Final Project Presentations

Everyone will be expected to present (If you feel uncomfortable or unprepared for this, please let me know and you'll be fine!) the project they've been working on this semester.

It will be a short, casual (~3-5 minutes) presentation where you will:

- 1. Explain what the project is in general: What does your code do? Feel free to explain why you decided to take on this project.
- 2. Show a live demo of your code and explain the results.
- 3. Talk about either a major difficulty you experienced while coding, or a cool feature of your code that you would like to highlight (e.g. You may have modified the rules of a well-known game. Show us where that happens!). Show the portion of the code you're talking about.
- 4. Answer any questions from your fellow classmates.

Also, feel free to talk about more aspects in addition to the above if you want.

Please send the code you would like to present to hr2362@columbia.edu by the day before the presentation date, which is May 10th (Friday) at midnight.

This way, we can show each student's code to everyone from one computer instead of switching every time.
