DESCRIPTION: Papers created and collected by Iuliia A. Kutyryna (1891-ca.1972), niece of the writer Ivan Shmelev. The papers, which primarily concern Shmelev, consist of correspondence, manuscripts, photographs, and printed materials. The correspondence includes photocopies of letters from Petr Struve to Ivan Shmelev, and of letters from Shmelev to one Aleksandr Ivanovich. Manuscripts consist of Kutyryna's memoirs and essays about Shmelev; these draw heavily on correspondence of Shmelev, Ivan Bunin, Konstantin Bal'mont, and Thomas Mann. Also included are Kutyryna's memoirs about the October 1917 Revolution in Moscow. Printed materials consist of books by Kutyryna's husband, the writer Ivan Novgorod-Severskii.
