All around the world, the 2007 crisis has been the cause – and sometimes the excuse – of a growing involvement of governments into economic matters, going far beyond a mere regulatory response. This return of a form of “State Capitalism” has been strongly felt in France, where over the last three or four years there has been an unprecedented surge of state-led initiatives regarding industrial policy, investment, energy, and innovation. This may be signs of the resurrection in Europe of a once-moribund model of continental capitalism, departing significantly from the Anglo-Saxon model.
