The final grade will be generated from four components: TBA.

1. Homework

Homework assignments are *not* optional; they are integral to an understanding of the material. In order to encourage you in this, some of the problems on the examinations may be taken from the homeworks.

Note that homework assighments must be completed *individually*, and no collaboration with any other people is allowed. The course assistant will be available during their office hours to discuss questions you may have about the homework.

2. Class Attendance

Because of the short duration of the course, students are expected to attend every class meeting. Although an absence would not affect the final grade, it will definitely affect the student's progress. If a student misses more than **two** classes, he or she would be advised to drop the course.

3. Midterm Examination

The midterm will be in class, closed book. It will cover all material prior to the exam. Your (fully charged) regular calculator and a onepage formula sheet are only outside material to be used during the examination. The exams cannot be taken at any time other than the regularly scheduled time.

4. Final Examination

This will be a in-class, closed book examination, given under the same conditions as the Midterms (for instance, a formula sheet can be brought in). The final exam will not be given at any time other than the regularly scheduled time. The final will cover *material from the entire course*.

5. Calculator

Every student must have a calculator with charged batteries during exams. The calculator must have log, exp, and trig functions. Such a calculator can be purchased for less than \$30.00. No programming calculator is allowed during the exams. THE IN-STRUCTOR AND TA ARE NOT RESPON-SIBLE FOR CALCULATORS DURING ANY EXAMS.

6. Lecture, Readings, and Back Issues of the Handouts

You are responsible for everything that tran-

spires in class and for obtaining any written material that is distributed. We shall try to number handouts with sequential page numbers to assist you in keeping track of them.
