The Shirato Fund Scholarships will provide two \$2000 scholarships to undergraduates and graduate students accepted to Columbia-approved intensive Japanese-language study programs for the summer of 2014. Please note that recipients will be required to take a Japanese course upon their return to Columbia in the fall (2014); submit a short report on your use of the scholarship; and give a presentation at the study abroad information session about the language program in which you participated.

 - a) Estimated costs of studying abroad – be sure to include tuition, materials, travel, room and board, and other costs you expect to incur. Include one estimate per program you have applied to.
 - b) Your financial resources, actual and possible, for studying abroad – include scholarships and grants both already received and currently being evaluated for, loans, savings, and contributions from family and other benefactors.
- 3) Two academic letters of recommendation – at least one from a Japanese instructor. Letters should discuss the nature and length of the recommender's relationship to the applicant, the applicant's strengths and weaknesses, the applicant's short and long-term goals for studying in Japan, and any other information that might be useful to the selection committee.

Applications must be handed into the Japanese Language Program by Monday, March 10th, 2014.
