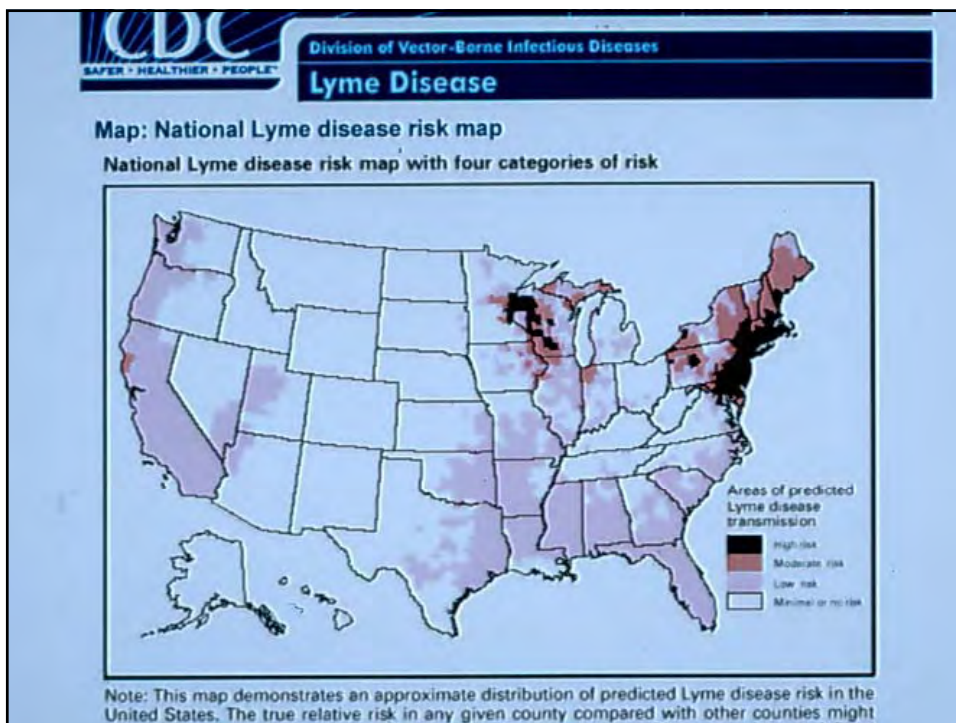
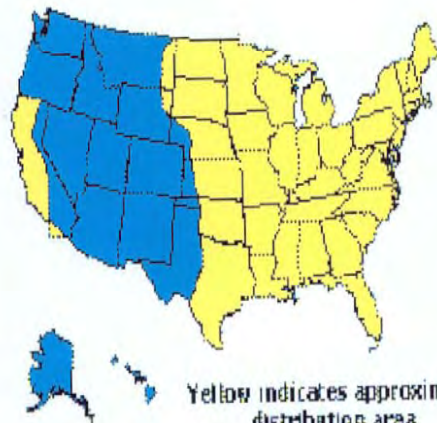








Figure 7. Approximate distribution of the American dog tick

American dog tick (*Dermacentor variabilis*)

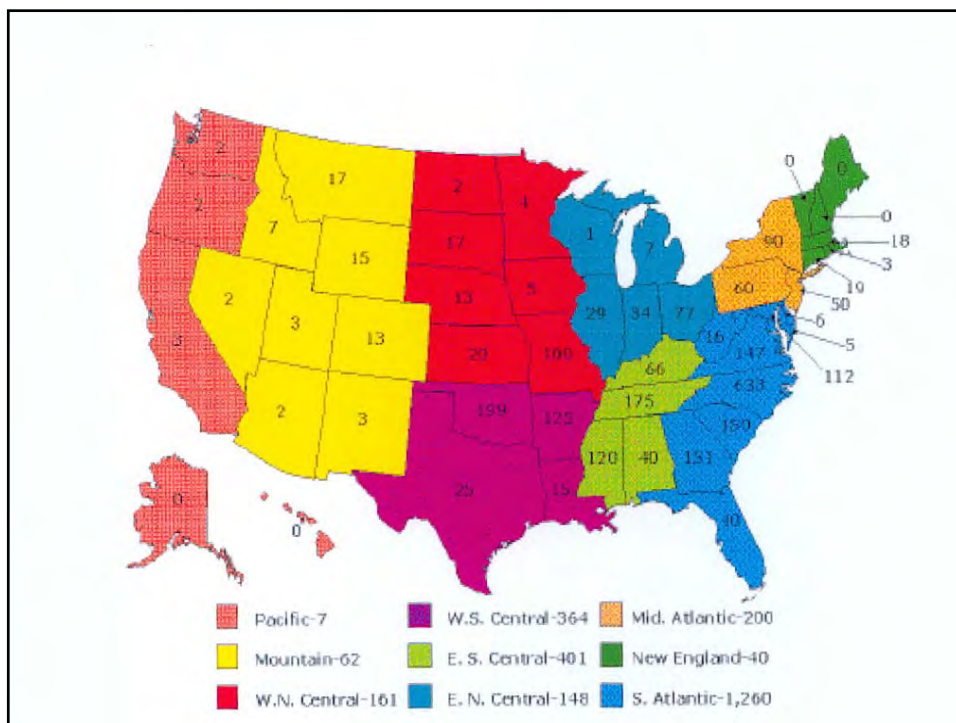
Figure 8. Approximate distribution of the Rocky Mountain wood tick

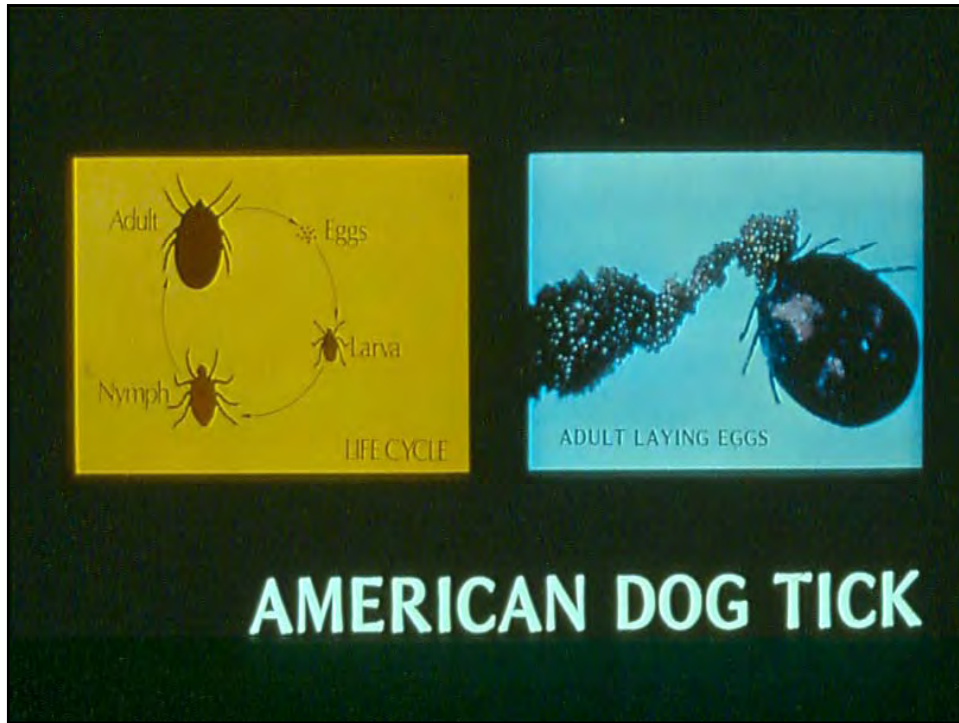


Yellow indicates approximate distribution area

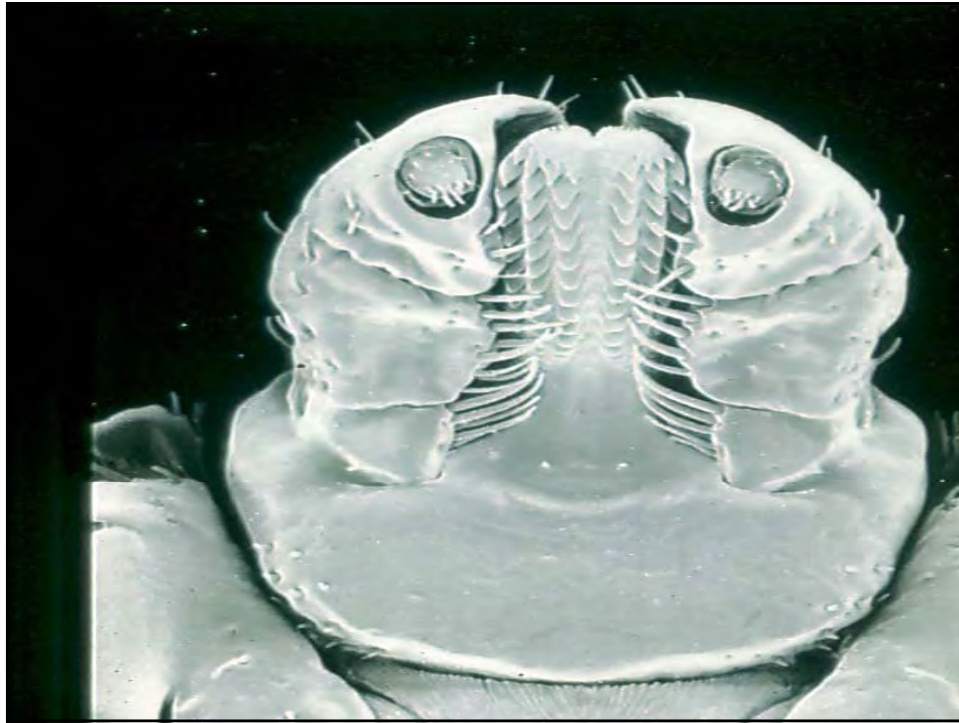


Rocky Mountain wood tick (*Dermacentor andersoni*)

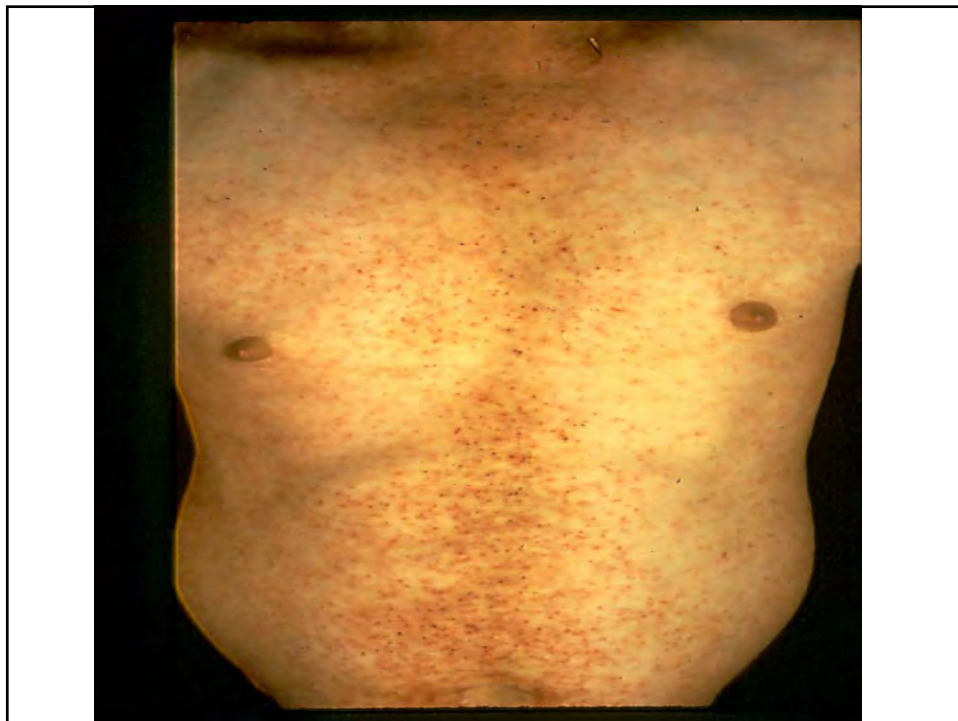






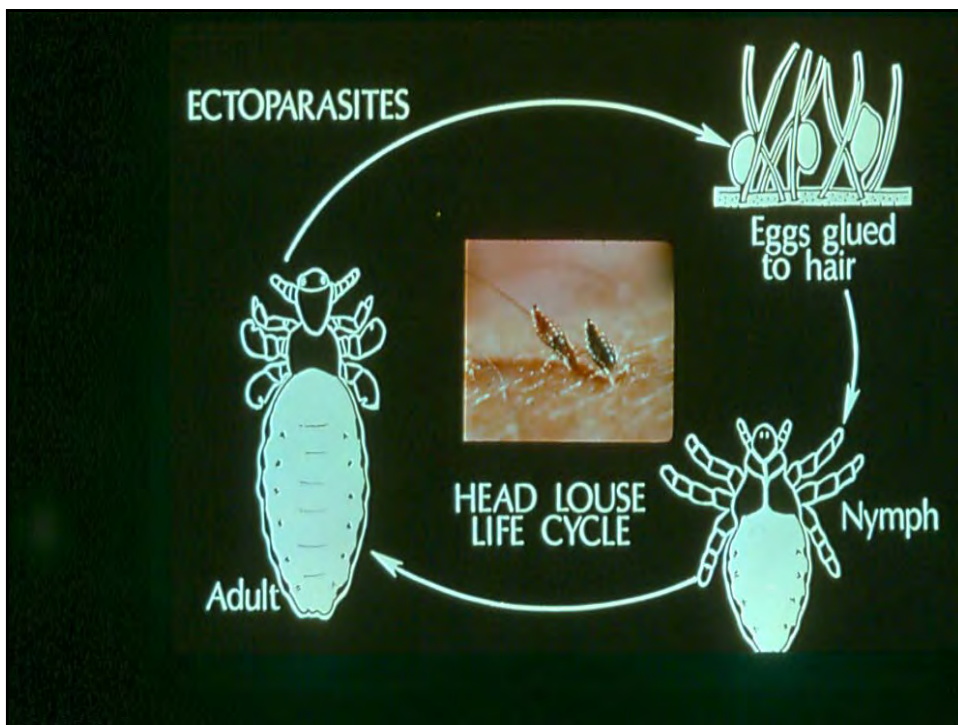
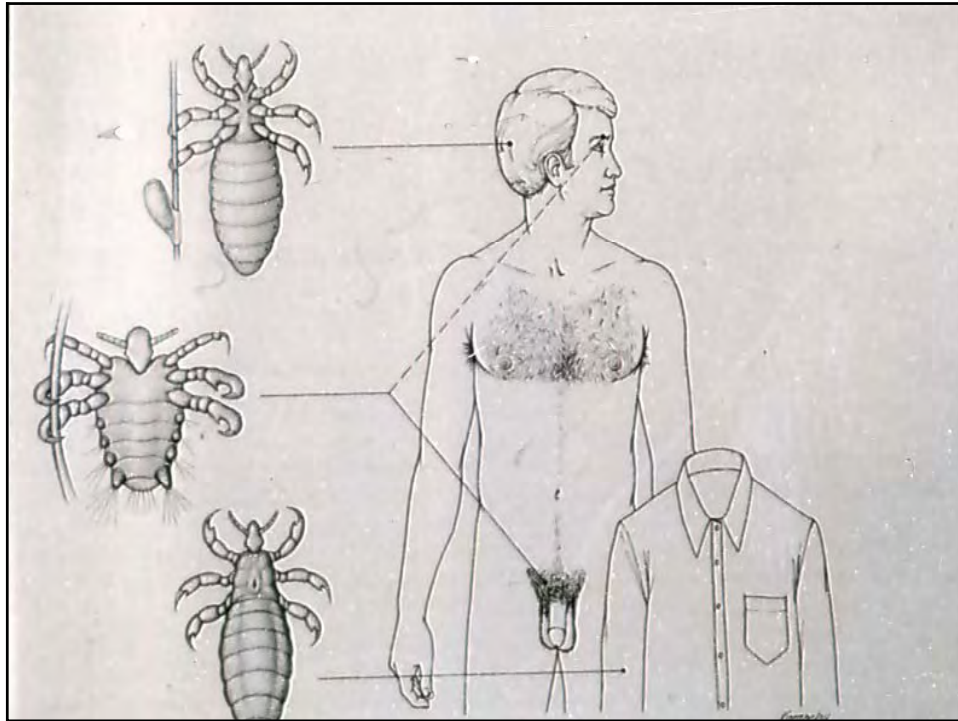






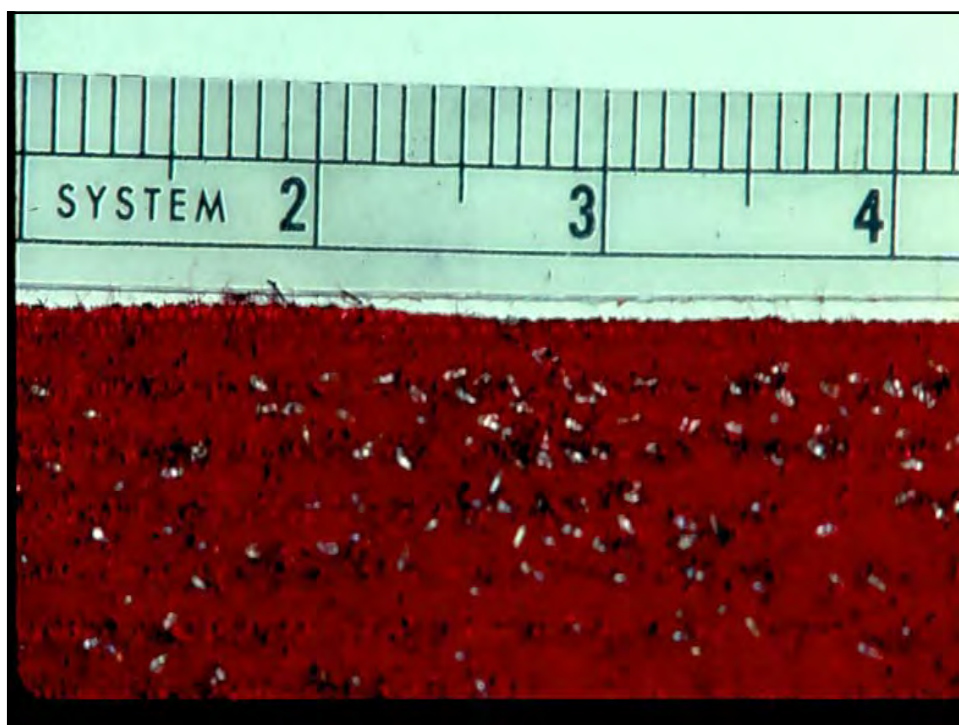


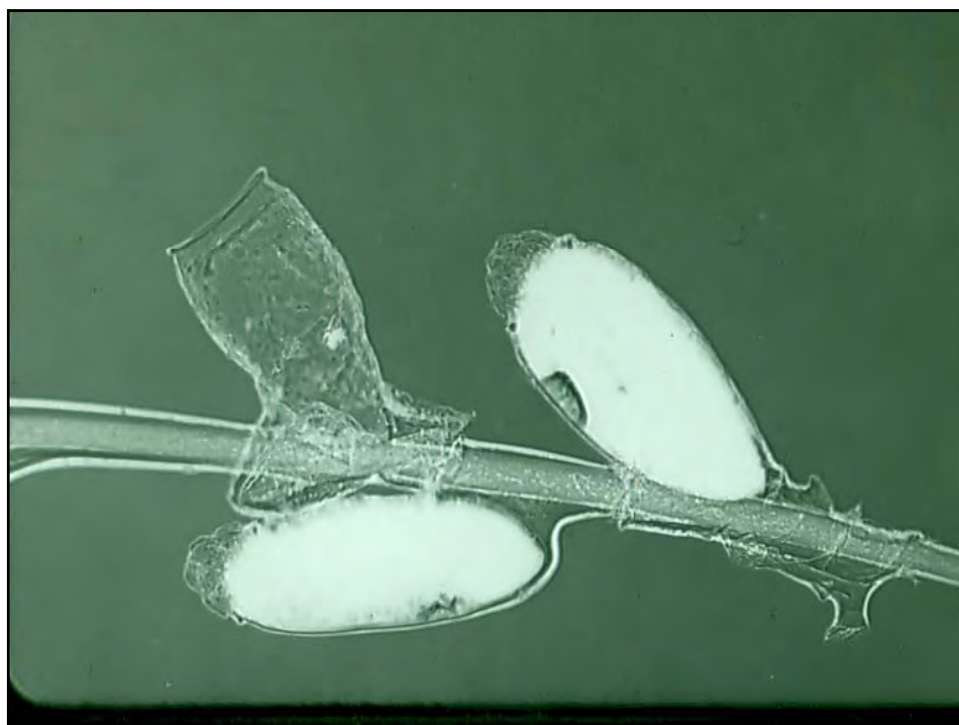




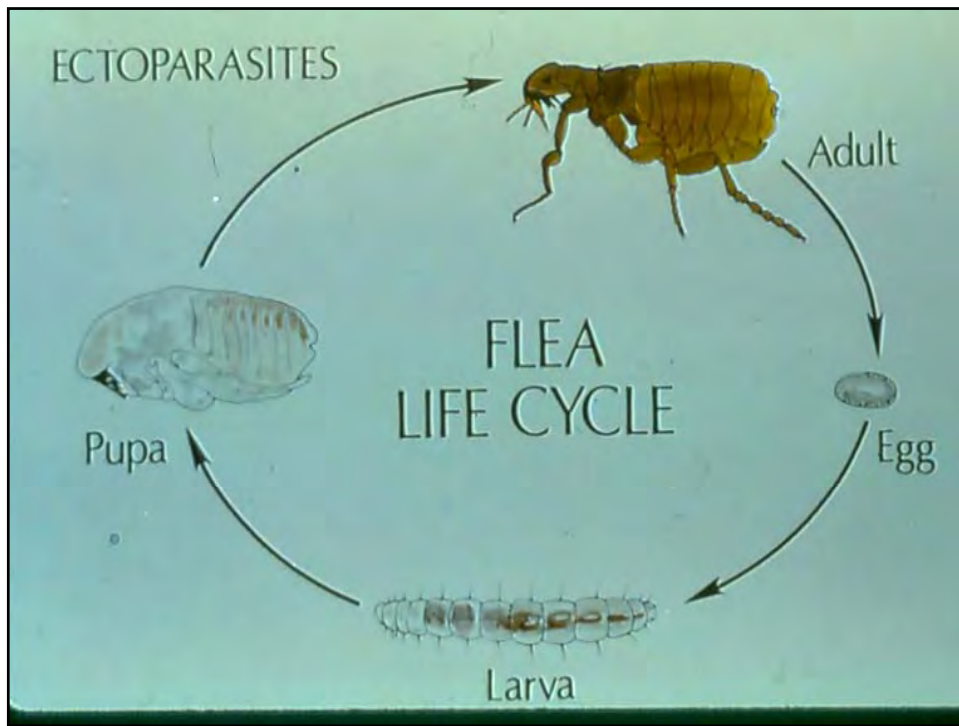


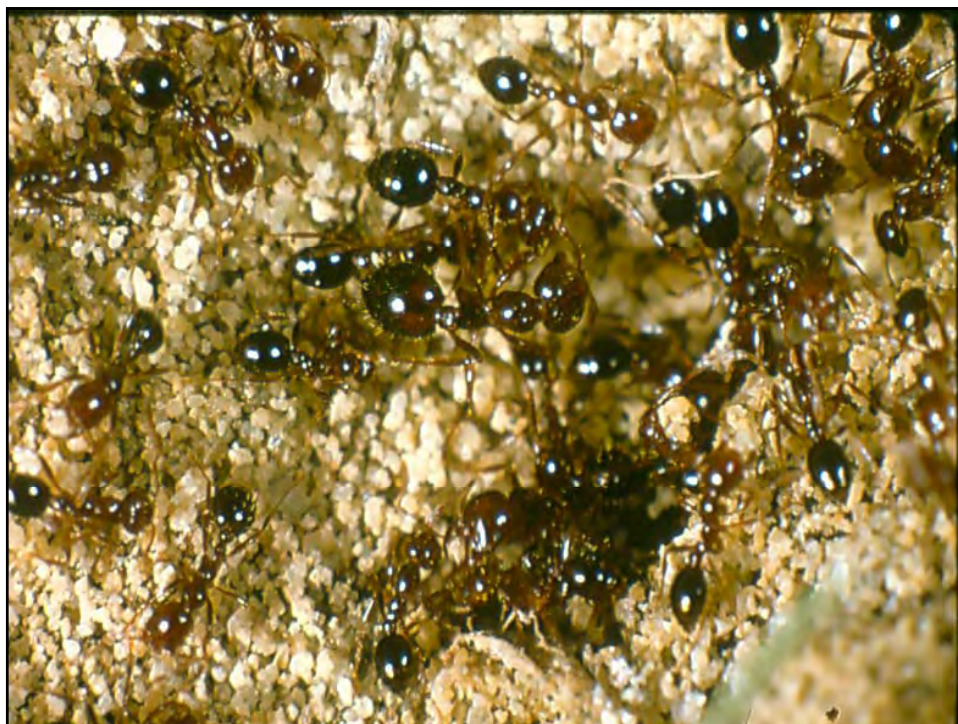












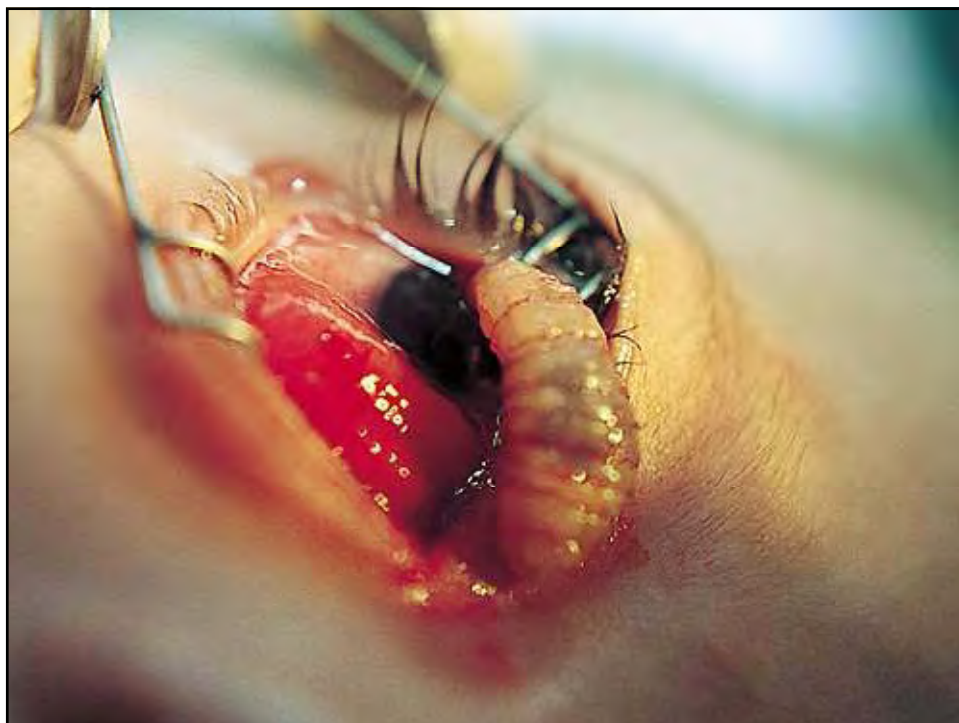










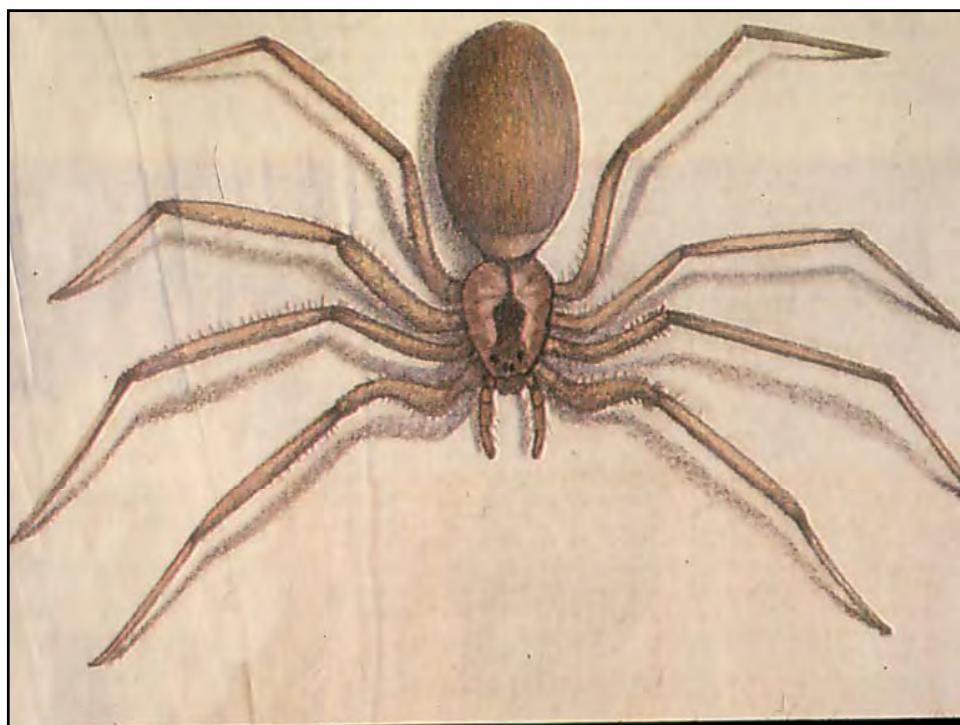


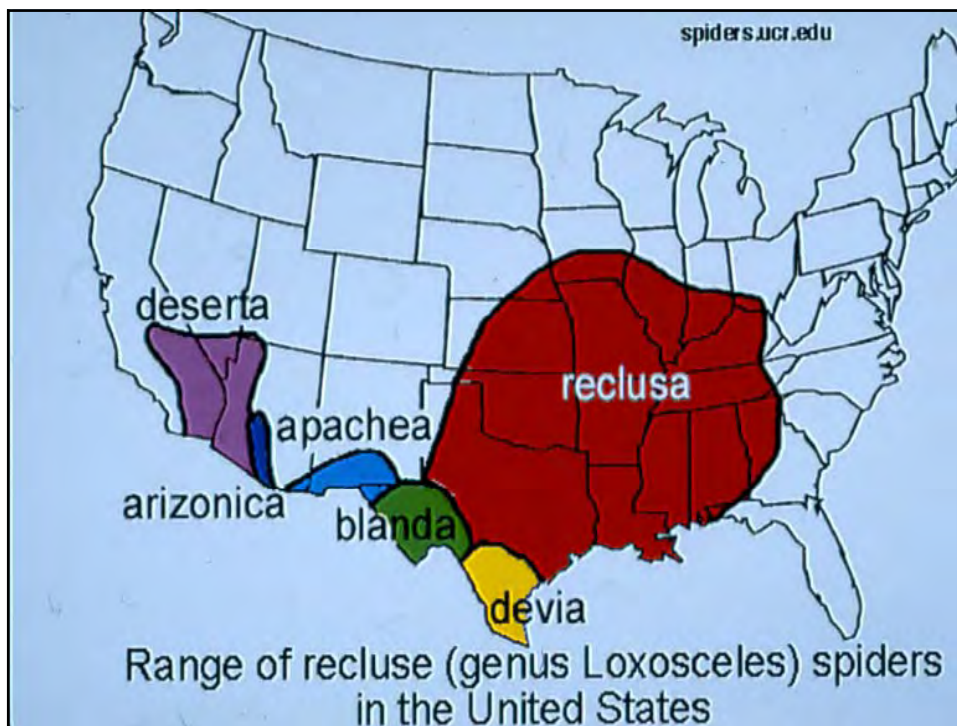
