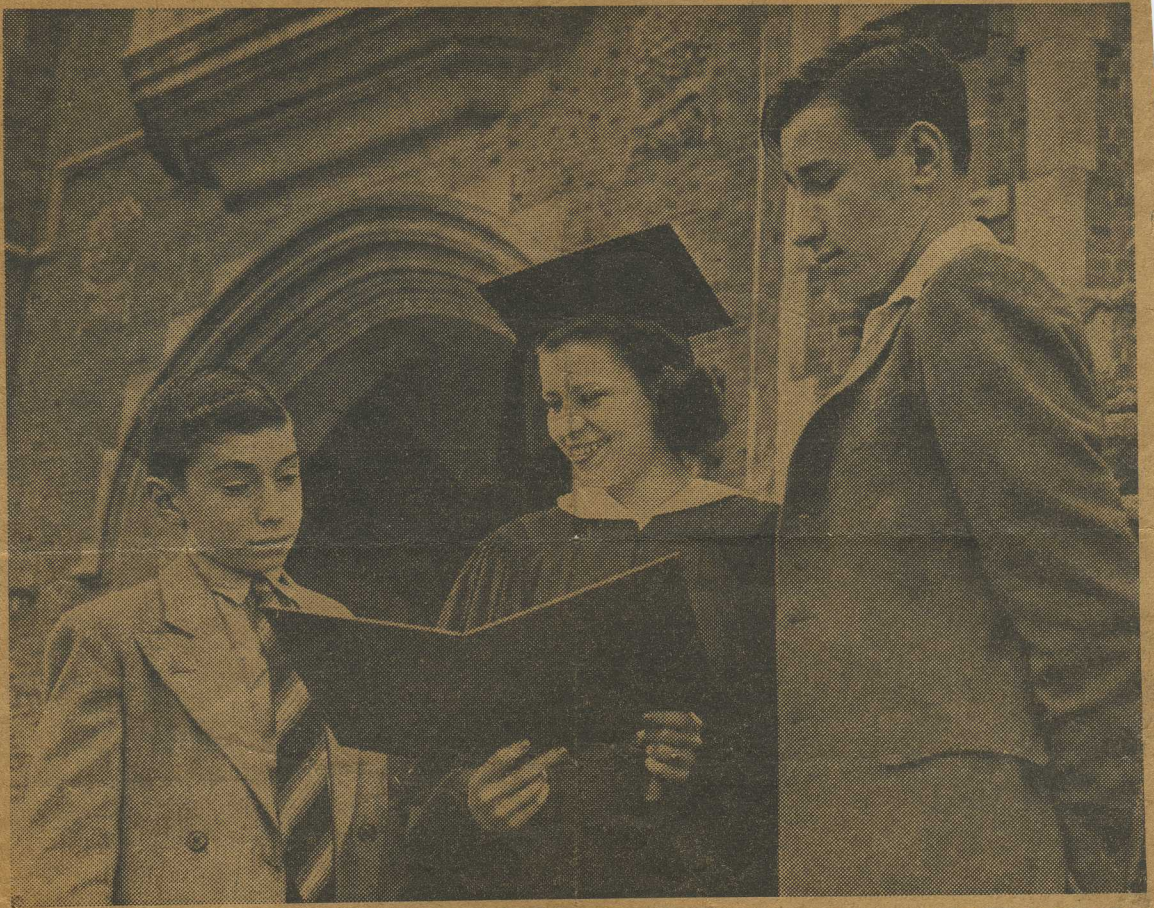


It's Diploma Time for the Wightmans
