DESCRIPTION:

The collection consists of 124 letters from Count Leo Tolstoi and members of his family to Aylmer "aude, the English translator of his works. There are 69 letters from Count Leo Tolstoi, 18 letters from Countess Tolstoi, 11 lotters from Sergius Tolstoi (his son), 25 letters from his four daughters, Alexandra, Olga, Marya, Tatiana, and one letter from Ers. V. G. Tchertkoff. The letters deal with such subjects as " What is art?", the "Resurrection" fund, Tolstoi's health, censorship, Ruskin, the banishment of the Doukhobors to Siberia, Tolstoi's doctrine of non-resistance, Jew ish Pogroms, famine in Mussia, Hurder of Alexander II, etc. There are letters from the countess which reflect her feelings about the Tchertkoffs connection with Tolstoi and a letter from Sergius informing Maude that Tolstoi had left home to die (1910). Subsequent letters deal with pothumous publications of Tolstoi's works. Though there are a few letters in English, the material is principally in Mussian. Each Russian letter is accompanied by an English translation in typescript.
