historian, educator, university president, whose *History of the Jews* is now in its fifth edition and twentieth printing, studied at Washington and Harvard universities and at Cambridge University, England, where he earned the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. In 1923 he became a member of the history faculty of the University of Illinois and in 1928 was named National Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations in American universities, a post which he held for twenty years. A prolific writer, Dr. Sachar is also the author of *Sufferance Is the Badge* and is a steady contributor to learned journals and organs of opinion. A much-traveled man of affairs, he enjoys the friendship of many molders of contemporary events. During the war he was a radio commentator in Chicago and New York. Since its founding in 1948, he has been president of Brandeis University, a pioneering venture in American education. A historian whose view of the past is filtered through understanding of human affairs, he is squarely in the tradition of the trained scholars who interpret philosophical and religious issues within the framework of economic and social development.
