HARRIS, all of full age and citizens of the State of New York, do, by these presents, pursuant to and in conformity with the Act of the Legislature of the State of New York, passed on the 11th day of April, 1865, entitled, "An Act for the Incorporation of Societies or Clubs for Certain Social and Recreative Purposes," and the several acts of the said Legislature amendatory thereof, associate ourselves together and form a Club under the name and style of

and the following are hereby declared to be

The object for which said Club is formed ;

The number of Directors, and the names of those who shall manage the affairs of the Club for the first year ;

## **The Manhattan Chess Club**

1. The corporate name of said Club is hereby declared to be "THE MANHATTAN CHESS CLUB OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK."

2. The objects for which said Club is formed are as follows: The advancement and cultivation of the game of Chess, the providing of suitable facilities and opportunities for play thereat, the promotion of social intercourse among the members, of friendly intercourse with similar organizations, and the co-operation with them in all matters pertaining to Chess.

3. The number of Directors shall be eleven, and the names of those who shall manage the affairs of the Club for the first year are :

# CONSTITUTION.

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*Adopted October 2, 1879. Amended July 6, 1882.*

*Revised October 3, 1889.*

*Amended October 1, 1891. Amended April 6, 1893.*

*Amended July 5, 1894.*

## ARTICLE I.

This organization shall be known as THE MANHATTAN CHESS CLUB, and its purposes and objects shall be the advancement and cultivation of the game of Chess; the providing of suitable facilities and opportunities for play thereat; the promotion of social intercourse among its members, of friendly intercourse with similar organizations, and the co-operation with them in all matters pertaining to Chess.

## ARTICLE II.

### OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES.

SECTION I.—The officers of this Club shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Recording

Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.

### PRESIDENT.

SECTION 2.—It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Club or Directory, and to exercise general supervision and control over all the affairs of the Club, and he shall be *ex-officio* a member of all Standing Committees.

### VICE-PRESIDENT.

SECTION 3.—The Vice-President shall perform the duties and exercise the functions of the President in his absence or whenever, from any cause, the President is unable to act.

### RECORDING SECRETARY.

SECTION 4.—The Recording Secretary shall record the proceedings of the Club and of the Directory, and preserve the same in separate books of record. He shall keep all accounts with members and collect from them all indebtedness to the Club. He shall pay over to the Treasurer at any time, when required by said Treasurer so to do, all money in his possession

belonging to the Club, and take a receipt from him therefor. He shall notify members by mail of the time and place of holding special meetings whenever called, and newly elected members of their election. He shall report at each regular meeting of the Club and Directory the number of members upon the roll, the number of members resigned, deceased, or dropped during the previous month or quarter, and the number of new members elected during the same period, and shall perform such other duties pertaining to his office as he may be called upon to do by the Directory. He shall be exempt from the payment of the annual dues during the time he remains in office.

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.

SECTION 5.—The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Club in accordance with such instructions as he may receive from the Club or Directory.

### TREASURER.

SECTION 6.—The Treasurer shall, at least once per month, demand from the Recording Secretary any moneys belonging to the Club which the Recording Secretary may have re-

ceived. He shall keep the financial accounts of the Club, and shall disburse the funds of the Club only in such manner as the Directory may from time to time prescribe. He shall present to the Club and Directory, at each stated meeting thereof, a written report of the financial condition of the Club, and shall advise the Directory of such financial condition whenever he shall be requested by it so to do.

### ARTICLE III.

#### GOVERNMENT.

SECTION 1.—The government of the Club shall be vested in a Directory, which shall consist of the five officers herein before named and six additional members.

SECTION 2.—The officers of the Club shall be elected severally by ballot at the Annual Meeting of each year. The six members of the Directory shall be voted for by ballot collectively at the same meeting. In all cases of election, a majority vote shall be necessary to a choice. In the election of members of the Directory not officers, the six candidates receiving the highest number of votes, not less than a majority, shall be declared elected, and if the required number

be not elected, such further ballot shall be had as may be necessary to complete the number. The persons so elected shall hold office for the term of one year, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 3.—In case of a vacancy, the Directory may fill the same by appointment, and the person so appointed shall serve until the next stated meeting of the Club, when an election shall be had to fill the vacancy ; provided, that if a vacancy occur at any stated meeting of the Club, the Club may fill the same at once by election.

### ARTICLE IV.

#### THE DIRECTORY—POWER OF THE DIRECTORY.

SECTION 1.—The Directory shall have the entire control and management of all the affairs of the Club, subject to the provisions of its Constitution and By-Laws.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES.

SECTION 2.—The President shall appoint from among its members such Standing Committees as the Directory may deem necessary, and also

Special Committees from the Club's membership, which shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as the Directory may from time to time assign to them respectively.

### CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP.

SECTION 3.—It shall inquire carefully into the character of every person proposed for membership, and shall take action upon each proposition as soon as the necessary preliminaries shall have been complied with.

### MEETINGS—QUORUM.

SECTION 4.—It shall hold regular meetings, as prescribed by the By-Laws, and special meetings may be held when called in pursuance of its rules. Six members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting, except in case of vacancies, when a majority of the remaining members shall be a quorum for the purpose of filling the same as herein provided.

SECTION 5.—It shall make a report to the Club at each stated meeting thereof, through the Recording Secretary, of any important events or transactions during the previous quarter.

SECTION 6.—No liability shall be incurred by the Directory exceeding in amount the amount in the hands of the Treasurer, without the consent of the Club, previously obtained, except in case of a lease for quarters of the Club, when the total obligation may exceed such amount.

SECTION 7.—No assessment shall be levied except by a vote of two thirds of the members present at a stated meeting of the Club, and then only after a two weeks' notice of such intent mailed to each member.

SECTION 8.—Any member of the Directory (not being one of the five officers of the Club) who shall absent himself without excuse from three successive regular meetings thereof, shall be deemed to have resigned his position thereon, and his place shall be declared vacant.

### ARTICLE V.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

SECTION I.—The name and address of every candidate for election, together with the name of the member proposing him, shall be posted in the Club Rooms at least two weeks, and the initiation fee paid to the Recording Secretary (or guaranteed by a member in good standing)

before any action shall be taken as to the election of such candidate by the Directory.

SECTION 2.—When these preliminaries have been complied with, candidates for membership may be balloted for by the Directory at any regular meeting thereof. Each candidate shall be balloted for separately, and two negative ballots shall reject, and in case of the rejection of a candidate the amount paid by him shall be refunded. No person who has been so rejected shall again be a candidate for membership for a period of six months from the date of his rejection.

SECTION 3.—Any gentleman permanently residing thirty miles from the City of New York, and having no place of business therein, may be admitted as a *Non-Resident* member of the Club, with all privileges of full membership, except that of holding office, on being elected in conformity with the rules for the proposal and election of members. The annual dues for Non-Resident members shall be one-half the amount required from full members.

SECTION 4.—Honorary members of the Club may be elected at a regular meeting of the Directory by a unanimous vote, otherwise on the same conditions as full members; honorary members shall be exempt from the payment of initiation

fees and dues, and shall have all the privileges of full members, except voting and holding office.

SECTION 5.—Any member, for violation of the Rules and By-Laws of the Club, or for conduct prejudicial to its interests or good name, may be suspended by a two third vote of the Directory, after an opportunity has been given the delinquent to be heard, which suspension shall remain in force until action be taken thereon by the Club.

SECTION 6.—At the next stated meeting of the Club, after such member shall have been so suspended, the Directory shall report the fact and the reason for its action, and thereupon the Club may either expel or reinstate such member by a majority vote.

SECTION 7.—Any member in arrears to an amount equal to two quarters' dues shall be notified by mail of the fact by the Recording Secretary, and if the same be not paid within thirty days thereafter, the name of such delinquent may be dropped from the Roll of Membership ; but any member in arrears to an amount equal to three quarters' dues shall be dropped from the Roll after another thirty days' notification by the Recording Secretary, which fact shall be reported by the Secretary to the Directory. A

member so dropped, upon payment of the arrears within three months thereafter, may be reinstated by the Directory at its discretion.

### ARTICLE VI.

#### MEETINGS.

SECTION 1.—The stated meetings of the Club shall be held on the first Thursdays following the first Tuesdays of January, April, July, and October ; but, when said day is a legal holiday, the meeting shall be held on the Thursday following. The January meeting shall be the annual meeting of the Club.

SECTION 2.—Special meetings of the Club may be called by the Directory whenever it shall deem it proper, and shall be so called by the President when requested so to do by fifteen members of the Club in writing.

SECTION 3.—Prompt notice of each special meeting, specifying the object of such meeting, shall be mailed to every member of the Club, and a like notice posted in the Club Room at the same time, and at least six days before the time appointed for the meeting, and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting, or any matter considered, except such as is specified in the notice so posted and mailed.

SECTION 4. —There shall be elected at the last quarterly meeting of each year a nominating committee of five, none of whom shall be at that time an officer of the Club, whose duty it shall be to nominate a list of officers for the ensuing year, and said list shall be posted on the bulletin board at least ten days prior to the annual meeting.

SECTION 5. —Fifteen members shall be a quorum for the transaction of business at any stated or special meeting of the Club.

## ARTICLE VII.

This Constitution shall be altered or amended in the following manner only, viz. : The proposed alteration or amendment shall be submitted in writing, at a stated meeting of the Club, by not less than twelve members of the Club, who shall sign the same, which shall be read and laid over until the next stated meeting, when it shall be brought up for action ; but these restrictions shall not apply to any amendment of the proposed amendment when being acted upon by the Club. It shall require the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members present to adopt the same.

## RULES OF DIRECTORY.

1. Special meetings of the Directory may be called by the President, or by three members ; twenty-four hours' notice must be given to each Director of such special meeting.

2. The Finance Committee shall at all times have access to the account books of the Treasurer and Recording Secretary, and shall audit all bills presented against the Club, and certify to the correctness of same before payment is made ; it shall audit each monthly report of the Treasurer and report thereon at the next ensuing Directory meeting.

3. The House Committee shall have the care and custody of the Club rooms and Club property, and see that the same are kept in repair ; it shall preserve order and see to the enforcement of the rules and by-laws, and to the proper reception and entertainment of visitors. It shall not expend money or incur obligations in excess of appropriations made by the Directory, and shall at each monthly meeting present an estimate of the current expenses, etc., for the month.

4. Books, pamphlets, periodicals, and other

property of the Club must not be removed from the rooms, except with the consent of a majority of the members of the Directory.

5. Members may introduce their friends to the Club rooms ; the name and address of each must be entered on the visitors' register ; a resident of this city or vicinity so introduced may enjoy the privileges of the club for three days within thirty days thereafter, and shall not again be introduced until after the expiration of six months. Chess players from other parts of the country and from abroad, visiting New York, are invited to avail themselves of the Club privileges during their stay.

6. The Directors may grant temporary membership to such visitors on payment of monthly dues of \$2.

7. The order of business at regular meetings shall be :

1. Reading of Minutes.
2. Report of Recording Secretary.
3. Report of Treasurer.
4. Report of Finance Committee.
5. Report of House Committee.
6. Reports of Special Committees.
7. Communications.
8. Miscellaneous Business.
9. Elections.



## BY-LAWS.

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1. Regular meetings of the Directory shall be held on the first Tuesday of every month, except that the first regular meeting shall be held on the next Tuesday after the election of the Directory.

2. The initiation fee shall be \$10, and the annual dues \$16, payable quarterly in advance.

3. There shall be an annual Club Tournament held under such rules as the Directory may prescribe, and in addition thereto the Directory may institute special tournaments and problem tourneys from time to time, and it may set apart from funds in the treasury such amount as it may think proper for such purpose.

4. All resolutions offered at meetings of the Club shall be submitted in writing.

5. On the call of three members a division shall be had on any question. Division shall be had by rising vote, and, if so requested by three members, it shall be by ayes and noes.

6. The order of business at stated meetings of the Club shall be :

1. Reading of the minutes of the last stated meeting and of any intervening special meetings of the Club.
2. Reports of Special Committees.
3. Report of the Recording Secretary.
4. Report of the Treasurer.
5. Communications.
6. Miscellaneous Business.
  - a. Unfinished Business.
  - b. New Business.
7. Election of Officers.

7. Members shall have the privilege of introducing their friends into the Club room under general restrictions to be made by the Directory.

8. Members shall refrain from loud talking, singing, and whistling in the Club room when play of Chess is in progress, and no one shall interfere with or in any way interrupt gentlemen engaged in play. Members shall be responsible for the observance of this rule by those introduced by them.

9. No other game than Chess shall be allowed in the Club rooms.

10. None of these By-Laws shall be suspended, except that relating to the Order of Business at

stated meetings, and that suspension shall be by unanimous consent, and for one meeting only.

11. Alterations or amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any stated meeting by a two thirds vote, provided that notice of such proposed alteration or amendment, signed by five members of the Club, shall be conspicuously posted in the Club room at least one month before the time at which it is to be voted upon.

12. No member shall speak more than twice on the same question if objection be made.

13. All questions of parliamentary rule shall be decided according to Cushing's Manual, unless they conflict with provisions herein.

14. The laws of the game governing the play of the Club shall be the Chess Code adopted by the Chess Association of the United States of America in 1880, subject to such amendments as may be adopted by this Club.
