DESCRIPTION:

Papers of Mark A. Aldanov (pseud. of M. A. Landau; 1886-1957), Russian emigre writer in France and the United States. The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, documents, a photograph, and printed material, primarily from the period 1941-1957. Included are letters from Ivan Bunin, Marc Chagall, Mikhail Karpovich, Vasilii Maklakov, W. Somerset Maugham, Vladimir Nabokov, Il'ia Repin, Edmund Wilson, Boris Zaitsev and many others. Manuscripts of his works include Istoki, Nachalo kontsa, Zhivi, kak khochesh', and The Escape (English translation of Begstvo), such shorter tales as Noch' v terminale, Povest' o smerti, and Ul'mskai noch', as well as numerous articles, book reviews and essays. There are financial records for Novyi Zhurnal, which Aldanov helped found, and the clippings are mainly articles about Aldanov. There is one late photograph of Aldanov.

Mark A. Aldanov (né Landau) was born on 26 October 1886 in Kiev into an affluent Jewish family. Although a chemist by education, Aldanov was active in political and literary circles in pre-Revolutionary and Revolutionary Russia. His first published work, a literary essay entitled Tolstoi i Rollan, appeared in 1915. It was followed by publications of a political and historical nature: Lénine (1919), Deux révolutions: la révolution française et la révolution russe (1920), La politica estera dei Soviets (1921), and by various shorter pieces. A collection of his aphorisms was published in 1918 under the title Armageddon, but was subsequently confiscated by the Bolsheviks.

An opponent of the Bolsheviks, Aldanov left Russia [redacted] for Berlin where he wrote for the Russian language dailies Golos Rossii and Dni while serving as the latter's literary editor. When Dni moved its editorial offices to Paris, Aldanov and his wife Tat'iana (née Zaitseva), whom he had married in 1922, moved to Paris where they remained until their emigration to the United States in 1939.

During his years in Germany and France, Aldanov dedicated himself to the writing of fiction and historical essays and portraits. His fictional works were primarily historical novels; Sviataia Elena, malen'kii ostrov (1923), Deviatoe Termidora (1923), Chortov most (1925) and Zagovor (1927) comprise the French Revolution cycle which he entitled Myslitel'; Kliuch (1930), Begstvo (1932) and Peshchera (1934, 1936) revolve around the Russian Revolution; and Nachalo kontsa (1938) is set in the time of the Spanish Civil War. During this time Aldanov also wrote a symbolic tale, Desiataia simfonia (1931) and a short story, Bel'vederskii tors (1938). Aldanov's historical pieces from this period are: Sovremenniki (1928), Portrety (1931), Zemli, liudi (1932), Iunost' Pavla Stroganova i drugie kharakteristiki (1934) and Novye portrety (1936).

Aldanov resided in New York from the end of 1939 until 1946. Here also his activities revolved around the writing and publication of literature. Together with M. Tsetlin he founded in 1942 the Russian language journal Novyi Zhurnal where many of his own literary works were first published. In 1946 he returned with his wife to France, this time to Nice, where he lived until his death on 25 February 1957. His wife died eleven years later in Paris.

Aldanov's fictional writings during the last two decades of his life included short stories, several longer symbolic tales--Punchevaja vodka, skazka o vsekh piati schast'iach (1940), Mogila voina, skazka o mudrosti (1940), Povest' o smerti (1952-1953), Ul'mskaja noch' (1949)--and four historical novels: Istoki (1950), Zhivi, kak khochesh' (1952), Bred (1954-1957) and Samoubiistvo (1958).
