

PRESENTATION TEAMS

Teams should plan to lead discussion of the common readings for the week. The team should prepare an agenda for discussion, which should be forwarded to the instructor by 6:00 PM the night before class; teams are also welcome to circulate to the class questions or texts or lists of passages to concentrate on (you can simply forward this on the e-mail list that you all should have). In addition to whatever the team cooks up, the “sources” person should look into the use of primary sources in the work or works in question. Bringing primary sources into class to discuss would not be inappropriate. The “reception” person should look into the historiographical impact/import of the work. For newer books, this might involve tracking down important reviews. For older works, you may find articles or even whole books that tell you what you need to know.
