New York, Columbia University Press, 1961</u> ) Not the accounts which constitute the texts of the printed volume, they are texts of other contemporary works made for her research, and these texts are sometimes cited in the published "notes." Originally the plan was for a 2-volume work that was later condensed into 1 volume. All of the Jan Hus material was withdrawn, the largest portion of material in this collection. Material about others includes Cardinal Peter D'Ailly of Cambrai, John Petit, Pope Martin V, and Bishop-elect William of Strasburh, and annates on the tax problem. John H. Mundy, professor of history, Columbia University, and Kennerly M. Woody completed the editing of this book for publication after Loomis' death.
