Biography: Ferenc Nagy was a founder of the Hungarian Smallholders' Party, and Prime Minister of Hungary from 1946 until 1947 when he was forced to resign by the Communists. The rest of his life was spent in the United States where he was active as an author, lecturer and leader of Hungarian emigre political organizations.

Summary: The Ferenc Nagy Papers consist of correspondence, manuscripts, subject files and printed materials relating to Nagy's career and family. The earliest materials cover the period 1945 to 1947 when Nagy was leader of the Hungarian Smallholders' Party, and later Prime Minister of Hungary. Of special interest are first-hand accounts and commentaries on the circumstances surrounding his resignation in 1947. Materials from the years 1948-1954 concern Nagy's leadership of emigre organizations including the Hungarian National Council, the Committee for a Free Europe, the Assembly of Captive European Nations and the International Peasant Union. Correspondence files contain one letter each from presidents Harry S. Truman, Richard M. Nixon, and Jimmy Carter, also voluminous correspondence with Hungarian emigre politicians Pal Auer, Gyorgy Bessenyey, Bela Fabian, Pal Fabry, Karoly Peyer, Bela Varga and others.

Nagy was much in demand as a public speaker and author and the Papers include completed texts and drafts of many of his speeches and articles. In the early 1950s his writings focus on what he perceived as a worldwide Communist threat, but after several trips to Asia he increasingly turned his attention to the developing world and its peasant problems. Subject files document Nagy's trips to Asia (particularly India, Japan and Taiwan) and his participation in the 1955 Bandung Conference. In the early 1960s Nagy's involvement with emigre politics decreased and he spent most of his time delivering lectures and commencement addresses at universities throughout the country. This activity is recorded in files of lectures and correspondence with approximately 600 different institutions.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH: FERENC NAGY

Ferenc Nagy was born on 8 October 1903 in Bisse, a small village in the county of Baranya in Southeastern Hungary. His parents were Ferenc Nagy and Julianna Nagy.

He married Julianna Balog on 24 January 1924. They had three children in Hungary, Ferenc Jr., born in 1925, Julianna, born in 1926, and Laszlo, born in 1942. They also had a set of twins after coming to the United States, Zsuzsanna and Zsofia, born in 1949. Except for the formal instruction he received in a one-room Presbyterian school, Nagy was self-educated and worked on his parents' land until 1932, when he began writing articles, first for provincial papers in the town of Pecs, and then for Pesti Hirlap in the capital.

Nagy, along with Tildy, Varga, Sulyok and other peasant leaders, decided to form a peasant opposition party in 1930, the Independent Smallholders' Party, and Nagy was chosen the first National Secretary of the Party. He was personally responsible for organizing more than a thousand party cells at the village level, which greatly enhanced his popularity. In 1939 he was elected to Parliament. In 1940 he formed the semi-political Hungarian Peasant Association, a social, cultural and economic organization, and became its president in 1941. Because of a Smallholders' Party memorandum in 1943 calling for Hungary's withdrawal from the war the Gestapo imprisoned Nagy for six months when the Germans occupied the country in 1944. After the war Nagy set out to re-organize the party and became its National President. He also served as the President of the National Assembly, and in May 1945 he was appointed Minister of Reconstruction in the new Provisional Government.

In the November 1945 elections the Smallholders' Party won a 57% majority of the votes, but the Soviet occupation authorities would only allow a majority Smallholders' Party component in a coalition government which included the Communist Party as well as other smaller parties. The Republic was proclaimed in February 1946, the left-leaning Zoltan Tildy was elected its first President, and he in turn appointed Nagy Prime Minister after the candidacy of Dezso Sulyok, a leader of the right faction of the Smallholders' Party, was bitterly opposed by the Communists. As Prime Minister Nagy presided over a cabinet with a Smallholder majority, but in which the critically important posts of the Ministry of Interior and of the Security Police were held by communists. He tried to maneuver between the right wing of his own party, which demanded that he resist Communist Party pressure and intimidation, and leftist coalition partners, who threatened with labor unrest and mass demonstrations unless the Smallholders expelled their own right-leaning Parliamentary Deputies and government officials. Nagy ended up compromising with the Left, and in March 1946, at Tildy's insistence, Dezso Sulyok and his faction were expelled from the Party. The beginning of the erosion of support for the

Smallholders and for Nagy among the masses of peasants can be traced to that decision.

In the meantime, Nagy took part in the Paris Peace Conference, made official trips to Moscow, Washington, London and Paris, and met with Stalin, Truman, Atlee and Bideault, as well as with Eastern European leaders. His meeting with Stalin was probably most important, and while he found Stalin warm, friendly and generous (Stalin gave Nagy a ZIL limousine as a present), he only received vague assurances as to the future independence of Hungary and the stability of his government. By May of 1947 the Smallholder Party's hold over the reins of power had become so tenuous that the secret arrest and kidnapping of Bela Kovacs, then the General Secretary of the Party, by Soviet authorities was met with protests but little action. At this crucial moment Nagy decided to take a vacation in Switzerland, and together with his wife he drove there for a two week stay. His daughter was studying at the University of Geneva at the time, and his son Ferenc was attache to the Embassy in Washington. While in Switzerland, the communists accused Nagy of complicity in the alleged plot involving Bela Kovacs to overthrow the Government. Advised to refrain from returning home, he agreed to sign his resignation in exchange for his son Laszlo, who was handed over to his parents at the border between Switzerland and Austria.

Nagy arrived in the United States on 14 June 1947, and by 1948 he managed to buy a dairy farm in Herndon, Virginia, using as downpayment the honoraria he received for several articles in The Saturday Evening Post, Reader's Digest, and Life. His book, translated by Stephen Swift, The Struggle Behind the Iron Curtain was published by MacMillan in 1948. He soon gave up farming, however, put his land in lease, and concentrated on emigre politics. He became Vice-President of the International Peasant Union in 1947, a member of the Executive Committee of the Hungarian National Council in 1948, Chairman of the Assembly of Captive European Nations from 1961 to 1962, member of the General Committees of that organization in 1963, and President of the International Peasant Union in 1964. He also founded the Central Eastern European Committee after the break-up of the Hungarian National Council in 1953. He made nearly fifty trips to Europe beginning in 1948, and participated in international conferences in Paris, London, Strasbourg, Vienna, Rome, Brussels, Bonn, Geneva, Stockholm, Amsterdam, Copenhagen and Istanbul, in the process meeting with many European leaders.

Beginning with 1954, after the fragmentation of the Hungarian emigre community into ideologically divergent groups, he made several extended trips to Asia, including Japan and India in 1954, the Philippines, Hong-Kong, Burma, Thailand, India and Pakistan in 1955, Japan in 1960, and Japan, Taiwan, Thailand and Burma in 1962. On these trips he met with, among others, Nehru, Nasser, Chiang Kai-Shek, Magsaysay, Ikeda and Mohamed Ali, and took part in the Bandung Conference in 1955.

Although since 1948 he made hundreds of speeches and addresses to various groups and organizations and gave interviews and press conferences for the news media, including Radio Free Europe and the Voice of America, after the fall of 1963 he concentrated on delivering lectures at colleges and universities all over the country. He received honorary LL.D. degrees from Bloomfield College and Seminary in 1948 and from the University of California at Berkeley in 1957. He retired from the lecture circuit in 1973. Nagy died on 12 June 1979 of a heart attack in Fairfax Virginia.

AUER PAL

Count, lawyer by profession, member of the SHP; career diplomat based in Paris, with many valuable contacts in European diplomats circles dominated by aristocrats. In exile, member of the Executive Committee of the HNC and member of Hungarian delegation to ACEN. Paris

BARANKOVICS ISTVAN

Lawyer, journalist, first editor of KIS UJSAG, then of MAGYAR NEMZET; founded Democratic Peoples' Party (also known as Barankovics Party) in 1945, and headed that Party in the elections of 1947, eventually remaining as the only opposition party to the CP after Pfeiffer Party dissolved; left Hungary in 1948. In exile, member of Exec. Comm. of HNC in charge of cultural activities for refugees; member of both ACEN and CEEC; has a long history of cooperation with Pfeiffer. New York

BOGNAR JOZSEF

Member of the SHP, Minister of Propaganda in 1946, implicated in the Kovacs Bela conspiracy; cooperated with the CP and was rewarded with the Ministry of Trade in the late '40's and early 50's. In the '60's and '70's he served as president of the World Union of Hungarians (Magyarok Vilagszovetsege). Budapest

BOKOR BELA

Chief of Division, Foreign Ministry, SHP representative at the Foreign Ministry; charge d'affaires, Hungarian Embassy, Vienna, went to Paris in 1948, then on to the U.S. in 1951; wrote many briefings for Nagy. New York

CSICSERY-RONAY ISTVAN

Secretary, Foreign Ministry, SHP foreign service desk director. Arlington, VA

DEAK ZOLTAN

Journalist, member of the SHP, then of the National Peasant Association; CP closed his paper in Hungary. Went to Belgium, edited newspaper SZABAD TOLL. After coming to the U.S. he edited the weekly AZ EMBER, very

important source of independent and well informed Hungarian intellectual thinking in exile. He shifted the paper's emphasis towards loyalty for the HNC and the Free Europe Committee, and in the process got rid Sulyok as a writer. New York

DESSEWFFY GYULA

Count, SHP deputy in Parliament, editor-in-chief of the official SHP organ KISS UJSAG; replaced by Kovacs Bela during Nov. 1946 "purge" of SHP. In exile, head of Hungarian division of Radio Free Europe in Munich, West Germany. Munich

ECKHARDT TIBOR

One of the founders and the leader of the SHP until 1940; replaced by Tildy Zoltan, the later President of the Republic. He came to the U.S. during the war. Considered a reactionary by many of the left-leaning and moderate members of the SHP and their allies in the SDP and the NPP. Member, Exec. Comm. of HNC, flirted with right-wing politics in emigration, including the Hungarian Fighters' Brotherly Association tainted by links to the Arrowcross; in the center of controversy at the HNC, shares some of the blame for the eventual break-up of the organization and fragmentation of the Hungarian emigre circles. New York

GORDON FERENC

Hungarian Ambassador in Bern, Switzerland, implicated in scandal of the Prime Minister's discretionary funds deposited in a Swiss bank when he refused to hand over the key to the safe deposit box to CP delegation; he gave the key to the Swiss authorities instead, who also refused to acknowledge the new regime's claim to the funds. Buenos Aires, Argentina

HAM TIBOR

Doctor of Medicine, SHP deputy in Parliament, secretary of the Political Committee of the SHP. His significance lies in his close ties to Nagy, both as adviser and friend, in power as well as in exile.

ILLYES GYULA

Writer and poet, major literary figure of twentieth century Hungary, pioneered genre called socio-graphic novel. Budapest

KISS SANDOR

Ph.D. in Philosophy, first president, Hungarian Democratic Youth Organization, General Secretary, National Peasant Association, deputy in Parliament. Member of Political Committee of the SHP. Much of the "evidence" against Nagy and the "conspiracy" within the SHP rested on his deposition obtained after some very

lengthy interrogations by the security police. In 1956 he organized Petofi Circle and was a member of the Revolutionary Council of Hungarian Intellectuals. In exile he was national editor of EAST EUROPE, published by the Free Europe Committee. Author of many briefings and reports. Member, HNC and ACEN delegation. New York

KOVACS BELA

General Secretary, SHP, Minister of Agriculture until February 1946, editor of KISS UJSAG after March 1946. Accused by CP of conspiring against the government with Nagy and others, thereby providing the excuse for the CP to ask for Nagy's resignation. Secretly arrested and kidnapped by Soviet authorities, later executed in the USSR.

KOVACS IMRE

Writer, leader of the NPP along with Szabo Pal, deputy in Parliament. Prior to 1956 considered the second most important member in emigre circles after Nagy. Member, ACEN delegation. Queens, NY

PEYER KAROLY

Minister of Labor, President of Hungarian SDP, deputy in Parliament; in the U.S., representative to the Free Labor Committee in Exile and leader, Hungarian Trade Unions; member of Exec. Comm. of HNC and member of CEEC. Long Island City, NY

PFEIFFER ZOLTAN

Lawyer, Assistant Minister of Justice, and member of SHP until 1946, when he founded Hungarian Independence Party (also known as Pfeiffer Party); leader of that party in 1947 elections. Same political orientation as Barankovic; joined him and Sulyok in forming Federation of Opposition Parties. Fled Hungary in 1948; in exile, he was member of the HNC Exec. Comm. and of the ACEN delegation, and co-founded, with Peyer and Nagy, the CEEC. New York

SALATA KALMAN

SHP deputy in Parliament; his importance, much like Ham's and Hogye's (see below), is due to his close personal and political ties to Nagy. Forest Hills, NY

SOOS GEZA

Judge, Division Counsellor, Foreign Ministry, Secretary of Hungarian Foreign Ministry in Switzerland. Geneva

SULYOK DEZSO

One of the founders and leaders of the SHP along with Nagy, Tildy and Varga; Prime Minister designate in Feb. 1946, but his candidacy was thwarted by opposition of virtually all leftist parties; Tildy appointed Nagy at

the insistence of the CP. Became leader of right-wing of SHP, but persisted as official spokesman. In March 1946 the leadership of the SHP, at Tildy's urging, decided to expel him and his faction; this constituted the beginning of the erosion of support for the Nagy government. In Dec. 1946 he was also removed as head of the Central Monetary Organ (equivalent of the U.S. Fed. Reserve). He founded Freedom Party and joined Pfeiffer and Barankovics in Federation of Opposition Parties. In exile he wrote articles and editorials for various emigre publications, including AZ EMBER.

SZABO PAL

Along with Kovacs Imre, leader of the NPP and deputy in Parliament. In 1945 appointed Assistant Minister of Welfare. Fled in 1948, came to the U.S. in 1950. Member of ACEN delegation. Long Island City, NY

SZABO TAMAS

Journalist, foreign news writer for official news agency, then for the news service of the Foreign Ministry. First secretary of the Hungarian Legation in London, he defected in 1948. Upon coming to the U.S. he took up radio and television writing; translated his name to Thomas Taylor. Long Island City, NY

SZEGEDY-MASZAK ALADAR

Ambassador to the U.S. from Jan. 1946 to June 1947; Nagy, Jr.'s superior at the embassy. Washington, DC

VARGA BELA

Protestant minister, speaker of Parliament, leader of SHP. In exile, member, Exec. Comm. of HNC and of ACEN delegation. As president of the HNC he opposed the ouster of Eckhardt from the HNC, which prompted Nagy, Peyer and Pfeiffer to secede and form the CEEC, thereby causing the breakup of the HNC. New York

VATAI LASZLO

First president of Youth Wing of SHP, Chief of Section of Ministry of Public Education in charge of all youth organizations; deputy in Parliament, close to Nagy; entrusted to work out ideology and program of the SHP. Defected in 1947 to Switzerland. Presbyterian minister in Leechburg, VA. Buffalo, NY

VIDA ISTVAN

Ph.D., professor of history, member, Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Institute of Historical Research; worked on dissertation at Oxford, wrote a book on SHP and 1945 and 1947 elections (A Fuggetlen Kisgazdapart Politikaja 1944-47, Akademiai Kiado, Budapest, 1976). According to Prof. Istvan Deak he is the foremost authority on the SHP and the period in question. Budapest

Interesting, but not necessarily significant individuals:

FERCSEY JANOS

Close friend and co-worker of Nagy, Jr.; wrote to him a great deal, both from Budapest and later from Paris, mostly about a woman named Magda (also referred to as Annus) whom they both knew exceedingly well.

HIVES HENRIK

Charge d'affaires at the Hungarian Embassy in Geneva, very closely involved in some of the minor details and incidents of Nagy visit to Switzerland and some of the arrangements after the latter's departure to the U.S. E.G.: Disposal of ZIL limousine (Stalin's gift to Nagy) destroyed in a traffic accident in Switzerland by an intoxicated embassy staffer.

HOGYE MIHALY

Like Ham and Salata, he was very close to Nagy, but unlike those two, his political role, both in Hungary and in exile, was minor. He accompanied Nagy on his first trip to Japan in 1954.

PISKY FRIGYES

J.D., Ph.D. in Political Science; came to the U.S. in 1948; author of some 20 books, lectured widely; married Nagy's daughter Julia, together they organized and ran Permindex after Nagy withdrew from the business.
