his loom before weaving.
13. The finished army blankets are dyed in these big vats.
14. Work must not stop, even on the coldest days, for it is just such days as these that the Chinese soldier needs his blanket most. Here two large dyeing vats are drained in preparation for a new batch of blankets.
15. Ready for shipment! This young cooperative apprentice proudly displays some of the first blankets manufactured by the cooperatives.
16. The route to the front is hazardous so this driver of a CIC truck camouflages his blankets with bamboo mats and carries a gun.
17. CIC uses all methods for transport. Among them - mule carts, camels, boats and oxen. This boat builder puts the finishing touches on the craft that will carry CIC goods along Chinese waterways to the villages or troops.

18. Altogether the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives make some 500 different products. Usefulness is first, beauty secondary, in the choice of goods to be made. Here in Kweilin a group of men and women make umbrellas for China's army. In this rainy part of the country an umbrella is part of the regular equipment for Chinese soldiers.
19. China is suffering from inflation and needs gold to stabilize her currency. Mssr. H. H. Kung helped the CIC develop a huge gold mining program. This young man is panning ore in the shallows of a river.
20. For morale and cleanliness a cooperative in the Northwest produces "Victory Brand Soap".
21. A leather worker prepares raw hides for the manufacture of shoes for China's marching soldiers.
22. This proud craftsman displays the sign of his trade in front of his stitching machine which is putting the finishing touches on military boots and shoes.
23. In the South a hemp weaver prepares his materials for the manufacture of sandals to be used by China's Southern armies.
24. The first day of a women's sewing cooperative in China's Northwest.
25. A skilled glass craftsman prepares glass chimneys.
26. The Chinese Industrial Cooperatives are spread throughout 18 provinces of free China and include in their membership Chinese, Tibetans and Mongolians. Here the chairman of a Mohammedan fur-workers cooperative prepares fleece linings for soldiers' coats.

27. A bamboo water carrier cooperative.
28. The women of China play a heroic part in the revival of industry through the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives. Here a woman operates a large textile hand loom. Uniforms, hospital bedding and civilian clothing are made by other women's cooperatives.
29. Young girls learn to keep financial records for their cloth-shoe manufacturing cooperative.
30. Big sister and little sister take lessons in the operation of the new foot treadle spinning wheel developed by the cooperative engineers.
31. Bleaching powders are scarce and expensive so these women members hang their surgical gauze in the sun so that it can be bleached and sterilized at the same time.
32. The bleached and sterilized cotton is packed in the bright sunshine and is ready for shipment to China's hospitals and fighting fronts.
33. Textbooks, newspapers, posters telling the people of China about organization for resistance and production are printed by this large CIC workshop.
34. Entrance to the Northwest headquarters of the Chinese Industrial Cooperatives.
35. This young man came from the Philippine Islands to organize Chinese refugees into cooperatives.
36. A shoe store stocked with products of several Cooperative workshops.
37. CIC's first large store. Every product in this cooperatively-run store was
