### Four Elements

- Client type and problem
- What you might do
- Alternative course of action
- What you want to accomplish (goal)

## Forming the Question

- How did your need for information arise?
- Describe your clients (strengths and problem).
- State generally what you want to know.
- State what you might do differently if you had the answer.
- What type of question is this?

# Forming the Question

- Course of action you're considering
- What you're currently doing
- Alternative course of action
- Intended result or outcome (how will you know that what you've done has worked?)
- Complete COPES question
