- Total of 21 points in Political Science

     W 1201 *Introduction to American Government & Politics*  
     V 1501 *Introduction to Comparative Politics*  
     V 1601 *Introduction to International Politics*
- Students must choose a main and a second subfield from the 4 subfields of political science: American Politics, Comparative Politics, International Politics, & Political Theory.
- Political Science courses taken to satisfy the Major Cultures core requirement may also be used to satisfy concentration requirements. Otherwise, no other courses may double-count for two separate majors or concentrations.
- A maximum of 9 transfer credits in Political Science allowable. This includes study abroad.
- Courses with a grade of “D” may not be applied toward any concentration requirements.
- A grade of “Pass” is acceptable for only the **first** course applied toward the concentration.
