



- Clicking the "Add" button will place the Director file in the text window on the right.  
Once the filename appears there, click the "Options..." button.



- This window will present some preference settings.

If the following settings are not already selected, change them to...

**Create for:** Animate in Background. This will allow the movie to continue playing even when another program is open along with it.

**Options:** Full Screen

**Stage Size:** Use Movie Settings and also Center

**Player:** Standard

Click the "OK" button.



- The previous window will re-appear. Now, click the "Create..." button to build the Projector.



- Director will ask for the name to give this new Projector file. If no new name is given, it will automatically name the file "Projector".

Click the "Save" button.



- The completed Projector icon will look like this if it was created on a Macintosh.



Anyone can execute this file without needing Director to view your presentation. This file is now referred to as a "stand-alone Projector" or a "self-playing Director movie".

NOTE: If a Projector file is made on a Macintosh it will only play back on a Macintosh. Similarly, if a Projector file is created under Windows, it will only play back on a PC with Windows. Thus, if you are making a dual-platform presentation, you must create a version of your project for each platform.
