DESCRIPTION: Papers of Mobilization for Youth, a social service agency operating on the Lower East Side of New York City, conceived in 1957 and formally founded and funded in 1961. Included are correspondence, minutes, memoranda, reports, project proposals, financial records and related printed materials, documenting various social services focused on community development, the elimination of poverty and the prevention and control of juvenile deliquency. Among its programs are manpower and training services such as the Neegborhood Youth Corps, a remedial education and work program, and the New Careers Program, providing both instruction and on the job training; individual, group and family services, such as counseling and supportive services for juvenile deliquents; and mental health services. The correspondence is with city, state and federal agencies as well as private social service organizations. Included among the correspondents is John V. Lindsay. There are also files for Bertram M. Beck, Executive Director, the Board of Directors, the various committees, and project funding activities.

FACTS about...

MOBILIZATION FOR YOUTH 214 East 2nd Street New York, N.Y. 10009

WHAT IS IT? Mobilization for Youth, Inc. is a non-profit corporation consisting of representatives of institutions in the project area, persons recommended by the N.Y. School of Social Work of Columbia University and certain officials of New York City.

WHAT IS ITS PROGRAM? A demonstration project in the prevention and control of juvenile delinquency, it offers an action program integrated with research and evaluation. Basically, it is a social experiment, using as its laboratory an urban residential area with a high delinquency rate, large and diverse enough to be representative of problem areas in many communities throughout the nation.

<u>WHERE IS IT LOCATED</u>? The project area, located in Manhattan, extends from E. 14th St., south to the Brooklyn Bridge. It spans 67 blocks, exclusive of public, cooperative and private housing developments. Tenements (18,903 units) comprise 55.7 per cent of its housing, with public projects accounting for 31.6 per cent. Over a third of the area's housing units are substandard.

HOW DID MOBILIZATION BEGIN? It grew out of the concern of agencies and institutions on New York's Lower East Side over increasing juvenile delinquency. The idea originated at a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Henry Street Settlement in June of 1957. Together, the agencies of the area and Columbia's N.Y. School of Social Work developed an action-research program which was subsequently reviewed by a committee of experts brought together by the National Institute of Mental Health.

As a result of this review, a two-year planning period (Dec. 1959 to Dec. 1961) was approved and financed by the NIMH. The hypothesis developed by Drs. Richard A. Cloward and Lloyd E. Ohlin in their book, <u>Delinquency and Opportunity</u>: <u>A Theory of Delinquent Gangs</u> (1960) was used as a theoretical base.

WHAT IS MFY'S THEORETICAL BASE? The Cloward-Ohlin view of the sources and causes of delinquency is that poverty imposes handicaps upon the potential of young people for achievement, as does discrimination based on race and religion. That young people, unless they are offered a stake in conformity, become alienated from their society and its values and traditions. And that much delinquency can be understood as representing illegitimate ways of achieving success goals.

Thus, according to the theory, efforts to prevent delinquency will succeed only if they provide young people with genuine opportunities to behave differently--especially through creative educational and exciting work programs--and if they involve residents directly in improving the social and economic opportunities which their community afforts.

THE PROGRAM's HIGHLIGHTS. The two major aspects of Mobilization's program are (1) Action (work, education, the community, special services to individuals and families and special services to groups), and (2) an integrated program of research and evaluation.

Action programs and the project's budget are outlined on separate sheets.
