Finding materials in the Library

- Search CLIO to find materials in the Music & Arts Library's collections (for pre-1982 titles, also check the card catalog if you find nothing in CLIO).
- "Quick Limits" can limit your search to audio or video recordings, etc. Ask at the desk or email us if you need help with your searches.
- "Set Limits" can limit your search to music scores, and many other options.
- Item not on the shelf? Ask for help at the circulation desk, and we'll search for it.
- Item checked out, or, not owned by Columbia? Try Borrow Direct (see link at the top of the main CLIO screen) – items can often be delivered in 4 business days.
- Need more help? Please ask us at the circulation desk, or, email us at the address above for an appointment. We will be happy to demonstrate general resources or to help with specific research questions.
