**Guidelines:**

- Total of 21 credits in political science.
  - **One** of the following Political Theory Courses must be taken:
    - V1013 or V1014 Political Theory I or II
    - W 4133 Political Thought: Classical & Medieval
    - W 4134 Modern Political Thought
    - COCI F1101 & F1102 Contemporary Civilization - note that both semesters must be taken. Though this sequence equals 8 points, you may only count 3 points toward the major.
    - Other 3000-level courses may fulfill this requirement at discretion of DUS.
  - **Two** of the following Introductory courses must be taken:
    - W1201 Introduction to American Politics
    - V1501 Introduction to Comparative Politics
    - V1601 International Politics
- Students must choose a major and minor subfield from the 4 subfields of political science: American politics, comparative politics, international relations, & political theory
- No two courses may double-count for two separate majors/concentrations or programs.
- A maximum of 9 transfer credits in Political Science allowable. This includes study abroad and AP credit. Transfer credit must be approved by an undergraduate adviser.
- Courses with a grade of “D” may not be applied toward any major requirements.
- A grade of “Pass” is acceptable for only the **first** course taken for the major.
