

**The Center for International Conflict Resolution
The Fund for Global Environment and Conflict Resolution
Doctoral Fellows, Grants for Research, 2009-2010**

Overview

The fellowship for Doctoral students offered by the Center for International Conflict Resolution's *Fund for Global Environment and Conflict Resolution* are designed to support the work of PhD students at Columbia University involved in research in the fields of conflict prevention, conflict resolution, post-conflict reconstruction, sustainable development, security and the global environment.

The Fellowship is only open to PhD students at Columbia University from Italy, the Balkans, Iraq, Afghanistan, Peru, Colombia, China, the Middle East, and/or North Africa.

All applicants should submit their proposals by April 15 2009. The decision will be undertaken by a selection committee at CICR, and will be announced in July. All decisions are final, and applications received after the April 15 will not be accepted. A candidate may only be accepted for one fellowship for one year.

The candidates whose work is supported by CICR will be chosen for its originality and feasibility within the one-year time frame. The research work of the selected candidates should be relevant to lessons learned and best practices regarding environmental concerns and the role of climate change in one of three specific fields with various geographical areas of focus:

- Conflict prevention and control in areas where current tensions indicate the potential for conflict, specifically China, the Middle East, and North Africa
- Conflict resolution with respect to conflict and post-conflict areas, specifically the Balkans, Iraq, Afghanistan, Colombia and Peru.
- International security in general in the Balkans, Iraq, Afghanistan, Peru, Colombia, China, the Middle East, and/or North Africa.

Application Process

A successful application will include:

- I. A completed application form (to be provided).
- II. A proposal of no more than five pages which describes the research work, and how the grant will further that research; a one year work plan, with budget.
- III. Current CV/Resume
- IV. Two recommendation letters.

The applications should be sent when fully completed to CICR's Assistant Director, Josie Lianna Kaye, CICRapplications@columbia.edu the title **GEER: Doctoral Candidate**.

Students who receive this funding will be known as an "Empedocle Maffia Fellows". There are a number of fellowships available; approximately \$5-10,000 per person will be allocated and requests should be tailored to need.
