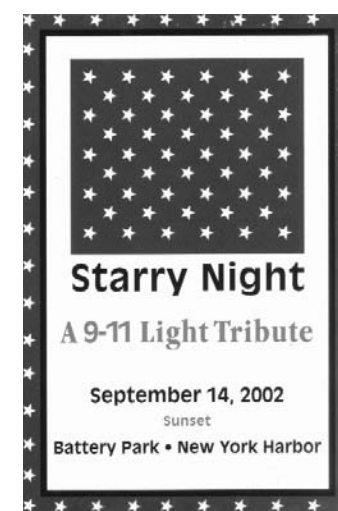

Free and open to the public. Exhibition of ephemera collected one year after 9/11 by Michael Ragsdale, a videographer at Columbia University's Center for Biomedical Communications. The collection—containing over 3,000 items including flyers, posters, pamphlets, brochures, cards, public notices, press releases and other paper ephemera—covers the full range of the post-9/11 experience. The significance of the collection has been recognized by the Library of Congress, which has included over 900 documents from Ragsdale's collection in its September 11 Digital Archive.
