

PEDIATRIC DENTISTRY CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS

The clinical requirements in the pediatric dental clinics are expressed as "points". All procedures are assigned a point value based on degree of difficulty and time usually required to provide that service to the patient. These points are:

Required minimum point total at the end of senior year is **60**. At least 50% of these points should include restorative and pulp therapy procedures. The minimum point totals at the end of each trimester are:

1.	End of may of Junior year:	15
2.	End of summer session: (approx. mid July of Junior year)	25
3.	Senior Pediatric Dentistry Rotation: (end of November)	45
4.	Senior Pediatric Dentistry Rotation: (end of January)	60
