Biography

Francis Brown, 1849 – 1916, the seventh president of the Union Theological Seminary, came from a long line of college residents beginning with his great-grandfather, J.H. Mason, who led Dickinson College in the 18th century. Brown graduated from Dartmouth in 1870 and from Union Seminary with an STM in 1877. He won a fellowship to study in Berlin for 2 years, during which time he married Louise Reiss and was one of the first students of Assyrian (now termed Akkadian). He came back to teach at Union in 1879 and succeeded Charles Briggs as Professor of Hebrew and Cognate Languages in 1890. In this capacity he was the first to teach Akkadian in the United States. His address *Semitic Studies in America* given at Johns Hopkins University in 1908 and found in these archives is thus particularly relevant. He lectured frequently and demonstrated a vast knowledge of Biblical material. He was Director of the American School for Oriental Research in Jerusalem 1907 - 08, a position he held when he was called to the Presidency of Union Seminary. His work, as one of the authors of the Brown, Driver, Briggs Hebrew - English Lexicon, for which he is best known, spanned 20 years. In spite of minor revisions, it is still the definitive dictionary of classical Hebrew.

During his tenure as President of the Seminary, he oversaw the move of the school's campus to its present location in Morningside Heights and strengthened ties with Columbia University and Teacher's College. It was during his presidency that formal ties between the Seminary and the Presbyterian Church were severed. It is said that the stress of this conflict, which lasted several years, took a great toll on his health and significantly shortened his life. This echoes the life of his grandfather, also Francis Brown, who as president of Dartmouth nearly a century earlier, also dealt with severe institutional stress and suffered adverse health as a result. Francis Brown died October 1916 and was widely mourned by friends and colleagues.

On a personal level, his religious feelings were known to be devout. Henry Sloan Coffin's history of the Seminary notes, "In his personal religion he was reverent and devout, and his conduct of worship painstaking and affecting. . . He adored Jesus Christ in whom he revered the fullness of the Godhead in bodily form." Thanks to a recent donation by the Brown family, this side of the President's life is now known through his extensive sermons which generally deal with New Testament passages.

Collection Scope and Contents Note

Most of this collection previously formed part of the papers of C. C. Hall. Most of the correspondence between Brown and Hall remains in the C. C. Hall collection. Any correspondence unrelated to Hall was moved into the J. C. Brown collection.
