Dr. Maurice F. Tauber's long and distinguished career as including serving on and chairing a large number of professional committees and sub-committees. The materials here organized represent a portion of Dr. Tauber's papers dealing with work that he did on a wide variety of American Library Association committees between 1948 and 1966. There are at least eight other full boxes of papers relating to his ALA committee work as yet unsorted.

The papers here were generated by over 25 different organizational structures and while they offer insight into the history of those bodies, they do not represent complete documentation. There are gaps in committee work as detailed here, many of which will presumably be filled in as the rest of the collection is arranged. This consideration has influenced some of the decisions I made about the organization of these papers.

The large majority of items here are letters or copies of letters. Dr. Tauber was an active correspondent and in most cases kept carbons of the letters he sent out. While there is a good deal of variety in the subjects covered here, two large groups stand out— the committee work resulting from the Council of National Library Associations' Joint Committee on Education for Librarianship (folders 2-7, 9-10) and that of the Interdivisional Committee on Documentation of ALA (folders 21-3). Aside from their intrinsic interest, both these groups of papers suggest the of necessity/and difficulties in cooperation between the many diverse interests within the profession.

I have chosen to maintain a generally chronological arrangement of these papers, with deviance only when desirable to keep a series of related letters together or to match a response to an original letter. In addition, the main grouping used is the committee which the material relates to following the principle

of provenance. I have group materials in folders in such a way that other papers filling temporal gaps in the chronology represented here can be interfiled without great difficulty. For this reason I have listed folder contents separately (by page) so that folders can be easily moved to other boxes if such atrangement seems desirable without the requirement of retyping the listing.

Access to this group of papers is provided by means of a general listing of folders and their contents which includes the name of organizations or committee structures within, dates (by year), number of items, and surnames of correspondents. An alphabetical name index is provided, as are separate indices to organizations and acronyms. All three indexes are keyed to folder numbers. Dr. Tauber has not been included in the index or in the lists of correspondents in the brief description of folder contents since materials addressed to him and written by him are represented in every folder. Individuals to whom letters have been addressed and from whom they have been received are listed in the index. Finally, a chronological listing of the contents of each folder is provided with a brief description of each item.

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Professor Maurice Tauber has had a long and distinguished career in the library profession. He is well-known for his work and publications in the fields of technical services and archival management in libraries. During his career, he has served as a consultant in numerous libraries throughout the world. He has often been called in to study the technical services operations of a given library and to make suggestions for their modification or revamping. Such studies have resulted in the accumulation of many archival papers including the correspondence connected with each of the studies and the reports - and their preliminary drafts - which have sprung from them. The box of Professor Tauber's papers which I chose to organize consisted mainly of items relating to libraries at which he had served as a consultant.

This box was Box #29 of the Tauber Papers and was labelled "Brandeis to Buffalo." When I first examined the box, I saw that there were seven distinct groups into which the papers were already divided. These groups were papers from:

- I. A Bowdoin College library study
- II. Correspondence related to Brandeis University which was setting up its library
- III. Professor Tauber's proposed trip(s) to Brazil
- IV. A study of the Bridgeport Public Library
- V. Notes and a paper relating to library rebuilding vs. remodeling
- VI. A study of the Buffalo and Erie County Public Libraries
- VII. Correspondence relating to the proposal to set up a library school at the State University of New York at Buffalo.

I first arranged these groups in the alphabetical order in which I have listed them. The overall structure of the box is this basic alphabetical arrangement. I then organized the material within each of the seven groups.

The organization for the three groups of material representing library studies (Groups I, IV, and VI) is similar. In each group, I separated the correspondence from the reports and their drafts. I arranged the correspondence chronologically, from the earliest to the most recent date. Where there were great quantities of correspondence which could be easily divided into subject

groups within the chronological arrangement, I separated the correspondence into these subject groups, always maintaining the basic chronological arrangement. I also arranged the drafts and the final reports in chronological order. There were often miscellaneous notes, pamphlets, maps, etc. which I put together in a folder separate from the rest of the material.

For the three groups of material composed largely of correspondence (groups II, III, and VII), the arrangement was, again, chronological. Group III (Brazil) contained much more material than the other groups so, as in the library studies, I broke down the chronological arrangement into general subject groups. Group III also contained miscellaneous material which I placed, together, in a separate folder.

The remaining group (Group V - Library Buildings) consisted of preliminary notes, an outline, and a tentative paper. I separated the notes from the outline and the paper.

The material that follows is an inventory of the contents of Box 29 of the Tauber Papers. Although I have divided this inventory into the seven basic groups listed above, the folders are numbered sequentially throughout the box.

Dr. Maurice F. Tauber's long career has given him the opportunity to take part in many different aspects of the library profession. He has been a teacher of library science, has conducted numerous surveys of technical services in various types of libraries, has been a member and chairman of various A.L.A. committees and been intimately involved with ongoing research in the firld of cataloging policy and revision. The papers in Box 50 reflect all these varied aspects of Dr. Tauber's interests. For the purposes of this paper, they may be broken down into three broad categories: general correspondence, the Lubetzky study and the Metropolitan Museum of Art survey.

With the exception of the MMA papers (to be discussed separately), the large majority of items are letters or copies of letters and their related enclosures, either sent to or received by Dr. Tauber.

The first major group of folders are of a general nature, representing for the most part Dr. Tauber's correspondence with several schools who requested his advice concerning the arrangement of their collections. The main grouping of these folders is the name of school or organization the material relates to, following the principle of provenance. However, where it was felt that grouping by subject heading to bring together related material would be more helpful to the user, folders were arranged in that manner, with sub-arrangements within the series for individual organizations (e.g., the medical librarianship folders, nos. 9-11).

Another major group of "correspondence" folders represent the Lubetzky series (folders 25-30). The overall arrangement of these folders is by subject (the Lubetzky study), sub-arranged by the particular aspect of the study that the individual materials touched upon. Together, the "general correspondence" folders and the Lubetzky series include approximately two-thirds of the box's items. I have chosen to maintain a generally chronological arrangement of these papers, with deviance only when desirable to keep a series of related letters together or to match a response to an original letter. This was done only in cases where deviation was deemed helpful in understanding the flow of correspondence. Materials within the folders have been grouned in such a way that other papers filling gaps in the chronology could easily be interfiled. For this reason I have listed folder contents separately (by page) so that folders could be easily updated or moved to other boxes without making it necessary to retype the list for the entire box.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art papers were a special problem. Since for the most part these are undated notes related to and draft copies of a survey Dr. Tauber did of the MMA Registrar and Catalog Department in 1960, a chronological list would not only be impossible to construct but also unsuitable. The papers were a complete mess--pages were scattered all over and totally unrelated materials were interfiled with each other. After trying unsuccessfully to sift through the jumble of papers, I finally realized that I would have to get a complete copy of the report and try to match the loose papers to that. Unfortunately, the only copy Columbia owns of the report is on microfilm (no. LS-F6598). I read through this copy and wrote down all chapter headings, sub-headings, etc. My next step was to examine each item in the folders in an attempt to determine to which chapter in the final report it belonged. This

was done largely by comparing its content against my list of headings. This tactic was very successful, although very time consuming. After the papers were generally arranged by chapter, I went through them again, this time to sub-arrange each chapter folder by form (preliminary notes, drafts, charts and tables, etc.). The drafts themselves were later arranged in an approximately progressive order (earliest to latest) to enable the user to see the development behind each chapter in the final report. This proved to be one of the most difficult parts of the project, since none of the drafts were complete or dated to show any kind of order. Occassionally, pages of one particular draft were clipped together, but most of the pages were scattered and so I had to try to unite the various pages of each particular draft. Criteria used here were typeset used, format of the page, type of marginal notes, etc. Each chapter was given its own folder, which was keyed to its corresponding chapter in the microfilm copy of the completed report.

Access to this group of papers is initially provided for by means of a general listing of folders, which includes name of organization and/or subject, dates (by year), number of items and surnames of correspondents. In-depth access is provided by a chronological listing (where applicable) of the contents of each folder, together with a brief description of the contents of each item and its archival specifications. As already explained, contents of the MMA folders are listed by form, sub-arranged in approximate chronological order. Finally, an alphabetical name index is provided, keyed to folder numbers. Dr. Tauber has not been included in the index or in the lists

of correspondents in the brief description of folder contents since materials addressed to him or written by him are represented in every folder. Individuals to whom letters have been addressed and from whom they have been received are listed in the index.

#### INTRODUCTION

The content of Box #48 of the Maurice Tauber papers well illustrates the varied and many activities in which Dr. Tauber engaged during his career in library service.

The topics covered in this box are a potpourri of "LI" subjects—Library Association of City College of N.Y.; Library Binding Institute; Library Building Consultants, Inc.; Library Catalog Study; Drafts of Library of Congress Studies; Library of Congress; Library of Congress Classification—Questionnaires; Library of Congress Classification Institute; Library of Congress Forms and Procedures; Library of Congress "No Conflict" Cataloging; and Library of Congress Printed Catalog and Committee on Descriptive Cataloging.

Among the many questions addressed in this collection are the legal dispute involving the Library Binding Institute, the building consultation regarding the Canadian National Agricultural Library, and technical services aspects of librarianship such as descriptive cataloging, subject headings and the time lag in card printing. These latter points are primarily discussed insofar as they relate to the Library of Congress and its committees.

The box is arranged topically, and under topic, chronologically (earliest to most recent). The collection as a whole spans twenty years (1942 to 1962), yet each topic has its own distinct time period, which may extend for a considerable number of years.

The papers consist largely of personal correspondence between Dr. Tauber and his colleagues. Also included are exams, syllabi, and papers of former students and professors, drafts of reports, Library of Congress forms and reprints of articles. While they are

almost entirely typewritten, a few are handwritten and include carbon copies and photoduplications.

In sum, these papers portray Dr. Tauber's roles as a library educator, library innovator, library consultant and businessman. While no one file is sufficient unto itself, their cumulative effect is to directly trace Dr. Tauber's work and, in a broader sense, provide a picture of the development of American librarianship (particularly the technical services) within this period.

#### BOX 57: STATE OF THE LIBRARY ART & SURVEYS

When I first received this box to work on, I found that the folders inside contained papers which seemed to have no relation to each other or to the headings which they were placed under. Many of the papers had the front title pages torn off and/or pages missing, making it impossible to determine authorship or purpose. Quite a number of hand-written notes of Dr. Tauber's, thoughts jotted down and notes on various articles and books, were scattered throughout the folders. Because of their brevity, I was forced to place many of them in the Miscellaneous folder as I was unable to organize them properly.

To simplify my work, I followed the suggestion of Dean Carol Learmont and listed each item separately on a 3x5 index card. Since much of the material seemed unrelated, I thought this would ease the final sorting and it proved to be very helpful.

Most of the arranging was done chronologically, althought I felt it necessary to add two Miscellaneous folders, one with a detailed description of the items in it. The other folder was left unorganized as it contains fragments and pages which did not easily lend themselves to arrangement.

State of the Library Art is a work reviewing the status of knowledge of librarianship by a committee headed by Dr. Ralph Shaw on a grant from the Graduate School of Library Service at Rutgers University. Volume 1, part 1, "Cataloging and Classification," was written by Dr. Tauber and "Subject Headings," part 2, by Carlyle J. Frarey. Using the book as a guide helped clarify the order and significance of the papers and aided in the evantual organization of

the archive.

The papers fell into three main catagories - State of the Library Art, Library Surveys, and the Institute on Subject Analysis of Library Materials, a symposium which Dr. Tauber organized in 1952 at Columbia University. Additional smaller catagories are also included.

Because of the lack of cohesion in this box, many pages are missing and may be lost among other boxes until future sortings have been done. When possible, I indicated the form and distinguishing feature of the papers, using Menzenska's Archives and Other Special Collections as a source for abbreviations. I also found the work which had previously been done on other boxes to be very helpful, especially in avoiding unnescessary duplication.

I found working on those papers rewarding, although rather frustrating at times and feel they show a great deal of insight into the working of the library field and library art itself, especially into its leading figures.

#### BOX 77: COLLEGE AND RESEARCH LIBRARIES

In 1938 the College and Reference Section of the American Library
Association was reorganized and a new Association of College and Reference
Libraries formed as a section of A.L.A. One of the first efforts of the
new association was the publication of a professional journal devoted to
the interests of college and research libraries. The first issue of
College and Research Libraries appeared in December 1939 and the mission
of the journal was tentatively spelled out in the lead article of that
issue by its first editor, Dr. A. F. Kuhlman, Librarian of the Joint
University Libraries, Nashville, Tenn.

- 2) to make available selected papers presented at conventions as well as other professionally significant articles
- 3) to serve as a clearinghouse for news of interest to college, university, and reference librarians
- 4) to bridge the gap between these librarians and the faculty, administrators, and research workers whom they serve
- 5) to review books, pamphlets, and current periodical literature of interest to A.C.R.L. members
- 6) to help stimulate research and experimentation
- 7) to help develop A.C.R.L. into a strong professional organization. 1.

With these objectives in mind Dr. Kuhlman set the tone of the journal, serving as its editor from December 1939 to June 1941. Such sections appeared regularly as "News from the Field" compiled by Willard P. Lewis; "Current Reference Aids" prepared by Louis Shores and Frances Cheney; "New Periodicals and Serials" by Carolyn Ulrich; "Public Documents" by Violet Cabeen; "Readings in Business Administration" by Marian C. Manley, etc. The Publications Committee of A.C.R.L. with such members as Charles H. Brown, Mabel L. Conat, B. Lamar Johnson, Guy R. Lyle, Blanche McCrum, Louise R. Wilson, Henry M. Wriston, acted in an advisory capacity on journal affairs.

In the Spring of 1941 Dr. Kuhlman asked Carl M. White, Librarian at the University of Illinois and Chairman of the Policies Committee of A.C.R.L. to succeed him. After several months of deliberation and not a little correspondence, Dr. White agreed to take over the editorship in late summer of 1941 provided he would have Errett W. McDiarmid, also at Illinois, as his managing editor and the assurance of a \$600 yearly budget for secretarial help.

Dr. White edited the journal from September 1941 to January 1948 with Dr. McDiarmid as managing editor until September 1943. From March 1944 until September 1945, Ernest J. Reece served as managing editor. Maurice F. Tauber succeeded him and became himself editor-in-chief in April 1948, a position he held for fourteen years until January 1962.

The office files of C. M. White and E. W. McDiarmid which these boxes represent, were arranged logically as they saw it, and yet there is overlapping; e.g. the materials in Box 77, A.C.R.L.— C & RL — Editorship are related to those in Box 78, Editorship. Eventually the complete file of C & RL materials which are scattered throughout the Tauber Papers,

as well as those so far identified in the boxes and folders I have indicated, should be brought together in a chronological and series sequence.

I have arranged the materials in Box 77 into broad categories and chronologically within each sub-series. For example, one problem has been the arrangement of correspondence involving contributors. Originally Box 77 had a folder, A.C.R.L. - <u>C & RL</u> - Contributions and one for Contributors - A-G. As I went through the original files, removing staples and putting in chronological order individual files of correspondence that had been stapled together with the most recent letter on top, I found that materials on contributions involving A.C.R.L. committee members often overlapped with correspondence for these same people rearticles in general.

In this case I rearranged the original files and put all materials involving 1) contributors, 2) editorship, and 3) editorial council into folders under these headings directly. I arranged in sequence the materials involving the operation of the journal; Editorship, Editorial Council, Eudget, Advertising; followed by those related to content; College and University Library Statistics, Brown, Charles Harvey ~ Festschrift Issue, Articles Rejected and Contributors. Within each of these sub-series materials were separated into folders in such a way that they can be identified with related materials in box 78 and 79.

The challenge of organizing for use an archival collection of documents which traces the history of the journal College and Research Libraries and of the work, and personalities, of its editors and contributors is a very interesting one. I hope the project can eventually be completed.

### THE TAUBER PAPERS:SERIES II:BOX 126 239 Materials and Related Materials

At first glance, the bulging folders of Box 126 were a formidable sight.

Merely looking at the contents, to say nothing of organizing them, seemed to be
a full-time job. It turned out to be a very interesting project.

The records generally were in good condition. Much of the material is in carbon copy. A few of the international papers are badly yellowed and soon will be in very fragile condition. I removed paper clips and most staples and listed each item separately on a 3x5 card. The material, in temporary folders, was often not related. Sorting the entries on the 3x5 cards quickly turned up duplicates and related items which were widely separated, saved wear and tear on fragile materials, and made the whole box much easier to deal with. I would recommend the system to anyone working on these papers.

Box 126 is similar in content to Box 127 which was arranged in May 1973, by Icylda Applewhite. She has written a short history of Z39 which is included with her description of Box 127, and I will not repeat it. Eventually a brief chronology of Z39 and related committees should be done.

There are now 14 folders in Box 126. Since Eox 126 is so similar to Box 127 in content, I studied Ms Applewhite's design and decided that it made good sense. My division of the material, chronologically and by committee, is basically the same as hers. The Z39 breakdown does not seem to be sensitive enough, however, as it becomes clear that there are vast numbers of related items. I have added a folder for the American Standards Association since several items which were not directly related to Z39 turned up. I have also added folders for ISO/TC 37 and ISO/TC 46, which are international standards committees. The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) was founded in 1946, an outgrowth of earlier

Committees working on hundreds of projects in many fields. The first four committees directly concerned with library problems were set up in 1950. These dealt with abbreviations for titles of periodicals, the transliteration of Cyrillic characters, bibliographical subjects, chiefly with working on the layout of periodicals, and with documentary reproduction. These are closely related to the ASA Z39 Sub-Committees but are not really the same. As I looked at Ms Applewhite's listings it seemed clear that a number of the items should be separated out into the ISO/TC classification. ISO/TC 37 works with Terminology (Principles and Co-ordination) and ISO/TC 46 with Documentation.

As Dr. Tauber's papers are arranged many more items from 239 and the international committees will no doubt come to light. When two or three more boxes in this series are sorted rules for classifying the contents should be developed and written down, the format edited, and the boxes integrated. I feel strongly that only by calendaring all the items can they be properly identified and placed in the appropriate part of this huge and very useful collection which reflects the tremendous growth and change in the field of librarianship since World War II.

#### POLICE IN

#### I. BACKGROUND OF 232

The Tauber Papers - Series II: Z39 Materials was the project concern ing arrangement of materials with which I was involved. What is Z397 It is
one of several hundred standards committees of the parent body, the American
National Standards Institute. The names of the committees are designated
by letters and numbers to allow for expansion; thus the name Z39 in this
instance. Z39 is concerned with library standards.\*

The standards organization was founded in 1918 as the American Standards Association. ASA started in 1918 as a federation of 135 trade associations, technical societies, professional groups and consumer organizations. There were some 2,000 companies affiliated with ASA as company members.

The purpose was to eliminate duplication of atamasks activities and to weld conflicting standards into single, nationally accepted standards under the designation, "American Standards". In 1966 ASA became United States of of America Standards Institute. Three years later, the name of USASI was changed to American National Standards Institute. By 1969, nearly 3,000 standards were approved by USASI, but these standards are voluntary.

of the International Organization for Standardization, the International Electrotechnical Commission and the Pan American Standards Commission.

American standards are on file in the libraries of the national standards \*The scope of Z39 also includes documentation and related publishing practices.

In 1937, American Standards Association was asked by the International Standards Association to participate actively in the work of the international committee on documentation, ISA 46. The American Library Association, American Association of Law Libraries, Medical Libraries Association and Special Libraries Association advised ASA to appoint Carolyn F. Ulrich of the New York Public Library to represent ASA. These same library associations then asked ASA to organize a committee on library standards. The formation of Committee 239 was approved in 1939.

In 1951, after a period of relative inactivity, Z39 was reactivated and the Council of National Library Associations agreed to act as sponsor. Four subcommittees of Z39 were authorized: Abbreviations for periodicals; Cyrillic Transliteration, of which Professor Maurice F. Tauber was chairman; Layout of Periodicals and Library Statistics. By 1970, Z39 had 38 subcommittees. Initially, ALA supported Z39 with about \$300 for postage and stationery. In 1969, Z39 enjoyed financial support to the extent of \$40,000 a year through greats from the National Science Foundation. However, the subcommittees must justify their activities in order to obtain funding.

It was during Professor Tember's chairmanship of the subcommittees on transliteration and on bibliographic references that he came into possession of much of the Z39 materials. The major portion of these materials are now in the possession of Ellis Mount, Librarian, School of Engineering, Columbia University. The scope of the Z39 materials with which I dealt is from 1958 to 1968.

#### CONDUCTION OF REACTIONS

The records were in good condition; I removed paper clips to prevent damage to the records. Most of the material consisted of Xerox copies. The materials were unorganized but had been placed in folders given designations related to 239.

Without understanding the history of Z39 it would have been very difficult to arrange the record items because items belonging to various subsecumittees were scattered throughout the folders. The contents of letters and memoranes, aid not always refer to the subcommittee by name. Therefore, it was important to know the names of consaittee members and the functions of the 239 committee and its subcommittees, in order to put an item in its proper place. By knowing the activities of the subcommittees at various times, it was also possible to place undated items close to related materials.

#### PROCEDURE AND RATIONALE FOR APRANGEMENT

III.

It was necessary to maintain the integrity of each record group so that the activity of Z39 and its subcommittees would be adequately reflected. Upon examining the contents of the seven folders, I decided to respect the rule of provenance, but with some modification in order to make the materials more convenient to the user.

The number of folders was expanded to 17 folders: one folder such for Z39, 1960-1965; Z39, 1966-1968; each of the subcommittees in the Z39 file at present and a folder for miscellaneous materials.

The contents of this archival series were established on the besis of their relationship to activity. The record items, such as correspondence, memoranda, minutes, reports, etc., were arranged within each folder in a straight chronological order, the earliest date first. This is illustrated in the attached calendar in which there is a description of the contents, of each folder.

Information about each record item was written on 3 x 5 cards before arrangement was attempted. They were used in describing the contents of each folder, and they were also useful in seeing that related materials were kept together, e.g., ISO documents referred to the various subcommittees.

#### IV. FUTURE ASPECTS OF THE PROJECT

As stated before, the Z39 materials now among the Tauber Papers are only a small part of the Z39 papers. It is to be hoped that the Z39 collection will be developed. These papers are significant in the history of the development of national standards in the fields of librarianship and of communication. The present arrangement will allow for expansion to reflect the growth of Z39.

#### Personal Comment

There are two reasons for choosing such a topic as the recommendation letters; first of all my overall curiosity in the subject matter and secondly, I thought that I can always acquire books to read dealing with archival management but this opportunity for access to such confidential material as Professor Tauber's papers is not going to pass my path easily, therefore, with a grateful heart I have started to read the recommendation letters.

Actually I was more interested in the contents of the letters than the arrangement itself.

Since I have been listening to the lectures of Prof. Tauber's Archival Management class, I am impressed with his long years of dedicated service to the field of library service. This impression was further enhanced when I started reading and examining his papers. I felt that his service was not limited to the field itself and the United States of America but to the humanity as a whole. To be more specific, as an educator in the highest institution of its' kind, he not only educated the students, but those students who later became the best leaders of America, hence of the world.

Among his three-hundred-twenty-three letters written during the period between 1945 and 1960, most of them were recommendation letters for library positions and the job catagory ranged from a beginning cataloguer to a director of a large library in a metropolitan area.

Almost 35% of the letters were recommendation letters for students who were seeking Fellowship awards for higher degrees or further research in the library field and others. The remaining 5% were recommendation

letters for people who were seeking positions other than the librarianship.

)

It was quite surprising and interesting to learn that his recommendation letters for Prof. Frances Henne and Mr. Carlyle Frarey helped in launching their careers.

To make a general comment on the over all contents of his letters, I felt that he was very honest in his opinions on the persons he was making comments. And yet, what impressed me most was the fact that if he was not certain he did not say anything at all. Not only that, but he openly admitted his own human fragility, which coming from one of the best educators of his time, over-whelmed me.

It seems that it is not only me but many of the past students felt this warm human quality that the Professor possesses. I recall a letter from a former student of his who wrote a long personal letter to him, thanking him again and again for his spiritual help in her difficult times. His all-arms out enthusiastic help toward those students and others in obtaining their career goals are all reflected in his letters, however short his comments were in some of them.

#### The Collection

Box 129, which contains Professor Tauber's papers were examined. Since some one else was handling Box 130 which contains the later dates of his papers, I only had access to the Box 129 which contains mostly, recommendation letters written by Prof. Tauber from the years 1945 to 1959.

This collection consisted of five folders and most of the papers in the collection are in good condition.

I found the collection in chronological order in the following manner:

In Folder 1, dated 1948-1955 I found quite a number of letters misfiled and some items were not recommendation letters but they had definite connection with library schools and librarianship. Even some of the personal letters were so directly and indirectly connected with the library field that I had to keep them in a separate folder but within this collection.

Here in Folder 1 again, I found a yellow note-book paper which had a grading system Prof. Tauber had drawn to grade his students' performances. It was placed on top of the first folder as to point

out that it was used as a basis for grading the students.

After viewing the collection, I thought it would be easier for the user if I rearrange them annually (separate folder for each year).

After having discussed the matter over with Mr. Bernard Cristal, I went ahead with the following rearrangement.

#### The New Arrangement

First I made a separate folders for the following years: 1945, 1946, 1947, 1948, 1951, 1952, 1953 1954, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1958, 1959, and 1960.

Then the sub-groups of A, B, C, D, dividing the recommendation letters for library positions, teaching positions, research scholarships and applications, misllaneous items and personal letters, positions open and wanted, undated letters.

There are slight variations each year, so I grouped them accordingly.

Within each folder letters are arranged chronologically. However, in some cases it is not possible to be chronological due to the fact that incoming and outgoing letters are attached together for the convenience of the user.

Since the main characters of the recommendation letters are the persons being recommended. I made a personal index in a alphabetical order for the convenience of the user.

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The preface of the Anglo-American Cataloging Rules states that,
"In a very real sense the present work represents the result of thirtyfive years of activity in the codification of cataloging rules for
American and British libraries". The first edition of this work appeared
in 1908. The second edition, A.L.A. Catalog Rules, which systematized
the practices which had become established (particularly at the Library
of Congress) appeared in 1941. This edition was strongly criticized for
excessive detail and complexity. Rules for author and title entry were
issued in 1949. The Library of Congress prepared rules for descriptive
cataloging which would be easier to apply. These rules were then adopted
by the American Library Association and were also published in 1949.
The success of the simplified rules led to a demand for equal simplification of rules for author and title entry. This demand, along with years
of dedicated work, resulted in the third edition of Anglo-American Cataloging Rules.

This box contains materials concerned with the final years (1960-1965) of the Anglo-American catalog code revision. Here, one finds several drafts of Chapters I and III of the Anglo-American Cataloging Rules. Also included are letters concerning Columbia University's participation in "ARL Test Comparison of ALA and CCR Catalog Rules". Special studies such as: "New York Headings", "Liturgical Works", "Sacred Scriptures, Bible", and "Uniform Headings" are also included.

The first folders in this box are concerned with Columbia University's participation in "ARL Test Comparison of ALA and CCR Catalog Rules".

Since much of this material is correspondence, the folders' contents are arranged chronologically. Also, preliminary studies performed by the

Library of Congress (which cannot be classified under particular chapters) are arranged chronologically. Materials which were produced in the years 1963-1965 can be classified under particular chapters of the third edition. Thus, the folders are arranged by chapter number.

The first folder in this box deals with correspondence between Richard H. Logsdon of Columbia University and Wyllis E. Wright. It also includes a draft of "ARL Test Comparison of ALA and CCR Catalog Rules".

The second folder contains studies performed by the Library of Congress. These studies concern several aspects of the code revision. They are arranged chronologically.

Folder number three contains correspondence between C. Donald Cook and Columbia University librarians concerning "Sample Entries Made According to <u>ALA Cataloging Rules</u> and the Draft <u>Code of Cataloging Rules</u> (1960)".

The responses of the librarians contain many suggestions which are incorporated into the final draft of the work.

Folder number four contains material relating to Columbia University's participation in "ARL Test Comparison of ALA and CCR Cataloging Rules".

Included here are several catalog cards which display differences between the ALA and CCR rules.

Folders six through eight contain materials related to individual chapters of the final work. These folders describe activities which took place in the years 1963-1965. (See enclosed table.)

Also included in this box are reports of meetings of the Steering Committee (January 22-24, 1965; November 13-14, 1965) and changes for various chapters. Two bound drafts are also included. Both of these drafts were completed in 1965.

Although this box contains only a fraction of the material which

preceded the third edition of <u>Anglo-American Cataloging Rules</u>, it introduces the reader to the main concerns as well as the complexities involved in the revision of the code revision. It also provides the flavor of the decision-making process involved in the revision.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

The American National Standards Institute is a not-for-profit private organization which exists for the purpose of developing national standards for the United States, covering a broad range of topics in the areas of technology, engineering, manufacturing, data processing and many others. There are dozens of committees engaged in this important work, with volunteer members serving for the purpose of creating and/or revising standards in a multitude of specific areas of interest. One of the committees of AMSI is devoted to standards in the area of librarianship, information science and publishing. Under ANSI's code system it is known as the Z 39 committee.

The Z39 committee, for many years now under the chairmanship of Dr. Jerrold Orne, has over a score of subcommittees, each working to develop a particular standard. One such subcommittee, now known as SC 4, is concerned with a standard for bibliographic references. The aim is to produce a standard for the creation of adequate, clear citations to books, journals, maps, sound recordings, etc.

This subcommittee has had four chairmen in its attempt to develop a national standard. The first- in the early 1960's-being Henry Dubester. The second one was Maurice Tauber, whose tenure was from 1966 to 1970. The third chairman was Ben Weil, who organized a new committee in April 1971 but had to resign in March 1972 due to the press of business. The fourth chairman, taking over in March 1972, is the writer of this paper. He was a member of the committee under both Tauber and Weil.

This paper is a description of the papers which the writer

accumulated while serving as a committee member and also as its chairman. During that period the committees produced several drafts of proposed standards, some of which were distributed to Z39 committee members either for comments or for the voting required before a proposed draft can be considered by AMSI headquarters. In addition the committees accumulated other standards to consider, many items of correspondence were produced, minutes of meetings were prepared, and comments of many interested people were received.

The effort to produce a national standard has been long and costly compared to the expenses of producing standards on smaller, more manageable topics. At the time of this paper the proposed draft of the standard has been approved by all but one of the voting members of the Z39 committee and is about to be submitted to ANSI for a final decision. Whatever the outcome, it is felt likely that the records of the committee entrusted with this task comtain information of lasting interest to librarians and all others commerned with the standardization of bibliographic references. Therefore the project of organizing and analyzing the two drawers of material which had accumulated in the chairman's files seemed a worthy project to do in the course on archival management.

#### II. DESCRIPTION OF THE MATERIAL

The committee files consisted of two drawers in a vertical files. There was little organization outside of a few folders, so the first task was to organize the material. Some materials, such as the various draft versions, were obvious to arrange.

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These were filed in sequence order. The voting records and/or comments for the various drafts were arranged in a separate folder for each draft, with items arranged alphabetically by the place of business of the writers involved. A separate index of the names of the more prominent people who sent in votes or comments is provided at the end of the paper.

In view of the different time periods and committee members involved, material from the Tauber committee have been separated in folders from the material from the Weil-Mount committee.

One of the developments in the past year or so was the need to produce an abridged version of the full standard, so material along that line was segregated whenever possible from items concerning the full standard.

#### ADDENDUM

Aug. 27, 1979

Since the above pages were written over three years have transpired. The standard has been published and an article which serves as an abridged version has also been published. Certain other bits of committee business have transpired, including dissolution of the committee upon the completion of its tasks. Accordingly several folders were expanded to include the new material, and several new folders were added. Box 1 has been expanded to Box 2.
