Correspondence files on United States foreign policy issues of Eustace Seligman (1889-1976; LL.B., 1914) lawyer and son of Edwin R. A. Seligman. These files of letters to government officials, congressmen, senators, scholars and other individuals date from 1969 through 1972, and deal with Seligman's ideas, suggestions and opinions on the Vietnam War, the Arab-Israeli controversy, China, India and Cuba. In most cases there are 1 or 2 letters to or from each individual. The major correspondent is Ellsworth Bunker, U. S. Ambassador to Vietnam (7 letters)
