PREFACE.

The chief difficulty which besets the compiler of a text book on Urdu prosody and rhetoric is not a deficiency but, strangely enough a surplus of vernacular works on the subject. These works, while deriving a common origin from the original Arabic treatises on the sciences of prosody and rhetoric, now contain many widely divergent views brought into being by the passage of time since those original treatises were made and by the necessary amplification of the sciences to meet the requirements of modern Urdu poetry. This book is, at best, only an attempt to select what is accurate and well-expressed in these various works, to draw comparisons, wherever possible, with English prosody and to present the whole in a form better arranged and calculated to lead the student along a well-defined path to a thorough understanding of this intricate subject. It is hoped that the book may be of especial assistance to candidates working for the degree of Honour Examination in Urdu since, wherever possible, examples of the figures of speech and metres have been taken from the two verse text books for that examination, viz., the "Nazm-i-Muntakhab" and the "Kulliyat-i-Sauda."

I have made extensive but I hope not unfair, use of the works of my predecessors and I must acknowledge my obligations to the authors of the following:—
