This remarkable 2006 documentary tells the story of a Polish woman who studied medicine while surviving the Warsaw Ghetto, then escaped to live as a Gentile and went on to become a Swedish citizen and a distinguished cancer doctor. Her filmmaker daughter—like Nina's husband and son, also an oncologist—completed this interview before her mother died of cancer. In this drama, filmed in Warsaw with Polish actors, Nina Rajmic Einhorn tells her life story.
