## PREFACE.

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THE word Domesday, or Doomsday, (in Anglo-Saxon *domes-dæg*.) means literally the day on which the king, or other judge in his place, sat to hear trials and give judgment. Criminal causes were, in general, easily decided, but civil actions presented greater obscurity, from the variety of tenures of property, and the difficulty of arriving at a correct knowledge of the facts connected with them. It thus became necessary to form some general and authentic body of the information which the Court required; and the Domesday-Book was a register of such facts upon the authority of which judgment was to be given on those questions then of paramount importance, the value, tenures, and services of land. It is the record of a census made under the influence and in the interests of feudalism.

Among all people, at a certain period of their advance in social progress, some such general inquisition was found necessary for the establishment of social order. Such was the *census* among the Romans, which was first carried into practise under the reign of Servius Tullius, in the year of Rome 187. It was no doubt partly also for civil purposes that the Jews were from time to time "numbered," as recorded in the Scriptures. This "numbering" appears to have been often considered and felt by the people as an act of tyranny, and David incurred God's anger on one occasion by wilfully subjecting the people of Israel to a new census. (2 Sam. xxiv. and 1 Chron. xxi.) Our forefathers in the time of William the Norman appear to have looked upon the census ordered by that king with much the same feelings. The writer of the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle, under the year 1085, records with unmistakable sentiments of grief that in that year, "the king had a great council, and very deep speech with his witan (or counsellors) about this land, how it was peopled, or by what men; then he sent his men over all England, into every shire, and caused to be ascertained how many hundred hides were in the shire, or what land the king himself had, and cattle within the land, or what dues he ought to have, in twelve months, from the shire. Also he caused to be written how much land his archbishops had, and his suffragan bishops, and his abbots, and his earls; and—though I may narrate somewhat prolixly—what or how much each man had who was a holder of land in England, in land, or in cattle, and how much money it might be worth. So very narrowly he caused it to be traced out, that there was not one single hide, nor one virgate of land, nor even—it is shame to tell, though it seemed to him no shame to do—an ox, nor a cow, nor a swine, was left, that was not set down in this writ. And all the writings were brought to him afterwards." These writings, abridged and condensed into one body, formed that invaluable record we call the Domesday-Book, which was completed in the year following. It may be remarked that there are circumstances in the text of the Domesday-Book as we now have it, which seem to imply the existence of surveys of a similar character made in Anglo-Saxon times, at all events under Edward the Confessor, which furnished some of the information contained in the later record.

The object of the Domesday-Book was, as intimated above, to furnish in the king's court an authentic record of facts for reference, on the conflicting claims which arose continually out of the feudal tenures, especially at a period so soon after the redistribution of lands which followed the Norman Conquest. The manner in which the king's design was carried into effect was as follows:—Commissioners, under the title

of the king's justiciaries, were sent into each county, with full power to call before them the sheriffs, the lords of manors, the presbyters of churches, the reeves of hundreds, and the bailiffs, and six villans of each village, and to put them upon their oaths. They were examined as to the extent of the several manors, their hidage, their possessors at the time of the survey, and in the reign of Edward the Confessor, the proportion of arable land and pasture, the number of the various classes of tenants and dependents, whether free or servile, with circumstances of a more exceptional character, such as churches, mills, fish-ponds, woods, and haies, or enclosures for entrapping wild animals, and the rental of each manor, not only at the time of the survey, but also in the time of Edward the Confessor, and in most cases at an intermediate period. Other circumstances are sometimes noted, and especially the condition in which the manor had been left by war, invasion, or neglect, and its capability of increased productiveness and value. An examination of the document itself leaves no doubt in our minds that the inquisition was conducted with great care and impartiality; yet there are reasons which exposed the compilers of the reports to several classes of errors. The commissioners and their clerks or secretaries were no doubt Normans, and they had to deal with a population which was still almost entirely Anglo-Saxon. Thus, taking down Anglo-Saxon names of places by the sound, the Norman scribes were liable to fall into frequent blunders. The jurors themselves, selected from the whole hundred, were sometimes imperfectly acquainted with some of the facts on which they were examined, and gave information which was erroneous. However, such inaccuracies are far less numerous than might be expected, and the slightest study of the Domesday-Book is sufficient to convince us of the marvellous care with which the survey was made and reduced into its present form. Our county historian, Mr. Eyton, has truly characterized this invaluable document as "the greatest territorial record which royal wisdom ever planned, official zeal ever executed, or clerkly skill ever engrossed."\*

The records of the proceedings of the commissioners in the various counties were returned into the king's court at Winchester at the Easter of the year 1086. From these, what is called Domesday-Book was compiled. In the course of compilation, the original documents were no doubt much abridged, and we have reasons for believing that these original returns contained a large quantity of information which, considered of minor utility at that time, was omitted altogether. There are two portions belonging to the Domesday survey, known as the Book of Exeter and the Book of Ely, which exist in a less abridged form, and contain many more details than the existing surveys of the other counties. It might be naturally supposed that facts obtained under the circumstances described above, by different sets of commissioners in different counties, and from classes of people differing probably in their conditions and notions, must have been far from uniform, and this want of uniformity may also be traced in the different parts of our great national record.

Domesday-Book is the great record which forms as it were the source of our manorial history, and to which the historian of modern families seeks to trace as near as possible the succession of land-holders. Beyond it he comes upon a sort of chasm, which separates him from an earlier part, for Domesday-Book presents these lands to us as snatched from their former holders, and placed in the grasp of an entirely new aristocracy. But besides this, it throws, when carefully studied, great light on the condition of our country, immediately before and immediately after the Norman Conquest. In it we can compare the relative power and influence of the Saxon with those of the Norman aristocracy, and we can understand the exact position of the latter individually towards each other. We can form a tolerably exact notion of the extent to which the land was cultivated, and of its productiveness, as well as the effect which war and revolution, as well as

the feeling of insecurity which accompanied these, had had upon it. Thus, the numerous manors which in our county are reported as waste, especially as we approach the borders, speak unmistakably of the continual inroads of Welsh plunderers to which it had been constantly exposed since the reign of Edward the Confessor. We trace here and there similar waste inland which speaks, though less clearly, of private feuds or of local insurrections against the oppressions of the new masters. We can see how in many cases one great noble husbanded his estates better than another, who, therefore, neglected or wasted his territorial resources. Thus the lands of Osbern fitz Richard, whose father was the builder of Richard's Castle, are many of them set down as entirely wasted, and he no doubt had been engaged in constant hostility with the Welsh. It was this insecurity, probably, which made the old Roman road from Shrewsbury to Hereford so insecure, that people who travelled in that direction were obliged to turn off into a new road through Ludlow. On the other hand, Ralph de Mortimer appears to have been a good husband of his lands, which are almost all improved in value. Lastly, we can contemplate in Domesday-Book the population of England, its approximate numbers, and the classes into which it was divided, at a period when feudalism existed at its highest degree of perfection.

It is wonderful how generally the boundaries of manors, as given in Domesday-Book, have remained unchanged down to the present time. The case, however, is different with the hundreds which have undergone great changes, and many of the Domesday hundreds have disappeared altogether. Even the boundary lines of counties have changed considerably since that time, and in no county more than in Shropshire. This was the case especially on the western side, where the line of boundary was carried to some distance into Wales, including earl Roger's new castle of Montgomery, because no doubt the extent of the county was then considered as identical with that of Roger Montgomery's Earldom of Shrewsbury. Shropshire also, in the Domesday survey, extended towards the south-east into Radnorshire and Herefordshire. On the other hand, as we proceed eastward along the southern line of boundary, Herefordshire inroached upon Shropshire, under circumstances which caused one of the most important towns in the latter county to be apparently omitted altogether in that record, and led our older local historians to imagine that the town did not then exist. We owe the detection of this error, and the explanation of its causes, to our excellent and laborious county historian, the Rev. R. W. Eyton. It is true that we find no place in the Domesday survey of Shropshire which can be made to answer to Ludlow, in name, or in any other circumstances; but if we look into that record for Herefordshire, we shall find Osbern fitz Richard, of Richard's Castle, holding a manor called Lude, which evidently extended into the present county of Shropshire, if it were not entirely included in it, and which appears as adjoining to Ludford. It evidently approached Roger de Lacy's manor of Stanton Lacy, and moreover Roger de Lacy himself held it as tenant under Osbern fitz Richard. Mr. Eyton has shewn,\* I think conclusively, that this manor of Lude was Ludlow. Very soon after the date of Domesday-Book, Roger de Lacy obtained the lordship of this manor, either by purchase or by force, and Osbern fitz Richard's name is never afterwards mentioned in connection with it. It can hardly be doubted that it was Roger de Lacy, and not Roger de Montgomery, who built Ludlow Castle. Under these circumstances, I have thought it right to append to the text and translation of the Domesday-Book for Shropshire, the two entries from Herefordshire relating to Ludlow and Ludford.

The original text, beautifully reproduced, as it has been, in facsimile, by the process employed by Sir Henry James, is quite unreadable to the greater number of persons who would gladly make themselves acquainted with the contents of Domesday-Book. In addition to the repulsive character of mediæval law-Latin, the original text is made up of abbreviated words, many of which were probably conventional with the scribe

who wrote it, and which, with a very few exceptions, would not be read easily, even by those who would willingly study this remarkable document in its original Latin. We have, therefore, given here the portion of Domesday-Book relating to Shropshire, in two forms—first, the original text *in extenso*, relieved from all its repulsive abbreviations, and, secondly, a literal translation into English, thus placing it within the reach of all who may have any reason for consulting it. As just stated, the contractions appear to have been, in many cases, conventional forms adopted by the official clerks at that time, and it is sometimes rather doubtful what grammatical forms they were intended to represent. In such cases I need hardly say that I have replaced the contraction by the form which seemed most probably to be the one intended; but in no case does the doubt thus involved affect in the slightest degree the meaning of the original.

### I. TERRA EPISCOPI DE CESTRE.

## TRANSLATION.

# SHROPSHIRE.

In the city of Shrewsbury, in the time of king Edward, there were two hundred and fifty-two houses, and the same number of burgesses in these houses, rendering yearly seven pounds and sixteen shillings and eightpence of gable. There king Edward had these underwritten customs.

If any one knowingly broke the king's peace given by his own hand, he was made an outlaw. And he who broke the king's peace given by the sheriff, paid a fine of a hundred shillings, and he paid the same amount who committed forestal or beinfare. King Edward had these three forfeitures in demesne throughout all England over and above the farms.

When the king lay in this city, twelve men of the best of the city served him as guards. And when he went to exercise hunting there, similarly the best burgesses of the city having horses served as his armed guard. But the sheriff sent thirty-six footmen as long as the king was there. And as his body guard at the park of Marstley he furnished thirty-six men by custom for eight days.

When the sheriff willed to go into Wales, every one who at his summons did not go, paid a fine of forty shillings.

A woman receiving a husband in whatever manner, if she were a widow, gave the king twenty shillings. If a maid, ten shillings, in whatever manner she received a husband.

If the house of any burgess were burnt, by any accident or event, or by negligence, he gave forty shillings to the king for a fine, and to his two next neighbours two shillings each.

When a burgess who was in the king's demesne died, the king had ten shillings of relief.

If any burgess broke the term which the sheriff imposed upon him, he paid a fine of ten shillings. Whoever shed blood, paid a fine of forty shillings.

When the king departed from the city, the sheriff sent him twenty-four horses from Leintwardine, and the king took them with him as far as the first resting place in Staffordshire.

The king had three moneyers there, who, after they had bought the dies of money like other moneyers of the country, gave on the fifteenth day to the king each twenty shillings; and this was done on a change of coinage.

On the whole this city rendered to the king annually thirty pounds. The king had two parts of it, and the sheriff the third part.

In the year preceding this description, it rendered forty pounds to the earl Roger.

In the time of king Edward this city paid geld for a hundred hides.

Of these St. Almund had two hides, St. Julian half a hide, St. Milburge one hide, St. Chad a hide and a half, St. Mary one virgate, the bishop of Chester one hide, Edith three hides, which Ralf de Mortemer has.

The English burgesses of Shrewsbury say that it is a great grievance to them that they pay all the geld which they paid in the time of king Edward, although the earl's castle occupies the place of fifty-one houses, and the space of fifty other houses is waste, and forty-three French burgesses hold houses which paid geld in the time of king Edward, and to the abbey which the earl is building there he gives thirty-nine burgesses who formerly paid geld like the others. In the whole there are two hundred houses, less seven, which do not pay geld.

### THE LAND OF THE BISHOP OF CHESTER.

The bishop of Chester had in Shrewsbury sixteen houses, and as many burgesses paying geld with the other burgesses. Now ten of these houses are waste, and the other six render four shillings and sevenpence.

The same bishop had in this city sixteen canons. They did not pay geld, nor is it known how much they rendered to the bishop.

### IN THE HUNDRED OF THE CITY.

The same bishop has a manor at Melam (Meole Brace). He neither is nor was lodged there. It paid twenty shillings in the time of king Edward; now seventeen shillings and fourpence.

### IN THE SAME HUNDRED.

The same bishop holds Saltone (Shelton), and the church of St. Chad holds it of him. There is there a hide and a half. There is in demesne half an ox-team, and there might be two teams more. There are four villans, who have an ox-team and a half. It was and is worth twelve shillings. This land pays geld.

### IN RECORDINE HUNDRED.

The same bishop holds Languenare (Longnor); and Wigot holds it of him. There is there one hide. The land is of two ox-teams. In demesne there is one ox-team, and two serfs, and two villans, who have one ox-team. It was and is worth eight shillings.

### IN CONDOVER HUNDRED.

The same bishop holds Betune (Bitton), and held it in the time of king Edward. There are there two hides paying geld. In demesne there is one ox-team and a half, and four villans with two ox-teams and a half. There are three serfs. It was worth fifteen shillings; now sixteen shillings.

The same bishop holds Buildwas, and held it in the time of king Edward. There is there one hide paying geld. In demesne are two ox-teams; and three villans, with a provost, have three ox-teams. There are there five serfs, and a mill, and a wood of two hundred pigs. In the time of king Edward it was worth forty-five shillings, and afterwards forty shillings; now forty-five shillings.

### IN HODNET HUNDRED.

The same bishop holds Prees, and held it in the time of king Edward. There are there eight hides paying geld. In demesne are three ox-teams, and ten villans and a priest, and three bordarii, with five ox-teams. There are six neatherds, and a wood of sixty swine. Of this manor Anschitil holds of the bishop half a hide, and Fulcher two hides. In demesne they have two ox-teams, and two villans with one ox-team, and three other men ploughing there render ten shillings, and two neatherds are there. The whole in the time of king Edward was worth fifty shillings, and afterwards it was waste. Now what the bishop has is worth forty shillings. What his men hold is worth twenty-eight shillings. There might be six ox-teams more there.

### IN RECORDINE HUNDRED.

The same bishop holds Cesdille (Chesthill), and held it. There is there one hide and one virgate of land. It is land of two ox-teams. It was worth eight shillings; now it is waste.

## II. THE LAND OF THE BISHOP OF HEREFORD.

### IN DERINLOW HUNDRED.

The bishop of Hereford holds of the king Lidberie (Lydbury North), and held it in the time of king Edward. There are fifty-three hides which pay geld. In demesne are four ox-teams, and thirty-eight villans, and four bordarii, and eight radmans, with twenty-eight bordarii. Among them all they have twenty-three ox-teams. There are two serfs, and a mill serving the hall. A wood of a hundred and sixty fattening swine. A certain Frenchman and William the clerk hold one member of this manor and the church of the same manor, with priests and land there pertaining, and there is one ox-team. In this manor there might be four score and twelve ox-teams more than there are. In the time of king Edward it was worth thirty-five pounds, and afterwards ten pounds; now twelve pounds. Of this land thirty-two hides and a half are waste.

### IN CULVESTAN HUNDRED.

The same bishop held in the time of king Edward Aneberie (Onibury), and now Roger de Lacy holds it of him. There are there three hides which pay geld. In demesne there is one ox-team, and four villans in gross, and six half villans, and a priest, and a cozet, with three ox-teams. There is one serf. There one knight holds one hide, and has one ox-team and five villans. In the time of king Edward there were in this manor nine ox-teams, and it was worth forty shillings; now twenty shillings.

### III THE LAND OF ST. REMIGIUS.

#### IN OVERS HUNDRED.

The church of St. Remigius held and holds of the king one manor of one hide, and there were and are there two ox-teams. It was and is worth ten shillings and eightpence.

In Shrewsbury city Roger the earl is making an abbey, and he has given to the same the monastery of St. Peter, where was the parish of the city, and as much of his burgesses and mills as renders twelve pounds to the monks.

#### IN RECORDINE HUNDRED.

The same church holds Eyton. Leofric the earl held it in the time of king Edward. There are there eight hides and a half. In demesne are four ox-teams, and there might still be two more there.

There are sixteen villans, and fourteen bordarii, with sixteen ox-teams. There are eight serfs, and four women serfs, and two fisheries. One renders sixteen shillings, the other is for the provision of the monks. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty-one pounds, and, when the earl gave it to the church, it rendered fourteen pounds.

#### IN CONDOVER HUNDRED.

The same church holds Eiminstre (Emstrey). Edwin the earl held it. There are there nine hides paying geld. In demesne are four ox-teams, and twenty-two villans, and five bordarii, and one Frenchman, with twelve ox-teams among them all. There are there twenty serfs, and a wood of forty swine for fattening. In the city, one measure of land of two shillings. In the time of king Edward it was worth a hundred shillings, and afterwards four pounds; now eleven pounds.

The same church holds Burtune (Boretun), and held it in the time of king Edward. There is one hide paying geld. In demesne are one ox-team, and six bordarii with one ox-team, and two neatherds there. It was worth five shillings; now eight shillings.

In this vill Alfric held in the time of king Edward one hide paying geld, and he could go where he would, and this land was worth five shillings. Now St. Peter holds it, and it is waste.

### WHAT THE CHURCH OF ST. MILBURGE HOLDS.

#### IN PATINTON HUNDRED.

Earl Roger has made the church of St. Milburge an abbey. The same church holds Wenlock, and held it in the time of king Edward. There are there twenty hides. Of these four were quit of geld in the time of king Cnut, and the others pay geld. In demesne there are nine ox-teams and a half, and nine villans, and three radmans, and forty-six bordarii. Among all they have seventeen ox-teams, and there might be seventeen more. There are fifteen serfs, and two mills serving the monks. There is one fishery, and a wood of three hundred swine for fattening, and there are two hayes. In the time of king Edward it was worth fifteen pounds; now twelve pounds.

The same church holds Ticheleforde (Ticklerton), and held it in the time of king Edward. There are seven hides which pay geld, and three other hides quit of geld. In demesne there are one ox-team, and six villans, and six bordarii, and one radman, with five ox-teams, and there might be six ox-teams more there. There are three serfs, and a wood of sixty swine for fattening. In the time of king Edward it was worth a hundred shillings; now fifty shillings.

The same church holds Madeley, and held it in the time of king Edward. There is there one hide not paying geld, and three other hides paying geld. In demesne are two ox-teams, and six villans, and four bordarii, with four ox-teams. There are four serfs, and there might be there six ox-teams more. A wood of four hundred swine for fattening. In the time of king Edward it was worth four pounds; now fifty shillings.

The same church holds Wenlock, and held it in the time of king Edward. There are there one hide not paying geld, and two others paying geld. In demesne there is one ox-team, and four villans, and two bordarii, with three ox-teams. There are two neatherds, and a wood of three hundred swine for fattening, in which are two hayes, and a hawk's aerie. In the time of king Edward it was worth seventy shillings; now forty shillings.

The same church holds and held Sciperton (Shipton). There is there half a hide not paying geld, with three other hides paying geld. In demesne there is one ox-team, and five villans, and five ox-teams, and two serfs. It was worth thirty shillings; now fourpence more.

The same church held and holds Petley. There is half a hide not paying geld. In demesne are one ox-team, and three bordarii, with one ox-team and three serfs, and a wood of forty swine for fattening, and there a haia. It was worth eight shillings; now six shillings.

The same church held and holds Burton, and Edric holds of it. Alfric, his father, held it; and could not recede from the church. There are there two hides and three virgates of land paying geld. In the demesne there is half an ox-team, and four villans and four radmans and three bordarii with three ox-teams and a half, and one serf, and a mill serving the court [manor], and a haye. In the time of king Edward it was worth fifty shillings; now forty shillings; and there might be two more ox-teams there.

The same church held Stoke St. Milburg. Earl Roger gave it to his chaplains, but the church ought to have it. There are there twenty hides. Of these, three pay no geld, but the others pay geld. In the demesne there are two ox-teams, and twenty-five villans, and five bordarii with nine ox-teams, and four neatherds; and there might be nineteen more ox-teams there. In the time of king Edward it was worth thirteen pounds; now nine pounds.

### IN ALNODESTREU HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Deuzhill. There is there half a hide paying geld. In the demesne is one ox-team, and two bordarii, and one cottar, with one ox-team, and one serf there. It was worth ten shillings; now twenty shillings.

The same church held and holds Pickthorn. There is there half a hide paying geld. In the demesne is one ox-team, and one villan, and two bordarii, with two ox-teams, and two serfs. It was and is worth seven shillings.

### IN SHREWSBURY HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Sutton. There is one hide. There are eight men between free-men and villans, with four ox-teams. It was worth twelve shillings; now sixteen shillings.

### IN CULVESTAN HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Clee Stanton. There are two hides. There are there one man (tenant), and one ox-team, and there might be six more ox-teams. It was worth eighteen shillings; now six shillings.

### IN CONDOVER HUNDRED.

St. Witburga holds half a hide paying geld, and the son of Alfric holds it of her. There is there one villan, with one ox-team, and another might be there. It is worth three shillings.

### WHAT THE CHURCH OF ST. MARY HOLDS.

#### IN BASCHURCH HUNDRED.

The church of St. Mary held and holds Broughton. There are there five hides paying geld. One priest has there half an ox-team, and there are seven villans with two ox-teams and a half, and there might still be three ox-teams more there. There is a wood of twenty-four swine for fattening. In the time of king Edward it was worth ten shillings; now fifteen shillings.

The same church held and holds Astley. There are there three hides paying geld. There a priest, with nine villans and two bordarii, has three ox-teams, and there might be two ox-teams more. A wood of fifty swine for fattening. It was worth twenty shillings; now twenty-five shillings.

#### IN SHREWSBURY HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds one virgate of land in Meole, the manor of Ralph de Mortemer. It was and is worth four shillings.

#### IN OVERS HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds half a hide. It was waste, and is still.

#### IN BASCHURCH HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Mytton, and Picot of it. There are there two hides paying geld. There are four villans, with two ox-teams. It was worth twelve shillings; it is now at farm for eleven shillings.

The same church holds Bromfield, and there it is built. There are there now ten hides, and in the demesne six ox-teams, and twelve neatherds, and fifteen villans, and twelve bordarii, with eight ox-teams. It is worth fifty shillings to the canons, and Nigellus the physician has from this manor sixteen shillings.

In this manor in the time of king Edward there were twenty hides, and the twelve canons of the said church had it all. One of them, named Spirtes, alone held ten hides. But after he was banished from England, king Edward gave these ten hides to Robert fitz Wimarch, as to a canon. And Robert gave the same land to a certain son-in-law of his. Of which when the canons had informed the king, he forthwith ordered the land to be given back to the church, only giving bail until at the court of Christmas next following the king should take order to provide other land for his son-in-law Robert. But the king himself died at that festival, and from that time to the present the church has lost the land. Robert now holds it of earl Roger, and it is waste and was found waste. In the whole the land is of fifty-four ox-teams.

The church of St. Chad holds and held Etone, and Turolf of it. There is there half a hide paying geld. It rendered eight shillings; now four shillings.

#### IN WITENTREE HUNDRED.

The same church holds Marton, and held it. Elward holds it of the church. There are there two hides paying geld. In the demesne there is half an ox-team, and three villans and three radmans and one bordarius with three ox-teams and a half, and there might still be two ox-teams more. A wood of fifty swine for fattening. In the time of king Edward it rendered eight shillings; now it is worth ten shillings, but renders no more than six shillings.

#### IN BASCHURCH HUNDRED.

The same church held Bicton. Wigerus holds of it. There are there two hides paying geld. In the demesne there is one ox-team, and four villans, and one free man with two ox-teams, and there might be two others. It was worth ten shillings; now fifteen shillings.

The same church held and holds Yorton. There are two hides paying geld. It is land of four ox-teams. There is a priest and one villan with one ox-team. It was worth eight shillings; now five shillings.

The same church held and holds Broughton. There are two hides paying geld. It is land of five ox-teams. There three villans have two ox-teams. It was worth ten shillings; now eleven shillings and two-pence.

The same church held and holds Rosshal. There is one hide paying geld. Two radmans with seven bordarii have three ox-teams and a half. It was worth eight shillings; now fifteen shillings.

The same church held and holds Onslow. There is one hide paying geld. It was waste. There three villans have one ox-team. It is worth four shillings.

### WHEAT ST. ALCMUND HOLDS.

The church of St. Alcmund holds in Shrewsbury twenty-one burgesses, besides twelve houses of canons. These burgesses pay a rent of eight shillings and eightpence.

The same church has two hides of the hundred hides which are reckoned in the geld of the city. Two canons hold these, and have there one ox-team and a half, and four villans having two ox-teams and a half. It is worth fifteen shillings.

#### IN RECORDINE HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Lilleshall. There are ten hides. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and ten villans, and five bordarii, and three French servants, with eight ox-teams among them all, and there might be nine ox-teams more. There are four neatherds, and a mill, but its rent is nothing. One league of wood. In the time of king Edward it was worth six pounds; now four pounds. Godebold the priest holds it.

The same church held and holds Logdon. There are two hides. In the demesne there is one ox-team, and four bordarii with one ox-team, and there might be three more ox-teams. There are six between serfs and maid-serfs, and a mill of five shillings. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty-one shillings; now nine shillings and fourpence.

The same church held and holds *Uckington*, and Godebold of it. There are four hides paying geld. In the demesne are three ox-teams, and two radmans, and three bordarii with one ox-team, and there might be three ox-teams more. There are six neatherds. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty-four shillings; now thirty shillings.

The same church held and holds *Attingham* (*Atcham*), and Godebold of it. There is one hide. In the demesne is one ox-team and a half, and two villans and three bordarii with three ox-teams. It was worth ten shillings; now its rent is six shillings and eightpence.

The same church held and holds Albright-Lea. There is one hide. In the demesne is one ox-team, and two villans and one bordarius with one ox-team. There is one league of wood, but earl Roger has taken it from the church. It was and is worth twelve shillings.

### IN COLVESTAN HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Cerletone. There is one hide. One radman was and is there. Its rent was four shillings; now five shillings.

### IN RUESSET HUNDRED.

The same church held and holds Preston (Mountford). There is one hide paying geld. In the demesne is one ox-team, and two villans with one ox-team. It was worth eight shillings; now five shillings. Elward holds it.

The same church held and holds Dinthill. There is one hide paying geld. In the demesne is one ox-team, and one villan and one bordarius with half an ox-team. It was and is worth eight shillings.

### WHAT ST. JULIANA HOLDS.

The church of St. Juliana holds half a hide, and has there one ox-team, and two burgesses cultivating in this land pay a rent of three shillings. It was and is worth eight shillings.

## IV. THE LAND OF EARL ROGER.

### IN WROCKWARDINE HUNDRED.

Roger the earl holds Wrockwardine. King Edward held it. To this manor belong seven berewicks and a half. There are five hides paying geld. In the demesne are four ox-teams, and thirteen villans, and four bordarii and a priest and a radman have among them all twelve ox-teams. There are eight neatherds, and a mill of twelve shillings. A wood one league long, and half a league wide.

The church of St. Peter holds the church of this manor with one hide, and has there one ox-team, and there might be another. It is worth five shillings.

To this manor belonged in the time of king Edward two pennies from the hundred of Wrockwardine. The earl had the third penny.

In the time of king Edward it paid rent six pounds and thirteen shillings and eightpence; now it pays rent twelve pounds and ten shillings of farra.

### IN CONDOVER HUNDRED.

The earl himself holds Condover. King Edward held it. To this manor belong ten berewicks. There are there thirteen hides paying geld. In the demesne are seven hides, and there are four ox-teams, and twelve villans and a priest with seven ox-teams, and there might be there three ox-teams more. There are eight neatherds, and a mill of eight shillings and sixpence.

To this manor pertained two pennies of the hundred of Condover in the time of king Edward. It paid rent ten pounds; now it pays rent with the hundred ten pounds.

Of the land of this manor Roger the hunter (Venator) holds one hide, Osbern one hide, Elward four hides. There is one ox-team, and four villans and two bordarii and three radmans and two neatherds have among them all three ox-teams, and there might be eight ox-teams more. The whole is worth forty-one shillings.

### IN BASCHURCH HUNDRED.

The earl himself holds Baschurch. King Edward held it. There are three hides and a half. Of these one is in the demesne, and there are four ox-teams, and six villans and two bordarii with two ox-teams. There are eight neatherds, and three fisheries of twenty-two pence. To this manor belonged two pennies of the hundred itself. On the whole it paid a rent of seven pounds; now it is worth six pounds; the demesne is the earl's.

Of this manor the church of St. Peter holds of the earl two hides and a half and the church of the vill. The land is of five ox-teams, and they are there with thirteen bordarii. It is worth twenty-six shillings and eightpence.

The earl himself holds Hodnet. King Edward held it. There is a hide and a half. In the demesne are three ox-teams, and twelve villans and two bordarii and a priest and a provost with seven ox-teams, and there might be there nine ox-teams more. There is a small wood paying no rent.

The church of St. Peter holds the church of this manor.

In the time of king Edward this manor paid rent three pounds and six shillings and eightpence; now it pays rent eight pounds with the hundred which pertains to the manor.

The earl himself holds Membrefelde (Morville) with eighteen berewicks. King Edward held it. There are twelve hides. One of these berewicks, Calvestone (Cold Weston), of one hide, is in Worcestershire.

Of this land, four hides are in demesne, and there are two ox-teams, and there might be six other ox-teams. There are nine villans and six bordarii with three ox-teams, and there might be two others in addition. There are four neatherds.

To this manor pertains the whole of Alnocestreu hundred. Two pennies belonged to king Edward, and the third to the earl. On the whole it paid rent ten pounds; now what the earl has is worth three pounds.

The church of this manor is in the honor of St. Gregory, which in the time of king Edward had of this land eight hides, and there eight canons served.

The church of St. Peter holds of the earl this church, with five hides of land. In the demeane there are two ox-teams, and there might be four others. There are nine villans and one bordarius and three priests with nine ox-teams, and four neatherds, and one knight holding one hide, paying rent four shillings to the monks. All this is worth sixty-seven shillings.

The earl's chaplains held the three remaining hides, and five men of them. The land is of six ox-teams. There are two ox-teams. The whole is worth sixty shillings and eighteen pence.

Of the land itself of this manor Richard the butler holds two hides; and has there one ox-team and two serfs, and seven villans with one ox-team, and a mill paying rent two horse-loads of corn. There might be nine ox-teams more. It is worth twenty shillings.

The earl himself holds Corfham. King Edward held it, with four berewicks. There are four hides paying geld. In the demeane are five ox-teams, and there might be a sixth. There three villans and three bordarii have three ox-teams, and there might be two ox-teams more. There are ten neatherds.

Of this land a knight of the earl's holds half a hide, and has there one ox-team, and two serfs and two villans with one ox-team. It is worth five shillings.

The church of St. Peter holds the church of this manor with one hide. The land is of three ox-teams. It pays rent eighteen shillings to the monks.

To this manor belongs the whole of Comestano hundred and Patinton hundred. In the time of king Edward, with two pennies from the hundred, it paid rent ten pounds of farm. Now with the hundred it pays rent six pounds to the earl.

The earl himself holds Minsterley, and Roger of him. King Edward held it. There are six hides paying geld. In the demeane are two ox-teams, and there might be two others. There are there eight villans and four bordarii with eight ox-teams. There are there four neatherds. Of wood two leagues. In the time of king Edward it was worth sixty shillings; now five shillings more.

The earl himself holds Alreton (Caus), and Roger of him. King Edward held it. There are twenty hides paying geld. The land is of forty ox-teams. It was waste except two hides. In the demeane there is one ox-team, and five villans with one freeman have three ox-teams, and certain Welshmen cultivating there pay a rent of sixteen shillings. There are two leagues of wood. There is waste land there enough for thirty-one ox-teams.

In this manor five of Roger's knights have six ox-teams and a half in demeane, and two villans and six bordarii and two Welshmen and one radman with three bordarii and six neatherds have among them all three ox-teams. In the time of king Edward it paid a rent of eight shillings; now on the whole four pounds.

The earl himself holds Alberbury, and Roger of him. King Edward held it. There is one hide. In the demeane there is one ox-team, and eight bordarii with two ox-teams, and two neatherds are there. To this manor belongs Reweset hundred. In the time of king Edward it was worth five shillings; now twenty shillings.

The earl himself holds Chirbury. King Edward held it. In the demeane are four ox-teams, and thirteen villans with a provost have five ox-teams. There are eight neatherds. There are two churches with a priest, who has one ox-team. To this manor belongs Witcreu hundred. In the time of king Edward it was waste; now it is worth forty shillings.

The earl himself holds Maesbury with five berewicks, and Rainald holds it of him. King Edward held it. There are seven hides paying geld, and there Rainald made the castle called Luvre. In demeane it has two ox-teams, and ten Welshmen with a priest having eight ox-teams, and there might be six ox-teams more. There is a church. There are four neatherds. There is a small wood paying no rent. Of this land Robert holds half a hide, and Hengebald two hides, and they have two ox-teams. To this manor belongs Mersete hundred. In the time of king Edward it was waste; now it is worth forty shillings.

The earl himself holds Whittington, with eight berewicks and a half. King Edward held it. There are eighteen hides paying geld. The land is of twenty-five ox-teams. In the demeane are six ox-teams, and fifteen villans and six bordarii with twelve ox-teams. There are twelve neatherds, and certain Welshmen pay a rent of twenty shillings, and there is a mill there of five shillings. Of wood one league. In the time of king Edward it was waste; now it pays a rent of fifteen pounds and fifteen shillings.

In the time of Ethelred, the father of king Edward, these three manors paid half a night's farm.

A certain Welshman named Tudor holds of the earl one *fine* of Welsh land, and pays rent for it four pounds and five shillings.

The earl himself holds Lydham. Edric the Wild (Sylvaticus) held it in the time of king Edward. There are there fifteen hides paying geld. In the demeane are four ox-teams, and fourteen villans with a provost and a priest and six bordarii have ten ox-teams, and there might be there sixteen ox-teams more. There are six radmans, and a mill paying rent one pig. Of wood two leagues. In the time of king Edward it was worth ten pounds; now fourteen pounds.

The earl himself holds Nessham (*Great Ness*). Morcar the earl held it with four berewicks. There are five hides. In the demesne are five ox-teams, and ten neatherds, and fifteen villans and five bordarii with six ox-teams, and there might be three ox-teams more. There six Welshmen pay rent twenty shillings; of wood one league. The church of St. Peter holds the church of this manor with one virgate of land. One Robert has four villans who pay rent five shillings. In the time of king Edward it paid rent three pounds; now thirteen pounds and ten shillings.

The earl himself holds Loppington. Edric the Wild held it. There are five hides paying geld. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and four serfs, and fifteen villans with six ox-teams, and there might be two ox-teams more. In the time of king Edward it was worth three pounds; now six pounds and ten shillings.

The earl himself holds Ellesmere. Edwin the earl held it. There are there four hides and a half. In the demesne are five ox-teams, and ten neatherds, with thirty-six villans and fourteen bordarii with two priests having fourteen ox-teams. There is a mill. In the time of king Edward it paid rent ten pounds of farm; now twenty pounds.

Of the same manor Mundret holds one hide, and Rainald one hide. They have there two ox-teams, and four serfs, and four villans and seven bordarii with three ox-teams and a half. It is worth twenty-three shillings.

The earl himself holds [Great] Berwick. Edric the Wild held it. There is one hide and a half. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and four serfs, and one maid-serf, and eleven villans with five ox-teams. In the time of king Edward it was worth thirty shillings; now nine pounds.

The earl himself holds Archelou (*High Ercall*). Edwin the earl held it with five berewicks. There are seven hides. In the demesne are six ox-teams, and twelve neatherds. There twenty-nine villans and twelve bordarii have fifteen ox-teams. There two mills pay rent twelve measures of corn, and there is a fishery of a thousand and five hundred and two great eels. Of wood one league. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty pounds; now the same sum.

By custom, when the countess came into the manor, there were brought to her eighteen ores of pence.

The earl himself holds Wellington. Edwin the earl held it, with five berewicks. There are fourteen hides paying geld. In the demesne are six ox-teams, and twelve neatherds, and twelve villans and eight bordarii with a priest have nine ox-teams, and there might be nine ox-teams more. There is a mill of twelve shillings, and two fisheries of eight shillings. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty pounds; now eighteen pounds.

Of the land of this manor, William holds of the earl one hide, Dawley. Grim held it before. There is one ox-team, and seven villans have one ox-team. It was worth thirty shillings; now ten shillings.

The earl himself holds Edgmond. Leofwin the Child held it, with six berewicks. There are fourteen hides paying geld. In the demesne are six ox-teams, and twelve neatherds, and one maid-serf, and thirty-three villans and eight bordarii with two Frenchmen have eleven ox-teams. There a mill with a fishery pays rent ten shillings; and there might be there eleven ox-teams more. In the time of king Edward it paid rent fourteen pounds; now fifteen pounds.

The earl himself holds Tong. Morcar the earl held it. There are three hides paying geld. In the demesne are four ox-teams, and eight serfs, and three villans and two bordarii with three ox-teams. There is of wood one league. In the time of king Edward it was worth eleven pounds; now six pounds.

The earl himself holds Donnington. Edwin the earl held it. There are there three hides. In the demesne are four ox-teams, and eight neatherds, and two maid-serfs, and twelve villans and two bordarii with three ox-teams, and there might be there seven ox-teams more. There is a mill there paying rent five measures of corn, and a wood one league long and half a league broad. In Wich five salt-pits pay rent twenty shillings. In the time of king Edward it paid rent twenty pounds; now nine pounds.

The earl himself holds Ditton [Priors.] Edwin the earl held it with four berewicks. There are twelve hides paying geld. In the demesne are five ox-teams, and ten serfs, and twenty villans and eight bordarii with six ox-teams, and there might be there thirteen other ox-teams. In Wich one salt-pit pays rent two shillings. In the time of king Edward it paid rent ten pounds; now eleven pounds.

The earl himself holds [Church] Streiton. Edwin the earl held it with four berewicks. There are there eight hides. In the demesne are three ox-teams, and six serfs, and two maid-serfs, and eighteen villans and eight bordarii with a priest having twelve ox-teams. There are a mill and a church, and in the wood five haize, and there may be six ox-teams more. In the time of king Edward it was worth thirteen pounds; now a hundred shillings.

In the demesne are two ox-teams, and four serfs, and twelve villans with three ox-teams, and there might be there seven ox-teams more. In the time of king Edward it was worth four pounds; now six pounds.

The same earl holds Stottesden. Edwin the earl held it with seven berewicks. There are nine hides. In the demesne are four ox-teams, and eight serfs, and three maid-serfs, and eighteen villans, and five bordarii and six coliberti with eleven ox-teams. There is a mill of ten shillings, and two leagues of wood. In the time of king Edward it was worth twenty pounds; now ten pounds.

The church of St. Peter holds the church of this manor, with two hides and a half. There are ten villans with two ox-teams, and there might be two more ox-teams. It is worth twenty shillings.

The same earl holds Chetton. Godeva the countess held it in the time of king Edward. There is one hide paying geld. In the demesne are three ox-teams, and six serfs, and two maid-serfs, and four villans and one bordarius with a priest and a provost have three ox-teams, and there might be two ox-teams more. There is a new mill, and one league of wood. In the time of king Edward it was worth a hundred shillings; now forty-five shillings.

The earl himself holds Eardington. St. Milburga held it in the time of king Edward. There are five hides. In the demesne is one ox-team, and four serfs, and nine villans and two bordarii with three ox-teams, and there might be eight ox-teams more. There is a mill of three oras, and a new house, and the burgh called Quatford yielding no revenue. In the time of king Edward it was worth forty shillings; now thirty shillings.

The earl himself holds Bolebec. Stenulf held it in the time of king Edward. There is half a hide paying geld. It is land of one ox-team. It was and is waste.

In Overs half a hide pays geld. It is worth three shillings. Seward held it in the time of king Edward.

### IN WITENTREU HUNDRED.

The earl himself has built a castle called Montgomery to which adjoin fifty-two hides and a half, which Seward, Oslac, and Azor held of king Edward, quit of all geld. They had them for hunting. In Edcnhope, one hide; in Aston, two hides; in Stanton, seven hides; in Castelop, two hides; in Mellington, three hides; in Gosford, three hides; in Hopton, two hides; in Benehall, seven hides; in Dudson, one hide; in Wadelston, three hides; in Hokelton, half a hide; in Walcot, one hide; in Wolston-Mynd, three hides.

These lands the aforesaid three thains held. Now Roger the earl holds them. They are and were waste, and of the above fifty hides three hides are in his demesne.

The same three thains held Weston, of three hides, and Staurecote, of one hide, and Horseford, of half a hide, and Thornbury, of one hide, and Hem, of three hides, and Edderton, of one hide, and Forden, of half a hide, and Wropton, of one hide, and Ackley, of one hide. These lands Roger Corbet holds of the earl, except Ackley, which Eilward holds. In them there are in demesne nine ox-teams and a half, and fifteen villans and fourteen bordarii, with three radmans and eight serfs, have twelve ox-teams and a half. They were waste, now they are worth a hundred shillings.

In Hem there are three fisheries, and a wood with a haia. In Edderton, a wood for fattening sixty swine. In Ackley, a haia.

Earl Roger himself holds of the king the city of Shrewsbury, and the whole of the county, and the whole demesne which king Edward had there, with twelve manors which the king himself held, with fifty-seven berewicks thereto pertaining. And the same earl has eleven other manors in the same shire. Among the whole, that is, the city and the manors and the hundreds and the pleas of the county, it yields three hundred pounds and a hundred and fifteen shillings of farm.

Hugo the earl holds of Roger the earl in Wales the land of Gal. This land extends five leagues in length, and one league and a half in breadth. In the time of king Edward it was waste, and the same when Hugh received it. In the demesne are three ox-teams, and two priests and thirty-three men having among them eight ox-teams, and there might be one ox-team more. There is a mill yielding no revenue. The whole is now worth forty shillings.

### IN HODNET HUNDRED.

Rainaldus the Sheriff holds of the earl Marchamley. Seward and Alfric held it as two manors in the time of king Edward, and were free men. There are five hides and a half paying geld. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and four serfs, and six villans and seven bordarii and two radmans having three ox-teams among them all. There is a mill of five shillings; and there might be ten ox-teams more. There is a wood of a hundred swine for fattening, and a haia.

Of this land Walter holds one hide and a half, and there he has an ox-team, and one serf, and one villan and one bordarius with half an ox-team.

The whole in the time of king Edward was worth a hundred shillings, and afterwards it was waste; now it is worth forty-six shillings and fourpence.

There is a church having one hide and a half, and two priests with two villans have three ox-teams. There are two mills of twenty-six shillings. St. Peter of Hereford has there one villan.

Of the land of this manor Richard holds one hide and a half, Azeline one hide and a half, Roger one hide and a half. These have in demesne six ox-teams, and six serfs, and two half-villans, and five bordarii, and two cozets with one ox-team, and a mill of ten shillings.

Of the same manor four sergeants have land to the amount of three ox-teams and one ferling, and they have four ox-teams, and ten acres of land.

There are three radcheners, having land of two ox-teams and a half, and they have there so many ox-teams, and one man, Auti, holds one member of this manor, where there are three hides, and he has there one ox-team, and a half-villan.

The whole manor in the time of king Edward was worth twenty-four pounds; now twenty-five pounds.

The same Roger holds Stokesay. Aldred held it, and was a free man. There are seven hides paying geld. It is land of fourteen ox-teams. In the demesne are five ox-teams, and sixteen serfs and maid serfs, and twenty villans with eight ox-teams, and nine women cotarise. There is a mill paying nine quarters of corn, and a miller there, and a keeper of bees. In the time of king Edward it was worth ten pounds.

The same Roger holds Aldon. Siward held it, and was a free man. There are two hides and a half paying geld. It is land of fifteen ox-teams. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and eight serfs and maid-serfs, and twenty-four villans and two bordarii, and one cozet, with eight ox-teams among them all. There is a mill of five shillings. Of the land of this manor, Richard holds one hide, and Aldred one member of land. There is one ox-team, and twelve villans, and seven bordarii, and three serfs, with three ox-teams. A church has half a hide, and a priest one ox-team, with one cozet. The whole manor in the time of king Edward was worth a hundred and five shillings; now eight pounds, what Roger holds; what his men, sixteen shillings; what the priest holds, five shillings.

### IX.—LAND OF NIGELLUS THE PHYSICIAN.

#### IN LENTEURDE HUNDRED.

Nigellus the Physician holds of the king Wistanstow. Spirtes the priest held it of St. Alkmund, and it was in the time of king Edward for the victuals of the canons. There are four hides. It is land of fifteen ox-teams. There are seven villans with seven ox-teams, and one Frenchman having a mill which pays five loads of corn. In the time of king Edward it was worth thirty shillings; now twenty shillings. He found it waste.

The same Nigellus holds Clev. Spirtes held it. There is one hide paying geld. It is land of four ox-teams. In the demesne is half an ox-team, and one serf, and one radman and four bordarii with one ox-team. In the time of king Edward it was worth twelve shillings; now ten shillings. He found it waste.

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## HEREFORDSHIRE.

#### IN CUTENTORNES HUNDRED.

The same Osbern fitz Richard holds Ludlow, and Roger Lacy of him. Saisi held it. There are two hides paying geld. In the demesne are two ox-teams, and one villan and a provost and a smith, with two ox-teams. It was worth twenty-five shillings; now thirty shillings.

The same Osbern holds Ludford. There is one hide, and in the demesne are two ox-teams, and five bordarii with one ox-team, and a mill of six shillings. It is worth twenty shillings.

## GLOSSARY OF WORDS APPEARING TO REQUIRE EXPLANATION.

**ACRE** (*Aera*.) The acre in Domesday-Book was about the double of our modern statute acre.

**ANNOVA**, corn, but generally employed in Domesday-Book to signify an annual corn-rent.

**BREWFICK**, a member of a manor separated from the rest of the manor, either adjacent to the chief manor, or at some distance from it. It appears to have been an Anglo-Saxon word, and is found in an English charter of the reign of Edward the Confessor.

**BORDARIUS**, one of a class of tenantry a little superior to the serfs and villans. The exact meaning of the word, as well as the position of those who were designated by it, is still doubtful. Thomas Hearne suggested that it was derived from the Anglo-Saxon word *bord*, a table, and that the *bordarii* were tenants whose duty it was to attend or supply the table or hall of the lord. Others have derived the word from another Anglo-Saxon word *bord*, signifying a house. It is evident that they were a different class from the serfs and villans. Their tenure appears to have been called *bordagium*.

**COLIBERTI**, p. 27, a class of tenants or dependents who were neither altogether serfs nor altogether freemen, but possessed a certain degree of freedom of which the serfs were deprived, although their position approached nearer to that of the serf than to that of the freeman. They seem to have been serfs partially enfranchised, who held land under a rent of some kind, but were still attached to the land.

**COTTARS** (*cotarii*), were, evidently from their name, tenants of cottages, but it is now very uncertain what was their exact condition. They are supposed to have been somewhat above the mere villans.

**COZETS**, p. 13, 81. The Cozet seems to have been very nearly identical with the cottar, though there was evidently some distinction between them, now unknown.

**FERLING**, p. 81, or, written more fully, *ferdendel*, a farthing-land, the fourth part of a carucate. A measure of land.

**FINE** (*finis*), p. 23, the word used in Domesday-Book to express the extent of territory in Wales which the Welsh called a *commot*, the fourth part of a cantred.

**FORESTEL**, p. 1. The crime of waylaying and attacking people on the highway.

**GABLE** (*gablum*), p. 1. This is the Anglo-Saxon word *gafol*, which means simply a tax or tribute.

**GELD**. An Anglo-Saxon word meaning a payment or tribute. Used by itself it signified the tax paid to the crown, and is understood in Domesday as having special reference to the Danegeld.

**GUESTS** (*hospites*), p. 73. These were a class of tenants, whose exact character is not known. They were above the condition of a serf or bordarius, and paid their rent in money. They were probably not attached to the land.

**HAIL**, or **HAYA**, means a place enclosed with a hedge, but it is more particularly used in Domesday-Book for an inclosure in a wood for the purpose of entrapping wild animals, especially hinds (*capreoli*). In one passage a *firm haina*, p. 29, is mentioned, which Mr. Eyton is perhaps right in taking as meaning only an inclosure in good repair.

**HEINFARD**, p. 1. Literally, flight, or escape, the offence of ing the escape of felons, or the flight of serfs from the lands of their lords.

**HIDA**. The measure of the hide has been differently estimated by different writers, and it appears in fact to have varied in different parts of the country and under difference of circumstances. It has been reckoned that in Shropshire the average value of the hida was at the time of Domesday-Book 240 statute acres.

**LANDS** (*landa*), p. 33, a strip of land not cultivated.

**MASURE** (*masura terre*), a house in the town with its curtilage, or plot of land appertaining.

**MEASURE OF CORN** (*summa*), p. 25. The *summa* or measure of corn was a horse load, which is estimated at a quarter or eight bushels. The *modius* of Domesday-Book was a bushel.

**NEATHERDS** (*bovarii*). Great herds of cattle were bred on the estates of the mediæval landowners, and as there was a neathard to a certain fixed number, the number of neathards was an index to the quantity of cattle bred on each manor. As the amount of corn was similarly indicated by the number of ox-teams required to plough the ground, the enumeration of the neathards and ox-teams gave the proportion of pasture and arable land in the manor.

**ORE**, p. 25, (*ora*), p. 27. A nominal amount of money, an ounce, that is, the twelfth part of a pound, or equivalent to twenty pence.

**OX-TEAM** (*caruca*). The ox-team was taken to represent the extent of land sufficient to employ it each year, which varied considerably in different localities according to the fertility or state of cultivation of the land. This extent is termed in other parts of Domesday-Book *carucata*, a carucate or plough-land. Mr. Eyton considers that in Shropshire the average was about two ox-teams and a half per hide.

**PROVOST** (*propositus*), called in Anglo-Saxon *gerefa*, or reeve, an officer appointed by the lord of the manor with authority over the agricultural tenants.

**RADMAN**, sometimes called *rachenestre*, a tenant of a higher grade than the serfs, villans, and bordarii. Their position, indeed, seems to have varied, for they were sometimes attached to the soil, while at others they were certainly free. Some were obliged by their tenure to render a certain amount of agricultural labour to their lord.

**SERGEANTS** (*servientes*), p. 41, a term applied to the under officers of the manorial court, and also to stewards of estates. It is a word which was used in many senses.

**SERF** (*servus*), the lowest grade of the agricultural population, who were absolutely the property of the lord, attached to the land, and formed an integral part of the estate. They were the *theows* of the Anglo-Saxons. The female serfs, or, as I have usually translated the word, maid-serfs, are called in Domesday-Book *ancilla*.

**SESTIER** (*sextarius*), p. 87, a measure of liquids. A sestier of wine is believed to have been equivalent to a quart. A sestier of corn was apparently a much larger quantity, but its exact value is uncertain.

**STICK** of eels (*stica*, or *stika*), twenty eels. It appears to be the same word as the German *stiege*, a score. There was another measure of eels called a *lunda*, consisting of ten sticks.

**THAIN** (*tainus*, *teinus*), p. 27. The Anglo-Saxon term Thains (*thegnas*) was usually applied to nobles, but its primitive meaning was a servant or attendant, and it appears in Domesday-Book to be applied to freeholders of inferior estate.

**VICTUS**, p. 52, 82, an annual rent for the purchase of food, or paid in provisions, for an ecclesiastical or other body. An estate was not unfrequently devoted especially to that purpose.

**VILL** (*villa*), a township.

**VILLAN** (*villanus*), the lowest of the agricultural tenantry above the serf. The villan could not possess land, or inherit, but, after his death, his goods reverted to his lord. He could not leave the estate to which he was attached, but was transferable as part and parcel of its appurtenances. In the manor of Stanton Lacy, p. 80, there were *dimidii villani*, who were perhaps identical with the coliberti, or villans partially enfranchised. *Villani in gros* were such as had no fixed tenement, but were merely registered in the baronial court as such.

**VIRGATE** (*virgata*), the fourth part of a hide of land, estimated to have contained about sixty acres.
