I felt comfortable asking her questions and asking for help because she is approachable and confident. I enjoyed taking her course and would recommend her.
 - WOW. Professor Turetsky is one of the best instructors I've had in my entire life! She is very organized, coherent, and clear when she presents her lectures. From time to time, she will ask whether or not we understand what she had just said. She generates a very welcoming atmosphere in class, so asking questions isn't daunting at all. Her syllabus is organized well, making us build up from one idea to another. Her powerpoints are just as coherent. She starts with an overview, then an introduction, then provides examples and counterexamples. She adds some video clips and many images to keep us hooked for three hours. In this way, there is never a dull moment in class. She doesn't need to be flamboyant to get our attention. She has it by just lecturing well. Even though her powerpoints mirror everything she says, she doesn't read off of it. She still adds onto it and makes clear connections. Would not change this aspect at all.

She also records most of the material, which is great for auditory learners like me. She is so open to office hours and again so approachable that it makes it easy to learn from her. While she is very respectable, she makes sure that she can also be an instructor we can go to for clarification. We also get to debate other things during office hours and class because she is very open minded and is a good listener. She won't shut you down just because your experiences or opinions are different. She has so many thought provoking insights that I never would have thought of because of my background. She helps shed light on very pressing matters that need to be discussed by students everyday. I remember coming to her with my relatively colorblind lenses and she helped me expand this by looking at other factors (demographic, historical, political).

She returns assignments and tests on time and is always well prepared with handouts and snacks!! She also is very responsive to emails. Even though I submitted my draft late and she said she wouldn't give a lot of comments because it was late, she still gave me more than I even wanted. She is so helpful and wants her students to succeed. Amazing.
