Cynthia Fox, Ph.D., CCC-SLP

Dr. Fox received her doctorate degree in Speech and Hearing Sciences from the University of Arizona, Tucson. Dr. Fox is a research associate at the National Center for Voice and Speech, a Research Lecturer in the department of neurology at the University of Arizona, Tucson, and Executive Vice President of the LSVT Foundation. Dr. Fox is among the world's experts in speech treatment for people with Parkinson disease.
