Mond family: Ludwig Mond (1839-1909), chemical technologist, manufacturer and collector of works of art. He and his wife were patrons of the arts in London and were extremely kind to Symons, who became a lifelons friend of the family; his daughter-in-law Melchett, Violet, Lady (d.1945): Philanthropist, D.B.E. 1920
