DESCRIPTION:

Manuscript by Boris Gurevich, i.e. Gourevitch (1889-^{ca. 1960}~~1960~~), writer and journalist. In the emigration in France and then in the U.S., he became involved in work for reform of international law. He was one of the founders of the Union for the Protection of the Human Person. His main work is The Road to Peace and to Moral Democracy: An Encyclopedia of Peace (International Universities Press, N.Y., 1955), for which he was nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize ~~in~~ 1957.

The manuscript is entitled "Krasnyi sfinks: Povest' o sud'be russkoi revoliutsii i russkikh evreev" (ca. 1200 p.). It is a memoiristic novel dealing with the Revolution and Civil War.
