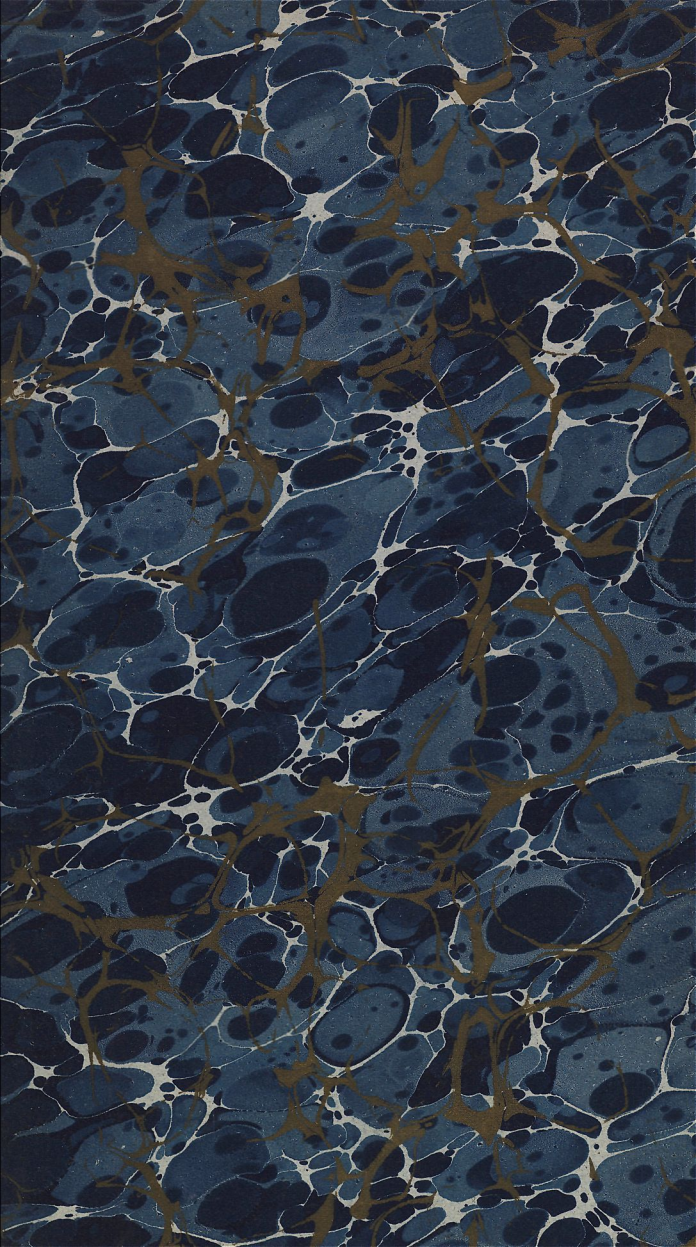

--- Let Thy Fear rule in all our Hearts; & let us all be very careful to adorn our profession by truly virtuous & exemplary Lives, that we may be creditable to our Families & Friends, Ornaments to our Country, & useful in our Generation, to promote Thy Glory & the Good of Mankind; And having been faithful unto Death, let us at last obtain a Crown of Life, thro' Thy free Grace in Jesus Christ. --- And we beseech Thee to bless & preserve thy Servants, the Governours of this College, & all our Friends & Benefactors, & abundantly reward all their Care of us & kindness towards us, & make this Fountain of Learning a great

& extensive Blessing to all Thy People.  
All which, we most earnestly beg thro'  
the Merits & Mediation of Thy blessed  
Son Jesus Christ, to whom be Glory for  
ever & ever.            Amen.
